APPLICATION FOR A REVIEW OF A PREMISES LICENCE

1. Summary

1.1 To consider an application for a review of a Premises Licence.

Premises: Ashleys Wine Bar 9 Shoplatch Shrewsbury SY1 1HF. A location plan is attached to the report as Appendix A.

- 1.2 Shropshire Council being the authorised licensing authority for the above premises has received an application for a review of a premises licence.
- 1.3 The application has been accepted as a valid application. The application is required to be determined by way of a hearing of the Licensing Sub-Committee.
- 1.4 In determining the application the licensing authority must give appropriate weight to:
 - the steps that are necessary to promote the licensing objectives;
 - the representations (including supporting information) presented by all parties;
 - Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003;
 - Shropshire Council's Licensing Policy.
- 1.5 After considering all the relevant issues the licensing authority may:-
 - take no further action
 - issue informal/formal warnings to the Designated Premises Supervisor and/or Premises Licence holder
 - modify conditions of the licence
 - exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence
 - remove the designated premises supervisor
 - suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months
 - revoke the licence

- 1.6 Following a hearing, the licensing authority should give its decision and provide reasons to support it. This will be important if there is an appeal by any of the parties.
- 1.7 All parties are required to be notified of a decision and that decision should be accompanied by information on the right of the party to appeal.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 That the Sub-Committee determines the application in accordance the Statutory Guidance issued under s182 of the Licensing Act 2003, the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy, the information contained within this report, supporting documentation and having had due regard to the applicant, licence holder and the parties/authorised bodies making relevant representations.
- 2.2 That the Sub-Committee determines the application in accordance with the options in paragraph 7.
- 2.3 That the Sub-Committee provides the reasons for its decision.

5. Purpose of Report

5.1 To consider an application for a review of the Premises Licence for Ashleys Wine Bar, 9 Shoplatch, Shrewsbury, SY1 1HF.

6. Background

- 6.1 Mr S Harbord-Suffield and Mrs L Whitaker have made an application for a review of a Premises Licence on the grounds that operations at the premises undermine the Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety and Prevention of Public Nuisance Licensing Objectives.
- 6.2 The application is supported by evidence dating from February 2014 to March 2015 of issues encountered by the applicants with the premises. A number of witness statements were produced with the application.
- 6.3 The current Premises Licence was issued on 30th June 2010. The Premises Licence holder and designated premises supervisor is Mr Ashleigh Davies.

- 6.4 During the consultation period 25 representations have been received:
 - One representation is from Shropshire Council's Public Protection Service in its capacity as a Responsible Authority for Public Safety and Public Nuisance.
 - Two representations are in support of Ashleys Wine Bar and its current Licence Holder/DPS.
 - The remaining twenty two are from interested parties and are in support of the review application with the principal concerns being public nuisance and public safety.
- 6.5 The representations have not been withdrawn.
- 6.6 During the consultation period additional documents have been provided by Mr Ashley Davies in response to the review application. These documents include letters/statements supporting Mr Davies.

7. Options for Consideration

- **7.1** The options available to the Licensing Sub-Committee having considered all the relevant information are as follows:
 - take no further action
 - issue informal/formal warnings to the Designated Premises Supervisor and/or Premises Licence holder
 - modify conditions of the licence
 - exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence
 - remove the designated premises supervisor
 - suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months
 - revoke the licence
- 7.2 Members of the Sub-Committee should be advised that the applicant, licence holder or any other person who made relevant representations in relation to the application may appeal against the decision made to the Magistrates' Court within 21 days of the date on which they were notified.

8. Standard of Decision Making

- 8.1 In accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Council's scheme of delegation, all applications for a review of a Premises Licence have to be determined by this Sub-Committee.
- 8.2 When determining the application, the Sub-Committee should only consider issues, which relate to the four licensing objectives. The licensing objectives are:
 - The prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - Public Safety
 - The prevention of a Public Nuisance
 - The protection of Children from Harm

- 8.3 Members of the Sub-Committee must have regard to the statutory guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy. Members of the Sub-Committee may deviate from the statutory guidance and licensing policy only if they deem that there is good reason to do so.
- 8.4 Members of the Sub-Committee should not allow themselves to predetermine the application or to be prejudiced in favour or opposed to the applicant and/or the licence holder and shall only determine the application having had an opportunity to consider all relevant facts.



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ANNEX 1

MANDATORY CONDITIONS

Supply of Alcohol

Where a Premises Licence authorises the supply of alcohol, the following conditions are applicable:

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence or at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Door Supervision/Supervisors

Whenever security operatives are employed at licensed premises to carry out any security function they must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority (SIA).

Cinemas

For all premises licences and club premises certificates authorising the exhibition of films, access will be restricted only to those who meet the required age limit in line with any certificate granted by the British Board of Film Classification.

For the admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with the recommendations given to films either by a body designated under Section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 - the British Board of Film Classification is the only body so designated.

Mandatory Drinks Code Conditions

- 1.-(1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children-
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee

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ANNEXES confined...

to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-
- (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
- (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- Applicable from 6th April 2010
- 2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- Applicable from 6th April 2010
- 3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- Applicable from 6th April 2010
- 4.-(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- Applicable from 1st October 2010
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that-
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.
- Applicable from 1st October 2010

ANNEX 2

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH OPERATING SCHEDULE

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

- 1. There would be CCTV coverage and all recordings would be made available to the Licensing Authority or the Police on request; the recordings will be kept for 28 days;
- 2. The designated premises supervisor would be a member of Pubwatch.
- 3. No consumption of alcohol will be permitted in external areas after 22.00 hours.
- 4. On a risk assessed basis by the premises licence holder, door staff will be employed at appropriate rates.
- 5. No licensable activities will take place in external areas of 00:00 hours.

Public Safety

1. There will be compliance with all Health and Safety legislation.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

- 1. Music would be controlled so as not cause a nuisance:
- 2. The payement area outside the premises would be cleaned daily.
- 3. Staff will monitor the outside seating area at all times to ensure there is no public nuisance.

Protection of Children from Harm

- 1. Persons under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult;
- 2. Identification would only be accepted in the form of a passport or driving licence.

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


