





Our concern is that this use is inappropriate in the Town Centre. This area is a busy secondary shopping street in Shrewsbury town centre. On the other side of the road is a church, which has nursery classes. Premises forming part of the Sixth Form College are around fifty metres away. Residents live behind the premises and their properties abut the proposed venue. A small hotel is currently undergoing refurbishment around fifty yards away. It is a popular route for tourists visiting Shrewsbury, who come to see Rowley's House and the riverside. Further, Shrewsbury town centre has a high proportion of residents living within it whom must pass by this venue in order to carry out their daily activities. Many residents will feel threatened, and should not have to, by such an encounter. Notwithstanding that the times of the unspecified sexual entertainment are limited to 9 pm to 3 am; it is the presence of this type of establishment that is undesirable in the Town Centre.

We are not seeking to act as censors, nor to be the arbiters of citizens' tastes. It was reported on the 11th of February 2013 that Source Vodka Bar on Barker Street, Shrewsbury has applied for a license to use the bar as a 'sex encounter establishment' so they can hold a weekly event of pole dancing and lap dances in private booths.

Objection Details

We would like to make our objection on the following grounds:

- A lap dancing venue would be a completely inappropriate neighbour for Shrewsbury Sixth Form College (see appendix a). We accept that the college will be closed when the club is open, however the club is still exposing and promoting a set of values that is ill fitting with the college, and harmful to young people. It could also tarnish the college's reputation. There will be certain occasions such as open evenings and public performances when the college will be open in the evenings.
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- Huge investment is being made into Shrewsbury as a tourist destination and at this time
 the town's Tourist Information Centre (see appendix a) at Rowley's House is located
 directly opposite Source Vodka Bar. Although eventually the visitor's centre is being
 relocated, at the moment it would be a very off-putting and confusing message to
 tourists, particularly parents with small children.
- It is in close proximity to Claremont Baptist Church and St Chad's Church (see appendix a); these are religious places of worship as well as being venues for community activities. They are also used at various times of day including evenings when Source Vodka Bar would be open. A lap dancing venue in close proximity to these churches would be highly inappropriate and arguably offensive.

- Severnvale Academy (see appendix a) is located on Claremont Hill; they are a language school for non English speakers, and hold courses for young people in the summer.
 Source Vodka Bar is right around the corner from the Academy and, as a lap dancing venue, would be an unsuitable neighbour.
- Source Vodka Bar's position on Barker Street is very close to St John's Hill Apartments
 and residents of Claremont Hill, Claremont Bank and Hill's Lane (see appendix a).
 Residents may include children and the elderly and clearly a lap dancing venue in their
 residential area would be unacceptable.
- There is a bus stop situated right outside the premises (see appendix c) and is used at times when the club is in operation. For instance the Number 1 bus service from Monkmoor to Gains Park stops at Barker Street at 19.13, 19.43, 20.13, 20.43 and 21.13 on Thursdays (see appendix a). It is unacceptable that people who wish to use the bus service are forced to wait outside a strip club and are faced with the threat of customers who pass by invariably under a state of intoxication and potentially sexual excitement.
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To conclude Barker Street is a safe, welcoming and respectable area of Shrewsbury town centre which would be severely inhibited by the presence of a venue operating as a strip club. The application for a Sex Establishment License for Source Vodka Bar should be refused in order to maintain and promote the economic and social prosperity of this area.



Having considered the application by the owners of Source Vodka Bar, 8 Barker Street to be licensed as a "Sex Encounter Establishment", Shrewsbury Town Council wishes to raise its formal objections for such and requests the Licensing Committee refuse the application.

Detailed below is the Town Council's basis for refusal.

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It should be placed on record that Shrewsbury Town Council is not passing any religious or moral judgment on these kinds of institutions or those who wish to frequent them. What the individual wishes to do in private is a matter for their own personal choice; when such activities have the potential to become more public, the Town Council should be seen to support the well-being of the public at large. The Town Council retains strong values on equality and anything that undermines or discriminates against either sex should not be allowed. We see that licensed activities should not be degrading to one sex or place the other sex into a portrait of unwholesomeness.

It is important to note that while people may have strong objections, Parliament has already debated the moral and religious basis for Sex Encounter Establishments, and the resulting legislation now provides that they are legal where licensed.

The Town Council's grounds relate to the in-appropriacy of such an establishment in the heart of the town which strives to act as a service hub for the residents of Shrewsbury and its wider hinterland and a focus for tourism and the visitor economy to the county.

Shrewsbury Town Centre is extremely fortunate in that it is a sustainable community in itself not only providing a focus for retail trade and employment but it also has a large residential population who have to pass the entrance to these premises on a

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daily basis and see the resultant effect of such establishments. We contend that it contravenes residents' Human Rights to feel undermined and threatened by such establishments.

Members question the inappropriacy of the establishment's advertising practices and question whether the necessary Consent to Advertise permissions have been sought and granted. In addition to potential distress these adverts may place on our resident community, concern is expressed about the proximity of this establishment to the nearby 6th Form College and whether the students' permanent reminder of such activities is conducive to acclimatising them to adult life. Should this application be granted, we would expect as a minimum that the advertising of such an establishment would not be publically obtrusive.

Whilst the Town Council is considered a secular body, we must continue to have cognisance of the fact that there are two places of worship within close proximity to this establishment, the patrons of which will no doubt use the adjacent public parking facilities to frequent their place of worship.


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Overall, the Town Council and its stakeholders have worked tirelessly to develop an image and brand for Shrewsbury to increase footfall and in turn, visitor spend and improve the vitality and viability of Shrewsbury as a commercial centre; this application could have the effect of altering that brand/image perception and negating those positive outcomes. The Town Centre is within one of the richest conservation areas within the county, if not the country, and in that spirit, no activities should be allowed that would detract from the areas preservation and enhancement.

Dear Licensing Officer

I wish to object to the application for a Sex Establishment Licence for these licensed premises in Shrewsbury town centre.

Shrewsbury town centre streets are either shopping streets or residential streets or a mixture of both. As a 'relevant locality' they are entirely inappropriate streets to site a Sexual Entertainment Venue. Our concerns are that this development is especially inappropriate in this busy secondary shopping street in Shrewsbury town centre, because of the neighbouring uses. On the other side of the road is a church, which has nursery classes, around fifty metres away are premises currently forming part of the Sixth Form College and a small hotel currently empty and there are many residents living behind and near the premises. In addition this is a popular route for tourists visiting Shrewsbury, who come to see Rowleys House and the riverside.

The town centre is really a village from the point of its residents, and they cannot help passing these premises just going about normal business. Notwithstanding that the times of the unspecified sexual entertainment are limited to Thursdays from 9 pm to 3 am, it is the presence of this type of entertainment that is undesirable in this street. Once established it would be difficult to resist extension to the licence in terms of 'performances' at other times and on other days of the week.

I also have reservations about the management of such a licence by the current management of these premises. The prominent and extensive signage on this building does not have the benefit of planning consent in spite of several requests to the management for them to seek such consent. I have serious doubts that any legislation governing the advertisements relating to the presence of a Sexual Entertainment Venue would be observed, and any conditions applied to such a licence might receive the same scant attention.



Most importantly the appearance of the first Sexual Entertainment Venue in our town centre is highly likely to lead to further applications, which would have serious foreseen and unwanted consequences. These remotes the plantage to one past of a town of day and that the plantage of the periods since Norman times.

Mine is not a moral judgement, but rather an objection based on professional experience. Three years of my medical training took place in NHS hospitals in Soho, the largest red light district in the country, where I helped to provide medical care to the large daily influx of people including the sex workers in that area. As a resident medical officer I was aware of the problems that arise when there are venues providing so-called sexual entertainment. They attract other sex workers who patrol the streets. Anyone passing these venues is likely to be touted for business and importuned by sex workers in the street. If this were to happen to our town centre, this would affect residents as well as tourists and visitors seeking evening entertainment within our town centre. This would be a tragedy for us all and possibly undo all the hard work of our many tourist organisations.

Accordingly we consider it unwise to introduce this risk to our town centre, which has a large resident population and an up-market tourist image it can ill afford to lose.

For these reasons we seek a refusal of this application.

If the Licensing Authority decides to grant this application, we seek four conditions. The first should prohibit any advertisement on the exterior of the premises to indicate the existence of a Sexual Entertainment Venue, the second should prohibit any view of the 'sexual entertainment' from the street, the third prohibit any touting for customers taking place off the premises and the fourth that there should no opportunity for either the entertainers or the customers to have physical contact with each other.
