Benefits of registration – hearing impaired

Below is a summary of the main benefits of registration for Hard of Hearing, Deaf with Speech and Deaf without Speech.

- Travel Concessions you may be eligible for concessionary travel if you are registered profoundly or severely deaf, or without speech. To find out more, contact 0345 6789 088 or visit http://shropshire.gov.uk/concessionary-travel-scheme/
- 2. Disabled Person's Rail Card entitles you to 1/3 off most rail fares throughout the UK. If you are travelling with an adult companion, they are also eligible for the same discount. The card is available to those who are registered with a hearing impairment or use a hearing aid. The document necessary to prove entitlement is a copy of the front page of your NHS battery book or a copy of your dispensing prescription from a private hearing aid supplier. - 3. **Welfare Benefits -** If you are registered with a hearing impairment, you may be entitled to certain financial benefits. To find out more, contact 0345 6789 002 or visit https://shropshire.gov.uk/benefits/
- 4. VAT Exemption If you are registered with a hearing impairment, you may be eligible to purchase products and services without paying VAT on them, if they are related to your hearing loss. - Theatre Severn (Shrewsbury) If you are registered with a hearing impairment, you may be entitled to receive 50% discount off full price tickets.
