

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH EXTINGUISHMENT AND
DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT MODIFICATION ORDER**

**HIGHWAYS ACT 1980
WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981**

**THE SHROPSHIRE COUNCIL (FOOTPATHS 69 AND 68Y, PARISH OF NEEN SAVAGE)
PUBLIC PATH EXTINGUISHMENT ORDER 2018**

The above named order made on 19th April 2018 by the Shropshire Council (“the Council”) under section 118 of the Highways Act 1980, will **extinguish**

the full width of Footpath 69, Neen Savage, to be extinguished from point A (GR SO 6804 7985) on the Order Map, where it leaves the County Road, running in a general northerly direction across pasture to point B on the Order Map (GR SO 6806 7998) where it meets a fence line and the parish boundary with Stottesdon parish; a total distance of approximately 136 metres;
and
the full width of Footpath 68Y, Neen Savage, from a fence line and the parish boundary with Stottesdon parish at point B (GR SO 6806 7998) on the Order Map, running in a general south easterly direction across pasture to cross a boundary onto a track leading to buildings at Overwood Farm where the path terminates at point C on the Order Map (GR SO 6826 7967); a total distance of approximately 373 metres.

A copy of the order and the order map and an explanatory statement have been placed and may be seen free of charge at the Council offices at The Shirehall, Abbey Foregate, Shrewsbury during normal office hours or via the Council’s website at

Please state the grounds on which they are made.

If no such representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Council may confirm the order as an unopposed order. If the order is sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for confirmation any representations and objections which have not been withdrawn will be sent with the order.
