Main difficulty has been the production of important consultations such as the Natural England Environment white paper, over the summer period when the LAF does not meet. Greater membership of Huddle and our own Yammer system have helped to disseminate information more speedily.

There are often instances where consultations have been released and neither the LAF nor Natural England have been notified.

We miss the close relationship that we used to have with NE representation at nearly all the LAF meetings.

Do you have any issues with recruitment of members from particular interest groups? Does this hinder your work in any way?

We still are under-represented by young adults, ethnic minorities and cyclists. In reality this does not hinder work.
