These matters were handled by the chair which eventually let to what appears to be a solution acceptable to the majority

Biggest success or greatest achievement for your LJC in 2009/10

Suggestions were requested from the Committee. Comments received are as follows:

Sarah North, Hinstock Parish Council

I personally think the Local Joint Committee scheme is excellent as it gives local communities opportunities to receive funding for projects that would normally only be on people's wish lists. In Hinstock it has helped projects that would normally have taken years to fund and the pay back for Hinstock Parish Council is people see us as a proactive "can do" council.

Mike Hill, Cheswardine Parish Council

My immediate observation is that the Cheswardine Community Shop has been a great success which without assistance from the LJC would not be in existence today. This project is probably the second largest project undertaken by the community; the largest being the restoration of the Parish Hall where £125k of Lottery money plus a £25k loan taken out and paid for by the Parish Council enabled the task to be done. The Community Shop was driven by a small group of enthusiastic and talented people who drew together local people from many walks of life and marshalled their efforts into a cohesive force. The outcome is that the Shop is there for everyone to use and enjoy, regardless of age, ability or general infirmity. It has also resulted in improving the High Street scene, in that what was once a neglected piece of ground with a disused building, is now a smart and tidy area and a place of relaxation. Without assistance from the LJC the Shop would not be trading, but I feel that the spirit and resolve demonstrated by those directly involved would still be present in their endeavours to reach their objective.

Ron Lucas, Norton-in-Hales Parish Council

Thanks for this invitation to comment. I believe the strength of the LJC is the formula which was adopted from the start which is to give a local voice in decision making not least in the allocation of funds for local good causes. I know that here in Norton-in-Hales we have greatly appreciated the help given to our village hall, baby swings and the community pavilion (via the Community Building Fund). It makes Shirehall less remote than otherwise would be the case. The other strength is the opportunity for the general public to attend meetings and air their views, thus enhancing local opinion. I cannot pick out one thing to mention which has been the biggest success in

2009-10 but overall I believe the current formula works well. I personally liked the opportunity to give feed back on the upcoming budget, as we did in Hodnet

This has enabled the LJC to earmark funding priorities in the knowledge that they have significant local support.
- At the first meeting it was decided not to offer any community grants. This has proved controversial and applications for money have still been made, but the LJC remains committed to funding projects identified as priorities through the updated Parish Plan.

Greatest challenge or biggest learning point in 2009/10

• It takes a long time to undertake a proper community consultation and there can be understandable frustration at a perceived lack of progress. It is hoped that at the LJCs first meeting of 2010/11 a series of funding decisions will be taken to implement the Action Plan arising from the consultation.

Any Other Comments

• An excellent relationship has been established between the Parish Council and LJC and there have been a number of working group meetings involving members and officers of both organisations endeavouring to progress the Parish Plan. There is a lot of goodwill and positive desire to make a difference with the budget allocated to the area.
