Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

For the supply of alcohol

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or their personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Exhibition of films

For all premises licences and club premises certificate authorising the exhibition of films, access will be restricted only to those who meet the required age limit in line with any certificate granted by the British Board of Film Classification.

Admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with the recommendations given to films by a body designated under Section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 - the British Board of Film Classification is the only body so designated.

Door Supervision

Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Mandatory Drinks Code Conditions

- 1. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or,
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); .
- (b)provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise antisocial behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age

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verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that—
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—.
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml.
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Mandatory Price Conditions

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—P=D+(DxV)

where—

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4.—(1) Paragraph 2 applies where the permitted price given by sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

Prevention of Crime & Disorder

- 1. No person carrying open bottles containing alcohol will be admitted to the premises during the hours it is open to the public.
- 2. Drinks will not be removed from the premises in open containers except into the rear public courtyard as defined on the premises plan attached to the licence, or into any area covered by a valid pavement permit or licence. Drinks being taken
- into any pavement permit/licence area will be decanted at the point of sale into plastic containers.
- 3. CCTV, with a picture quality capable of being used for evidence, will cover all internal areas of the premises, including point(s) of sale and all entrances/exits, and any external areas used for licensable activities or where outside seating is provided. The CCTV will be operational at all times the premises is open to the public.
- 4. CCTV recordings will be retained for a minimum of 30 calendar days and made available on request to Police officers and any authorised person, as defined by the Licensing Act 2003. On request means at the time of the request, in a format which is viewable away from the premises.
- 5. There will be signage in the premises, clearly visible to members of the public, which states that CCTV is in operation.
- 6. There will be at least one registered SIA door supervisor on duty at the premises from 22:30 onwards until close on all Fridays, Saturdays and nights preceding nationally recognised public holidays.
- 7. Between 22:30 and 23:00 the door supervisor will perform a check of the entire premises to ensure good order. This check and any findings will be recorded in a log kept for this purpose which shall be retained and made available to the Police or authorised officers, as defined by the Licensing Act 2003, on request.
- 8. From 23:00 the door supervisor will operate challenge 25 on the door, before permitting entry to the premises.
- 9. On all Fridays, Saturdays and nights preceding nationally recognised public holidays, there will be a personal licence holder on the premises from 18:00 onwards when licensable activities are taking place.
- 10. The premises will have a zero tolerance to drugs policy, the police will be informed if anyone is found in possession of controlled substances.
- 11. Drugs found will be placed in a suitable locked receptacle kept for that purpose. Means for securing and unlocking the receptacle will be held by the Premises Licence Holder or a nominated responsible person. A record shall be made of the
- date and time of the find, the person who made the find and the person who secured the found item(s). This record will be made available to any authorised authority on request.
- 12. The Premises Licence Holder shall make suitable arrangements with the police for the collection of any found items as soon as possible after they are found.

Public Safety

- 1. Details of local taxi firms will be displayed to customers within the main retail area of the premises.
- 2. Glass / bottle collection will be undertaken every 30 minutes.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

- 1. Notices will be displayed in the premises requesting customers to respect the needs of local residents and to leave quietly.
- 2. The external area to the rear of the premises will be clear of patrons by 23:20. After 23:00 no patron who is not already using the external area will be permitted to go out.

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- 3. All windows and doors will be closed by 23:00 and remain closed until trading finishes, except for access and egress.
- 4. There will be no external speakers for licensable activities.

Protection of Children From Harm

- 1. Under 18s are not permitted on the premises unless accompanied by an adult.
- 2. Under 18s are not permitted on the premises after 21:00 unless they are actively taking part in pub game tournaments or competitions (e.g., dominoes/darts/pool). Under 18s taking part in such games after 21:00 hours must leave the premises immediately after their participation in the game ends.
- 3. No under 18s will be permitted to sit at the bar.
- 4. A challenge log for Challenge 25 and refusals will be maintained and made available to any authorised authority on request. The Challenge 25 log can be kept either electronically or in a hard backed/bound book.
- 5. As of 30 January 2023, all staff (employed or volunteers) responsible for selling alcohol shall receive training on the Challenge 25 procedures, proxy sales and individuals responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003. This training will be held for all persons involved in the supply of alcohol, prior to engaging in the serving of alcohol and within 14 days of them commencing this role.
 6. This training will be refreshed at least every six months as of 30 January 2023. Staff shall sign to confirm that they have received and understood the training. Written records of this training shall be retained and made available to the Police or authorised officers, as defined by the Licensing Act 2003, on request.
