





INCOME DEPRIVATION IN SHROPSHIRE (2010)

Income deprivation is considered to be one of the most important aspects of deprivation and subsequently is given a weighting of 22.5%. This domain measures the percentage of people living in low-income households.

The income deprivation domain includes two sub-domains:

- **Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index (IDACI)**
- **Income Deprivation Affecting Older People Index (IDAOP)**

The following indicators have been used to calculate the income deprivation scores:

- Adults and children in Income Support Families
- Adults and children in Income-Based Job Seeker's Allowance Families
- Adults and children in Pension Credit (Guarantee) Families
- Adults and children in Child Tax Credit Families (who are not claiming Income Support, income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or Pension Credit) whose equivalised income (excluding housing benefits) is below 60% of the median before housing costs.
- Asylum seekers in England in receipt of subsistence support, accommodation support, or both.

The percentage of people living in income deprivation within Shropshire has remained the same as in 2007 at 11%.

At an SOA level the percentage of people who live in income deprivation ranges from 2% in the least deprived to 35% in the most deprived.

The most deprived SOA overall fell in the former district ward of Harlescott.

Of the five SOA's which have the highest percentages of people living in income deprivation four of these are within the Shrewsbury area and one in Market Drayton.





Income Deprivation

Income deprivation is considered to be one of the most important aspects of deprivation and subsequently is given a weighting of 22.5%. This domain measures the percentage of people living in low-income households.

The income deprivation domain includes two sub-domains:

- **Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index (IDACI)**
- **Income Deprivation Affecting Older People Index (IDAOPI)**

The following indicators have been used to calculate the income deprivation scores:

- Adults and children in Income Support Households (2005)
- Adults and children in Income-Based Job Seekers Allowance Households (2005)
- Adults and children in Pension Credit (Guarantee) Households (2005)
- Adults and children in those Working Tax Credit households where there are children in receipt of Child Tax Credit whose equivalised income (excluding housing benefits) is below 60% of the median before housing costs (2005)
- Adults and children in Child Tax Credit Households (who are eligible for Income Support-Based Job Seekers Allowance, Pension Credit or Working Tax Credit) whose equivalised income (excluding housing benefits) is below 60% of the median before housing costs (2005)
- National Asylum Support Service (NASS) supported asylum seekers in England in receipt of subsistence support, accommodation support, or both (2005)

Caution should be exercised around making comparisons with the IMD 2004 for the income domain, since some indicators used in the IMD 2007 have been altered following major changes to the social security system.

Scores for this domain are calculated in a different way to most of the others – the scores represent actual rates of deprivation on an individual basis rather than allocating an overall score to whole SOAs.



Top 20% Super Output Area's (SOA's) most deprived in Shropshire



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

Income deprivation is calculated using a number of indicators:

- Adults and children in Income Support households (2001),
- Adults and children in Income Based Job Seekers Allowance households (2001),
- Adults and children in Working Families Tax Credit households whose equivalised income (excluding housing benefits) is below 60% of median before housing costs (2001),
- Adults and children in disabled Person's Tax Credit households whose equivalised income (excluding housing benefits) is below 60% of median before housing costs (2001),
- National Asylum Support Services supported asylum seekers in England in receipt of subsistence only and accommodation support (2002).

In addition, an Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index and an Income Deprivation Affecting Older People Index were created.

The IMD score for income deprivation contributes 22.5% of the overall IMD score for each SOA.




Index of Multiple Deprivation 2004 Income - National Quintiles
