

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER AND DEFINITIVE MAP
AND STATEMENT MODIFICATION ORDER**

**HIGHWAYS ACT 1980
WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981
THE SHROPSHIRE COUNCIL (FOOTPATH 1, PARISH OF LOPPINGTON AND
FOOTPATH 86 AND FOOTPATH 87 (PART), PARISH OF MYDDLE, BROUGHTON AND
HARMER HILL) PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2018**

The above named order made on 25th October 2018 by the Shropshire Council (“the Council”) under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980, will **divert**

the full width of that Footpath 1, Loppington, from point A on the order map (SJ 4609 2548) where it leaves the county road running in a general easterly direction for approximately 137 metres, then crossing the parish boundary and continuing as Footpath 86, Myddle, Broughton and Harmer Hill Parish, for approximately 172 metres and then continuing along part of Footpath 87 in a general east-north-easterly direction for approximately 164 metres to point B on the order map (SJ 4653 2559); a total distance of approximately 473 metres; **onto a line** in the Parish of Myddle, Broughton and Harmer Hill, from a pedestrian gate at point C on the order map (SJ 4619 2534) running in a general north easterly followed by a general north-north-easterly direction along a hedged field boundary to the west and fenced to the east for approximately 261 metres to point D on the order map (SJ 4627 2558). From here the route turns to follow a general easterly direction passing through a kissing gate (SJ 4633 2558), fenced both sides and surfaced for approximately 85 metres, then continuing for a further 66 metres approximately unenclosed on a concreted surface and then continuing as a surfaced route, fenced both sides, for another 116 metres approximately to point B on the order map (SJ 4653 2559); a total distance of approximately 528 metres with a width of 3 metres throughout.

A copy of the order and the order map and an explanatory statement have been placed and may be seen free of charge at the Council offices at The Shirehall, Abbey Foregate, Shrewsbury during normal office hours or via the Council’s website at <https://shropshire.gov.uk/outdoor-partnerships/countryside-access-and-public-rights-of-way/current-public-path-orders/>. Any representations about or objections to the order may be sent in writing to Shropshire Outdoor Partnerships, Rights of Way Mapping and Enforcement Manager, The Shirehall, Abbey Foregate, Shrewsbury, SY2 6ND, or by email to outdoor.recreation@shropshire.gov.uk, not later than 23rd November 2018. Please state the grounds on which they are made.

If no such representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Council may confirm the order as an unopposed order. If the order is sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for confirmation any representations and objections which have not been withdrawn will be sent with the order.
