OFSTED INSPECTION OF SERVICES FOR CHILDREN IN NEED OF HELP AND PROTECTION, CHILDREN LOOKED AFTER AND CARE LEAVERS and REVIEW OF THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE LOCAL SAFEGUARDING CHILDREN BOARD

1. Summary

A team of 9 inspectors from Ofsted spent four weeks in the Children's Services directorate from 11th September to 5th October 2017 inspecting services for children in need of help and protection, children looked after and care leavers. They also undertook a review of the effectiveness of the Local Safeguarding Children Board. The inspectors met a wide range of staff, Members and partners, spent time with the various social care teams as they went about their day to day work, accompanied social workers on scheduled visits and case reviews and examined a vast amount of data.

Their report was published on 24th November 2017 and the overall judgement for Shropshire's services for children in need of help and protection, children looked after and care leavers is "Good", which represents an improvement since the last inspection of children's social care in 2012. The report is attached at Appendix A.

It is recognised that Shropshire Council's children's social care is still on a journey of improvement and there are recommendations made within the report. We are required to draw up an action plan for these recommendations within the report and return this to Ofsted within working 70 days.
