### **EXERCISE OF DELEGATED POWERS**

**Responsible Officer** 

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### 1. Summary

- 1.1 Licensing officers have been given delegated powers to issue or amend licences, providing no objections have been received in the case of licences issued under the Licensing Act or with regard to general and public health licences.
- 1.2 Further, procedures have been approved for officers with direct line management responsibility for Licensing to use their delegated powers to, amend, revoke or refuse driver and vehicle licences (to include matters relating to the use of mobile phones).
- 1.3 This report gives details of the issue of licences, or variations, that have been issued between 1<sup>st</sup> February 2012 and 30<sup>th</sup> April 2012, as well as, the licensing enforcement activity undertaken during this period, a summary of applications considered by committee and the income received by Licensing in 2011/12.

### 3. Risk Assessment and Opportunities Appraisal

3.1 This is an information report giving Members information on the work undertaken by the Licensing team and Committee and therefore a risk assessment and opportunities appraisal has not been carried out.

4.1 There are no financial implications associated with this report.

### 5. Background

- 5.1 Information regarding the issue of licences by Officers under delegated powers is reported to Committee on a quarterly basis.
- 5.2 Officers use their delegated powers in a number of situations, including where:
  - a) A licence has been requested and there have been no objections raised by interested parties or Responsible Authorities.
  - b) The application has met the Council's policy criteria for accepting an application.
  - c) There are vehicle applications for new or renewal licenses and revocation of licenses where the operating criteria as set by the Hackney Carriage and Private Hire License policy or Out of Area policy is not met and the officer does not consider there to be any special reason for an exception to be made.
  - d) There are driver's applications for new or renewal licences or revocation of licences where the criteria as set by the Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Licence policy is not met and the officer does not consider there to be any special reason for an exception to be made.
- 5.3 The table in Appendix A shows the complete range of licences issued by the licensing team during the period 1<sup>st</sup> February 2012 and 30<sup>th</sup> April 2012. During this three month period the total number of licences processed was 1398.
- With the continued influx of 'Out of Area' applications for both driver badges and vehicles, there was also an increased number of referrals to the Licensing and Safety Sub-Committee in February and March before the procedure for decisions to be made by officers was approved. Appendix B shows that there were three scheduled committee meetings and a further 2 additional meetings.
- 5.5 The Licensing Act activities at Sub Committee have also been given in Appendix C. During this period no 'reviews' were called.
- 5.6 The administrative function of the licence process is supported by the enforcement of licensing conditions. Appendix D shows the activities that have been carried out during February, March and April 2012.
- 5.7 As a result of checks on booking records and mileage of 'out of area' licenced vehicles, the Licensing team have used the new agreed delegation process to revoke 29 vehicle licences. However 13 of these have made appeals to the Magistrates Court.
- 5.8 This last quarter has seen a large number of Telford driver and vehicle licences fall due for renewal. Where they have been unable to show that they have been operating to a material extent within the Zone that they have been licensed for, then the vehicle applications have been refused. To date there have been 50 refusals which has resulted in 43 appeals being made to the Magistrates Court.

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- 5.9 Following the decision at the Strategic Licensing Committee on 21<sup>st</sup> March 2012, vehicles and driver applications are now being considered by Officers using delegated powers. Evidence is obtained by the officers through interview with the applicants, to ascertain where they intend to operate to a material extent and to also obtain agreement that they will keep records if a licence is granted. Where the decision is 'minded to refuse', a letter is sent to the applicant giving them an opportunity to make written representations stating any exceptional circumstances that they wish to be taken into consideration. This is in line with the rules of natural justice which state that there is a right to be heard before a decision is made.
- 5.10 The number of licences and actions determined by this process is as follows:-

### 6. Conclusion

Ouring the last quarter the work load for the Licensing team continues to be high with the team addressing changes to the Licensing Act 2003 which were introduced with the Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act 2011 as well as balancing other licensing work and in particular the taxi and private hire licences. With respect to the latter, the team are continuing to deal with an influx of new 'out of area' driver and vehicle applications, the renewal applications of the Telford driver and vehicle licences as well as the enforcement activity associated with

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checking 'out of area' licenced vehicles. Defence files are also being produced for the appeals to the Magistrates' Court.
