# Universal Credit: Universal Support guidance and specification 2018/2019

(Source: Department for Work & Pensions)

This guidance is for Local Authorities (LA) and should be issued to partners who are providing Universal Support (Personal Budgeting Support). It supplements information in the Grant Funding Agreement (GFA), which sets out the grant terms and conditions.

#### 1. Background

Universal Credit (UC) brings a cultural change and behavioural shift for claimants. The transition to monthly payments and housing costs paid directly to claimants requires them to be responsible for managing their monthly payment and paying their bills. UC full service is also delivered via online self–service. Some people will need help with this.

Universal Support (US) is advice, assistance and support provided by UC or agreed US partners such as LAs, Citizens Advice, Credit Unions, Registered Social Landlords or relevant registered charities who are qualifying persons in accordance with the Social Security (Information-sharing in relation to Welfare Services etc.) (Amendment) Regulations 2015 which can be found here:

http://www.legislation.gov.uk/uksi/2015/46/regulation/2/made

for purpose of assisting claimants with:

- Managing their claim or award of UC including accessing and using online services;
- Managing their financial affairs.

The expansion of UC full service to a broader range of claimants started in May 2016, and will be completed in 2018. After the expansion process is complete, we will begin migrating claimants on legacy benefits, like Jobseeker's Allowance and Tax Credits, to the full service from July 2019. By 2022, all existing legacy claimants will have moved to UC.

#### 2. Working in Partnership

DWP has made funding available to LAs to help deliver US. US consists of Assisted Digital support (AD) and Personal Budgeting Support (PBS). This guidance details what is required from Personal Budgeting Support.

Local partners are best placed to understand local demographics and the likely needs of UC claimants with complex needs and ensure the right support services are in place so that claimants get joined up holistic support. Most District Partnership Managers (DPM) will already be working in partnership with their LAs and have US in place. LAs may choose to deliver US themselves, or they may commission agreed partners to provide the services.

#### 3. Universal Support – PBS provision

Before the start of an operational year, DWP, usually DPMs, and LAs will discuss what support is required for their area. The minimum support that LAs/partners should offer for PBS is in **Annex A**; the list is not exhaustive.

Once the detail of the local US provision has been agreed, LAs are responsible for communicating details of the support to DPMs and other stakeholders/interested parties. DPMs should also be notified of the referral process, i.e. written notification that's emailed via the secure network (from gcsx to gsi.gov.uk) or by telephone, and will update IT systems so staff are aware of the provision.

Support should be delivered face-to-face; however, it is possible to provide PBS support by telephone by exception, for example, in rural locations where public transport is not readily available or infrequent.

Operational evidence shows that in addition to DWP, UC claimants' US needs are often identified by partners and third parties. Since April 2017, LAs have been able to accept referrals directly through US providers; this will help identify the claimants who need support, deliver the right help at the right time and reduce handoffs.

#### 4. Management Information

The LA will be responsible for collating and retaining Management Information (MI) as detailed in the Grant Funding Agreement.

Quarterly MI returns should be emailed to DWP via the trusted network to UNIVERSAL.SUPPORTRETURNS@DWP.GSI.GOV.UK) and copied to their DPM by the 15th of the following month, e.g., Q1 returns are due by 15 July 2018.

These are the key MI metrics that are emailed to DWP:

For non-DWP referrals, the US provider is responsible for confirming eligibility before any PBS is delivered. It is likely that a claimant will need more than one US session but LAs should ensure that irrespective of the number of delivered sessions, a claimant is recorded only once on the MI template.

The claimant-specific MI will be used to inform regular local partnership performance improvement discussions and made available as and when required by DWP or other authorised persons as detailed in the GFA.

Partners will receive an MI template from their LA.

#### 5. Sharing Information and Data Protection

Claimants must give consent for appropriate personal data to be shared between DWP and LAs for US purposes. As explained in section 3, LAs will decide their process for receiving referrals. If email is the preferred option, LAs should share their trusted email address (xxxx@gcsx.gov.uk) with DWP. If DWP staff refer a claimant by email, they must only use this address.

Where the LA has commissioned partners to provide US and DWP staff identify a claimant with US requirements, they must only send the notification via the LA and if by email, via the trusted network address. DWP staff are not authorised to send US referrals directly to US delivery partners.

Where an agreed US delivery partner receives a notification/referral from a source other than DWP, they are responsible for:

- providing the LA with assurance that they supported the claimant with the online claim for UC or have observed that the claimant has a UC account (eligibility check for UC funding)
- ensuring data sharing consent is captured and retained
- ensuring MI is captured
- only claiming PBS funding once per claimant.

If the partnership develops processes that need data to be shared differently, a local Privacy Impact Agreement will be needed before implementation. DPMs will have access to more detailed guidance.

#### 6. Local Governance and Reviews

LAs and DPMs should have monthly meetings to review performance and discuss any US strategic/operational issues that have arisen and to identify good practice/areas for improvement. The resolution process for national issues is set out in the GFA.

#### Annex A

# What outputs might US providers deliver to help claimants transition to UC? Personal Budgeting Support

PBS is offered to all UCFS claimants when they transition to UC. This is to support claimants to manage their monthly payments and prioritise essential bills such as rent/utilities.

LAs will provide support for claimants who require personal budgeting support to manage their UC payments. This will be achieved through:

- Processing all personal budgeting support referrals from Jobcentre Plus including those claimants who have alternative payment arrangements;
- Identifying the appropriate channel and provider to deliver personal budgeting support (may not be the LA) and referring the claimant to the right place immediately;
- Providing (or arranging provision of) telephone or face to face personal budgeting support and follow up action as appropriate;
- Referring claimants to Jobcentre Plus who may need an alternative payment arrangement e.g. because of rent arrears or vulnerability
- Referrals to external organisations for other support services such as debt advice or help with pass-ported benefits

#### Resulting in claimants being able to:

- Understand their UC award and what they can claim
- Work out monthly income and outgoings

#### **Shropshire Council Instructions for tendering**

#### Contract Description/Specification

In accordance with Section 31 of the Local Government Act 2003; and pursuant to Chapter 3 of the Welfare Reform Act 2012 and The Universal Credit Regulations 2013, Shropshire Council is working in partnership with the Department for Work & Pensions (DWP) to assist in the successful roll out of Universal Credit (UC) across Shropshire by identifying eligible citizens with complex needs who are transferring onto UC and who are in need of Personal Budgeting Support (PBS) to help them manage their finances.

Under the partnership agreement, DWP provide grant funding to the Council based on estimated numbers of those requiring support. The council wishes to procure a Countywide service to provide PBS to those identified as requiring such support.

Delivery providers must be able to show that they can be classified as "Qualifying Partners" as required by Regulation 10 (1) (e) of the Social Security (information sharing in relation to welfare services etc.) Regulations 2012

#### **Personal Budgeting Support for Universal Credit**

**1.** Requirements of Service Provider:

The objective of Universal Credit Personal Budgeting Support is to help claimants transitioning onto Universal Credit with budget management skills that enable them to manage their money and pay their bills on time, prioritising rent payments. This will be achieved through:

- Providing Shropshire Council with assurance that they supported the claimant with the required PBS activities.
- Ensuring data sharing consent is captured and retained;
- **2.** The Outcomes of Personal Budgeting Support should include but not be restricted to the Claimant being capable of undertaking the following activities:
  - Work out monthly income and outgoings
  - Recognise priority bills, such as rent
  - Identify and cut back on non-essentials
  - Complete and maintain a budgeting plan
  - Convert from a Post Office card account / simple payments to more appropriate banking products
  - Have a transitional bank account
  - Set up a direct debit for prioritised payments
- 3. The referrals process will be as follows: Only those transferring onto Universal Credit are able to receive PBS via this agreement. Jobcentre Plus staff will identify to Shropshire Council those Universal Credit claimants needing help to budget. Shropshire Council will provide basic information and contact details to the provider in

- order that they can arrange for PBS to be delivered. Referrals between the Council and the provider and will be via a secure electronic system (ECINS), use of which the provider is expected to sign up to. There will be no licence costs to the provider in respect of use of this system. The provider will send completed work reports incorporating the required management statistics via the ECINS system.
- **4.** In addition, referrals for support can be identified directly through support providers, these will only attract funding for support where the need for PBS is due to transfer onto Universal Credit and where this has not already been delivered via any previous referral.
- **5.** The provider may, with appropriate consent from the client, refer on to other sources of support such as debt advice where appropriate
- **6.** The provider is required to refer claimants requiring an Alternative Payment Arrangement for example due to rent arrears or vulnerability, to the DWP
- 7. Amount of funding and payment: The amount of funding allocated to the Council for the purpose of providing PBS is set by the DWP according to their estimates of likely need, cost per hour per referral and is made available under strict conditions and to strict limits which cannot be exceeded. Payment of £43,246, equivalent to 50% of estimated support need is guaranteed in advance with the possibility for this to be increased via further quarterly payments in arrears if management returns show actual take up of support exceeds this initial 50% of expectation. The provider will be required to maintain accurate records of successful delivery of PBS to each individual, and to the required standard, accounted for against this initial payment. The completion of regular management information as required will determine whether take up exceeds these initial DWP estimates and the amount of any additional funding as a result.
- **8.** Funding for PBS is based on a total of 2 hours support per UC claimant, set at a maximum cost of £63.00 gross, delivered either face to face or alternatively telephone advice where appropriate with no payment made for any subsequent contact or advice. This limit is absolute and no further payment in respect of an individual can be claimed or paid. The provider is responsible for ensuring that only one claim for payment per client is made in accordance with these conditions.
- **9** The Council makes the assumption that payment will continue for future years based on DWP's assumption of future need –however is not guaranteed and the Service Provider should note this.
- 10 The Council is required to keep separate, accurate and up-to-date accounts and records in respect of the PBS for two years after the last day of the DWP Grant Period. Accordingly, the Service Provider needs to comply with Secure Record Keeping when formalising the Personal Budgeting Support in order that the council can meet its obligation to DWP.
- **11** The following obligations are placed on the Council as the recipient of grant funding from the DWP. These obligations will pass equally to the Service Provider as detailed:

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- The Recipient (and any person acting on its behalf) shall permit:
- (a) the Comptroller and Auditor General or appointed representatives;

• (b) the Funder or appointed representatives;

free access at all reasonable times to all documents (including computerised documents and data) and other information as are connected to the Grant payable under this Agreement. The Funder shall have the right to review, at the Funder's reasonable request, the Recipient's accounts and records that relate to the Grant and shall have the right to take copies of such accounts and records. The Council shall ensure that its (or that of Third Parties engaged in providing PBS) data management system does not encourage individual staff to make false claims regarding volumes or other grant eligibility criteria;

- The Council must have an established system that enables staff (or the staff of Third Parties engaged in providing PBS) to report inappropriate behaviour by colleagues in respect of delivery.
- The Council shall ensure a segregation of duties within its (or Third Parties engaged in providing PBS) operation between those employees directly involved in delivering PBS and those reporting management information to the Funder;
- The Council shall ensure that an audit system is implemented to provide periodic checks, to ensure effective and accurate recording and reporting of management information to the Funder.
- The Council shall on a quarterly basis provide the Funder with the required Management Information as well as any other information subsequently requested and in such formats as the Funder may reasonably require.
- The Council acknowledges that the Funder is subject to the requirements of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) and the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 and shall assist and co-operate with the Funder (at the Recipient's expense) to enable the Funder to comply with these information disclosure requirements.
- The service provider needs to demonstrate at all times during the contract duration that it is GDPR compliant and provide an adequate guarantee that it has, or can, implement appropriate technical and organisational measures that are sufficient to secure that the processing will (a) meet the requirements of the GDPR and (b) ensure the protection of the rights of the data subject. The provider should likewise not be passing on any personal data to a sub-contractor or other organisation that cannot comply with these terms and the provider must ensure that this is the case before handing over any personal data.

Accordingly the Service Provider needs to comply with all these data management and security requirements and provide evidence of its segregation of duties audit systems, periodic checks, records and provide accurate reports of management information for the council to provide to the funder.

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### 1.0 <u>Invitation to Tender</u>

1.1 You are invited to tender for the provision of Universal Credit as detailed in the

Tender Response Document. The contract is for a 12 month period commencing with an anticipated start date of **1st May 2018**.

- 1.2 Tenders are to be submitted in accordance with the draft Contract for Universal Credit: Delivery of Personal Budgeting Support and the instructions outlined within this document.
- 1.3 Tenders must be submitted in accordance with the following instructions. Tenders not complying in any particular way may be rejected by Shropshire Council (the Council) whose decision in the matter shall be final. Persons proposing to submit a Tender are advised to read the Invitation to Tender documentation carefully to ensure that they are fully familiar with the nature and extent of the obligations to be accepted by them if their Tender is accepted.
- The Invitation to Tender documents must be treated as private and confidential. Tenderers should not disclose the fact that they have been invited to tender or release details of the Invitation to tender document other than on an "in confidence" basis to those who have a legitimate need to know or who they need to consult for the purpose of preparing the tender as further detailed in these Instructions for Tendering.
- 1.5 Tenderers shall not at any time release information concerning the invitation to tender and/or the tender documents for publication in the press or on radio, television, screen or any other medium without the prior consent of the Council.
- The fact that a Tenderer has been invited to submit a tender does not necessarily mean that it has satisfied the Council regarding any matters raised in the pretender questionnaire submitted. The Council makes no representations regarding the Tenderer's financial stability, technical competence or ability in any way to carry out the required services. The right to return to any matter raised in any pretender questionnaire submitted as part of the formal tender evaluation is hereby reserved by the Council.
- 1.7 The Invitation to Tender is issued on the basis that nothing contained in it shall constitute an inducement or incentive nor shall have in any other way persuaded a tenderer to submit a tender or enter into a Contract or any other contractual agreement.
- 1.8 Shropshire Council is purchasing on behalf of itself and any wholly owned local authority company or other entity that is deemed to be a contracting authority by virtue of the Council's involvement.

#### 2.0 Terms and Conditions

- 2.1 Every Tender received by the Council shall be deemed to have been made subject to the draft Contract for Universal Credit: Delivery of Personal Budgeting Support and these Instructions for Tendering unless the Council shall previously have expressly agreed in writing to the contrary.
- The Tenderer is advised that in the event of their Tender being accepted by the Council, they will be required to undertake the required services.

#### 3.0 <u>Preparation of Tenders</u>

#### 3.1 Completing the Tender Response Document

- 3.1.1 Tenders should be submitted using the 'Tender Response Document' following the instructions given at the front of the document. The Tenderer's attention is specifically drawn to the date and time for receipt of Tenders and that no submission received after the closing time will be considered.
- **3.1.2** All documents requiring a signature must be signed;
  - a) Where the Tenderer is an individual, by that individual;
  - b) Where the Tenderer is a partnership, by two duly authorised partners;
  - c) Where the Tenderer is a company, by two directors or by a director and the secretary of the company, such persons being duly authorised for the purpose.
- 3.1.3 The Invitation to Tender Documents are and shall remain the property and copyright of the Council

#### 3.2 Tender Preparation and Costs

- 3.2.1 It shall be the responsibility of Tenderers to obtain for themselves at their own expense all information necessary for the preparation of their Tender. No claim arising out of want of knowledge will be accepted. Any information supplied by the Council (whether in the Tender Documentation or otherwise) is supplied only for general guidance in the preparation of tenders.
- 3.2.2 Any Tenderer considering making the decision to enter into a contractual relationship with the Council must make an independent assessment of the Tender opportunity after making such investigation and taking such professional advice as it deems necessary.
- 3.2.3 Tenderers will be deemed for all purposes connected with their Tender submission where appropriate to have visited and inspected the Council, its assets, all the locations in respect of the delivery of the services/supplies/works and to have satisfied themselves sufficiently as to the nature, extent and character of the services supplies/works sought, and the human resources, materials, software, equipment, machinery, and other liabilities and other matters which will be required to perform the contract.
- **3.2.4** The Council will not be liable for any costs incurred by Tenderers in the preparation or presentation of their tenders.
- 3.2.5 Tenderers are required to complete all pricing schedules in the Invitation to tender documents. The terms "Nil" and "included" are not to be used but a zero or figures must be inserted against each item. Unit rates and prices must be quoted in pounds sterling and whole new pence.
- 3.2.6 It shall be the Tenderer's responsibility to ensure that all calculations and prices in the Tender documentation are correct at the time of submission.
- 3.2.7 The Tenderer is deemed to have made him/herself acquainted with the Council's requirements and tender accordingly. Should the Tenderer be in any doubt regarding the true meaning and intent of any element of the specification he is invited to have these fully resolved before submitting his Tender. No extras will be

allowed for any loss or expense involved through any misunderstanding arising from his/her failure to comply with this requirement.

- 3.2.8 Any Tender error or discrepancy identified by the Council shall be drawn to the attention of the Tenderer who will be given the opportunity to correct, confirm or withdraw the Tender.
- 3.2.9 The Tender Documents must be treated as private and confidential. Tenderers should not disclose the fact that they have been invited to tender or release details of the Tender document other than on an In Confidence basis to those who have a legitimate need to know or whom they need to consult for the purpose of preparing the Tender.

#### 3.3 Parent Company Guarantee

It is a condition of contract that if the tendering company is a subsidiary then its Ultimate Group/Holding Company must guarantee the performance of this contract and provide a letter to that effect signed by a duly authorised signatory of the Ultimate Group/Holding Company if requested to do so by the Council. Where the direct parent company cannot provide an adequate guarantee in the opinion of the Council, the Council will look to another group or associate company, with adequate assets, to be the guarantor. In cases where the contract is with a Joint Venture Company (JVC) or a Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) company, which may have two or more parent companies and which may not be adequately capitalised or have sufficient financial strength on its own to support the risk and obligations it has under the contract, 'joint and several' guarantees / indemnities from the parent companies of the JVC or SPV may be sought.

#### 3.4 Warranty

The Tenderer warrants that all the information given in their Tender and if applicable their Request to Participate Questionnaire is true and accurate. The information provided will be deemed to form part of any contract formed under this contract.

The Tenderer warrants that none of their current Directors have been involved in liquidation or receivership or have any criminal convictions

#### 4.0 <u>Tender Submission</u>

- 4.1 Tenders must be submitted strictly in accordance with the letter of instruction accompanying this Invitation to Tender. Tenders must be submitted by the deadline of **noon**, **Friday 13**<sup>th</sup> **April 2018**.
- 4.2 No unauthorised alteration or addition should be made to the Specification and Tender Response Document, or to any other component of the Tender document. If any such alteration is made, or if these instructions are not fully complied with, the Tender may be rejected.
- **4.3** Qualified tenders may be submitted, but the Council reserves the right not to accept any such tender. The Council's decision on whether or not a Tender is acceptable will be final.
- **4.4** Tenderers should note that their Tender must remain open and valid and capable

of acceptance for a period of at least 90 days.

- 4.5 Tenderers should note that Tenders and supporting documents must be written in English and that any subsequent contract, which may or may not be entered into, its formation, interpretation and performance, shall be subject to and in accordance with the laws of England and subject to the jurisdiction of the Courts of England and Wales.
- 4.6 Where Tender submissions are incomplete the Council reserves the right not to accept them.

#### 5.0 <u>Variant Bids</u>

- 5.1 The Council is interested in alternative solutions which would provide and develop opportunities for savings in service costs, service improvement or other financial benefits. In particular, the Council wishes to encourage solutions which also deliver benefits and added value to the local economy, residents and the business community.
- Tenderers may submit, at their discretion, a Tender offering a different approach to the project as a "Variant Bid". However, to permit comparability, at least one bid must be submitted strictly in accordance with the Invitation to Tender Documents( the "Compliant Tender"). Any Tender variant proposed must clearly state how it varies from the requirements of the Compliant Tender Documents, and be explicit in demonstrating the benefits that will accrue to the Council from adopting this approach. Tenderers will be required to identify which submission, in their view, demonstrates best value to the Council.
- Variant Bids must contain sufficient financial and operational detail to allow any Variant Bid to be compared with the standard Tender, permitting its considerations in written form.

#### 6.0 <u>Tender Evaluation</u>

- 6.1 The Tenderers may be called for interview to seek clarification of their tender or additional or supplemental information in relation to their tender. The presentations will not carry any weighting to the final score achieved by Tenderers, but will be used to clarify and moderate issues raised in the Tenderer's submissions. Any areas of discrepancy between submissions and information gained from the presentations will be reviewed and scores previously awarded will be amended if necessary.
- 6.2 If the Council suspects that there has been an error in the pricing of a Tender, the Council reserves the right to seek such clarification, as it considers necessary from the Tenderer in question.

#### 7.0 <u>Clarifications</u>

- 7.1 Tenderers are responsible for clarifying any aspects of the tendering process and/or the Invitation to Tender documents in the manner described below.
- 7.2 If you are unsure of any section and require further clarification, please contact via

our Delta Tenderbox.

- **7.3** Where appropriate, the Authorised Officer named above may direct the Tenderer to other officers to deal with the matter.
- **7.4** All queries should be raised as soon as possible (in writing), in any event not later than 6<sup>th</sup> April 2018.
- 7.5 All information or responses that clarify or enhance the tendering process will be supplied to all Tenderers on a uniform basis (unless expressly stated otherwise). These responses shall have the full force of this Instruction and where appropriate the Conditions of Contract. If a Tenderer wishes the Council to treat a question as confidential this must be expressly stated. The Council will consider such requests and will seek to act fairly between the Tenderers, whilst meeting its public law and procurement duties in making its decision.
- 7.6 Except as directed in writing by the Authorised Officer, and confirmed in writing to a Tenderer, no agent or officer or elected Member (Councillor) of the Council has any express or implied authority to make any representation or give any explanation to Tenderers as to the meaning of any of the Tender Documents, or as to anything to be done or not to be done by a Tenderer or to give any warranties additional to those (if any) contained in the ITT or as to any other matter or thing so as to bind the Council in any way howsoever.

#### 8.0 Continuation of the Procurement Process

- **8.1** The Council shall not be committed to any course of action as a result of:
  - i) issuing this Invitation to Tender;
  - ii) communicating with a Tenderer, a Tenderer's representative or agent in respect of this procurement exercise;
  - iii) any other communication between the Council (whether directly or through its agents or representatives) and any other party.
- 8.2 The Council reserves the right at its absolute discretion to amend, add to or withdraw all, or any part of this Invitation to Tender at any time during the tendering stage of this procurement exercise.
- 8.3 At any time before the deadline for receipt of tender returns the Council may modify the Invitation to Tender by amendment. Any such amendment shall be numbered and dated and issued by the Council to all participating tenderers. In order to give prospective Tenderers reasonable time in which to take the amendment into account in preparing its Tender return, the Council may in its sole discretion, extend the deadline for submission of the tender returns. The Council reserves the right to amend, withdraw, terminate or suspend all or any part of this procurement process at any time at its sole discretion.

#### 9.0 <u>Confidentiality</u>

9.1 All information supplied by the Council in connection with or in these Tender

Documents shall be regarded as confidential to the Council unless the information is already within the public domain or subject to the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

- **9.2** The Contract documents and publications are and shall remain the property of the Council and must be returned upon demand.
- **9.3** Tenderers shall ensure that each and every sub-contractor, consortium member and/or professional advisor to whom it discloses these papers complies with the terms and conditions of this ITT.
- **9.4** The contents of this Invitation to Tender are being made available by the Council on condition that:
- 9.4.1 Tenderers shall at all times treat the contents of the Invitation to tender and any related documents as confidential, save in so far as they are already in the public domain and Tenderers shall not, subject to the provisions relating to professional advisors, sub-contractors or other persons detailed below, disclose, copy, reproduce, distribute or pass any of the contents of the Invitation to tender to any other person at any time or allow any of these things to happen;
- **9.4.2** Tenderers shall not use any of the information contained in this Invitation to tender for any purpose other than for the purposes of submitting (or deciding whether to submit) the tender; and
- **9.4.3** Tenderers shall not undertake any publicity activity within any section of the media.
- **9.5** Tenderers may disclose, distribute or pass this Invitation to tender to their professional advisors, sub-contractors or to another person provided that:
- **9.5.1** this is done for the sole purpose of enabling an Invitation to tender to be submitted and the person receiving the Information undertakes in writing to keep the Invitation to Tender confidential on the same terms as if that person were the Tenderer; or

#### 9.7 Transparency of Expenditure

The use of blanket protective markings such as "commercial in confidence" will no longer be appropriate and a clear indication as to what material is to be considered confidential and why should be given.
- 10.4 Shropshire Council will not be able to accept that trivial information or information which by its very nature cannot be regarded as confidential should be subject to any obligation of confidence.
- In certain circumstances where information has not been provided in confidence, Shropshire Council may still wish to consult with you as to the application of any other exemption such as that relating to disclosure that will prejudice the commercial interests of any party. However the decision as to what information will be disclosed will be reserved to Shropshire Council.

#### 11.0 <u>Disqualification</u>

- 11.1 The Council reserves the right to reject or disqualify a Tenderer's Tender submission where:
- 11.1.1 The tenderer fails to comply fully with the requirements of this Invitation to tender or is in breach of clause 15 of the Council's General Terms and Conditions relating to Bribery and Corruption or is guilty of a serious or intentional or reckless misrepresentation in supplying any information required; or
- **11.1.2** The tenderer is guilty of serious or intentional or reckless misrepresentation in relation to its tender return and/or the procurement process.

11.1.3 The tenderer directly or indirectly canvasses any member, official or agent of the Council concerning the award of the contract or who directly or indirectly obtains or attempts to obtain information from any such person concerning any other Tender or proposed Tender for the services. The Canvassing Certificate must be completed and returned as instructed.

#### **11.1.4** The Tenderer :

- a) Fixes or adjusts the amount of his Tender by or in accordance with any agreement or arrangements with any other person; or
- b) Communicates to any person other than the Council the amount or approximate amount of his proposed Tender (except where such disclosure is made in confidence in order to obtain quotations necessary for preparation of the Tender for insurance purposes); or

The Contracting Authority reserves the right to pass all information regarding the outcome of the Tendering process to the Office of Fair Trading to assist in the discharge of its duties. Additionally, the Council will adhere to the requirements of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 and Tenderers should note this statutory obligation.

#### 13.3 Transparency of Expenditure

Further to it's obligations regarding transparency of expenditure, the Council may also be required to publish information regarding tenders, contracts and expenditure to the general public, which could include the text of any such documentation, except for any information which is exempt from disclosure in accordance with the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act to be determined at the absolute discretion of the Council.

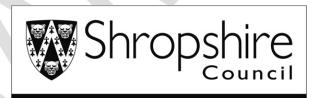

# 1.2 Interpretation

In this Agreement unless the context otherwise requires:

- 1.2.3 A person includes an individual, firm, company, corporation, unincorporated body of persons, or any state or any agency of any person.
- 1.2.4 A reference to a company shall include any company, corporation or other body corporate, wherever and however incorporated or established.
- 1.2.5 A reference to a holding company or subsidiary means a holding company or subsidiary as defined in section 1159 of the Companies Act 2006. In the case of a limited liability partnership which is a subsidiary of a company or another limited liability partnership, section 1159 of the Companies Act 2006 shall be amended so that:

# 2. Term:

2.1 It is agreed between the Parties that this Agreement will be for the Term commencing on the Commencement Date and ending on the Expiry Date.

# 4. Services

- 4.1 The Contractor shall provide the Services to the Council in consideration for the Council paying the Fee(s) to the Contractor, subject to the provisions of this Agreement
- **4.2** The Contractor shall provide the services in such places and locations as set out in the Specification
- **4.3** The Contractor shall use its best endeavours to complete/deliver the Services by the in the Specification.
- 4.4 The Services shall only be performed/delivered by the Contractor unless otherwise agreed in writing between the Parties
- 4.5 The Contractor shall provide the Services in accordance with the Specification with all due skill, care and diligence and in accordance with good industry practice.
- 4.6 The Contractor shall provide the Services in accordance with all current and relevant statutory provisions, regulations or other legislation from time to time in force relating to the provision of the Services
- 4.7 The Contractor shall during the Term ensure that every person employed by the Contractor in the provision of the Services is properly trained and instructed with regard to his/her tasks in relation to the Services
- **4.8** The Contractor shall carry out its own risk assessments relevant to the Services.
- **4.9** The Contractor shall have a written procedure for dealing with complaints about the Services in accordance with clause 30 (Complaints) hereof

- 4.10 before the Contractor engages or employs any person in the provision of the Services, or in any activity related to, or connected with, the provision of the Services, the Contractor must without limitation, complete the Employment Checks
  - **4.11.3** that a copy of the DBS check results are notified to the Council
- **4.12** The Parties agree that there shall be, on dates to be agreed, regular reviews of the progress of the delivery and success of the Services between the Contractor, the Council and DWP
- **4.13** The Contractor shall provide the Council/DWP with any information requested by DWP in accordance with the Funding Agreement
- 4.14 The Contractor shall comply with the obligations on the part of the Council contained in the Funding Agreement in so far as they relate to the Services provided under this Agreement.

## 6 Insurance

6.1 The Contractor shall effect and maintain with a reputable insurance company a policy or policies of insurance providing an adequate level of cover, or in accordance with any legal requirement for the time being in force, in respect of all legal liability which may be incurred by the Contractor, arising out of the Contractor's performance of this Agreement, including death or personal injury, loss of or damage to property or any other loss, and unless otherwise agreed with the Council such policy or policies of Public Liability and Employers Liability insurance shall provide for a minimum indemnity limit of £5,000,000 (FIVE MILLION POUNDS).

#### 6.2 NOT USED

6.3 Where the Contractor is providing Services of a professional nature, or the Council otherwise specifies that professional indemnity insurance is required, the Contractor shall hold and maintain professional indemnity insurance cover and shall ensure that all professional consultants or Sub-Contractors involved in the provision of the Services hold and maintain

policy cover which indemnifies the contractor for negligent acts arising out of the performance of this Agreement. To comply with its obligations under this clause, and as a minimum, the Contractor shall ensure professional indemnity insurance held by the Contractor and by any agent, Sub-Contractor or consultant involved in the performance of Services has a limit of indemnity of not less than £2,000,000 (TWO MILLION POUNDS) in respect of each and every claim.

- **6.3.1** The Contractor shall hold and maintain the insurances required under this Agreement for a minimum of 6 years following the expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement
- 6.4 The Contractor warrants that it has complied with this clause 6 and shall provide the Council with certified copies of the relevant policy documents (including any warranties or exclusions) together with receipts or other evidence of payment of the latest premiums due under those policies prior to the commencement of this Agreement and annually thereafter during the Term. If, for whatever reason, the Contractor fails to give effect to and maintain the insurances required under this clause 6, the Council may make alternative arrangements to protect its interests and may recover the costs of such arrangements from the Contractor.

#### **6.5** The Contractor shall:

- (a) do nothing to invalidate any insurance policy
- (b) notify the Council if any policy is (or will be) cancelled or its terms are (or will be) subject to any material change
- 6.6 For the avoidance of doubt, the terms of any insurance or the amount of cover shall not relieve the Contractor of any liabilities under this Agreement.
- 6.7 Where the minimum limit of indemnity required in relation to any of the insurances is specified as being "in the aggregate":
  - **6.7.1** if a claim or claims which do not relate to this Agreement are notified to the insurers which, given the nature of the allegations and/or the quantum claimed by the third party(ies), is likely to result in a claim or claims being paid by the insurers which could reduce the level of cover

available below that minimum, the Contractor shall immediately submit to the Council:

- (i) details of the policy concerned; and
- (ii) its proposed solution for maintaining the minimum limit of indemnity specified; and
- **6.7.2** if and to the extent that the level of insurance cover available falls below that minimum because a claim or claims which do not relate to this Agreement are paid by insurers, the Contractor shall:
- (i) ensure that the insurance cover is reinstated to maintain at all times the minimum limit of indemnity specified for claims relating to this Agreement; or
- (ii) if the Contractor is or has reason to believe that it will be unable to ensure that insurance cover is reinstated to maintain at all times the minimum limit of indemnity specified, immediately submit to the Council full details of the policy concerned and its proposed solution for maintaining the minimum limit of indemnity specified.

#### 7 <u>Indemnity</u>

- 7.1 The Contractor shall fully indemnify the Council against all liabilities, costs, expenses, damages losses and breach of its statutory duties or breach of an obligation under the DPA and GDPR (including any direct, indirect or consequential losses, loss of profit, loss of reputation and all interest, penalties and legal and other professional costs and expenses) suffered or incurred by the Council arising out of or in connection with:
  - (a) The performance, defective performance or otherwise of this Agreement by the Contractor or the Contractor Personnel
  - (b) Any claim made against the Council for actual or alleged infringement of a third party's Intellectual Property Rights arising out of, or in connection with the provision of the Services
  - (c) Any claim made against the Council by a third party arising out of, or in connection with, the supply of the Services, to the extent that such claim arises out of the breach, negligent performance or failure or delay in performance of this Agreement by the Contractor or the Contractor

Personnel; and

- (d) Any claim made against the Council by a third party for death, personal injury or damage to property arising out of, or in connection with the delivery of the Services and performance of this Agreement to the extent that the defective performance is attributable to the acts or omissions of the Contractor or the Contractor Personnel
- 7.2 The Council shall indemnify the Contractor against all reasonable claims, costs and expenses which the Contractor may incur and which arise, directly from the Council's breach of any of its obligations under this Agreement.
- **7.3** Nothing in this Agreement shall limit or exclude the liability of either Party for:
  - (a) death or personal injury resulting from negligence; or
  - (b) fraud or fraudulent misrepresentation; or
  - (c) the indemnities given in this clause 7

# 8. Fee rates based on time spent NOT USED

## 9. Payment

- 9.1 Payment of the Fee(s) shall be made by the Council to the Contractor [within 30 days of receipt of an undisputed invoice] or [within 30 days of the Expiry Date] or [on acceptance by the Council of the Services] monthly/quarterly in arrears<sup>4</sup> In the event of late payment, interest thereon shall be charged at the prevailing statutory rate further to the Late Payment of Commercial Debts (Interest) Act 1998. Such interest shall accrue on a daily basis from the due date until actual payment of the overdue amount, whether before or after Judgment.
- **9.2** The Contractor shall not be entitled to vary the Fee(s) during the existence of this Agreement unless with the prior written consent of the Council.
- 9.3 The Contractor shall not charge, and the Council shall not be liable, for any expenses, charges, costs, fees except the Fee(s) as set out in this Agreement

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- **9.4** All amounts stated are exclusive of VAT which will be charged in addition at the rate in force at the time the Council is required to make payment
- 9.5 Unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Council, the Contractor will pay any of its appointed sub-contractors within the time period specified in the Sub-Contract but in any event no later than 30 days from receipt of an undisputed invoice.

# 10. The Council's Obligations

To enable the Contractor to perform its obligations under this Agreement the Council shall:

- 10.1 Co-operate with the Contractor and ensure that the Council's staff and agents co-operate with and assist the Contractor as is reasonable and appropriate
- **10.2** Provide the Contractor with any information reasonably required by the Contractor:
- **10.3** Comply with such other requirements as may be otherwise agreed between the parties.
- **10.4** NOT USED
- 10.5 Save as provided in this Agreement, no representations, warranties or conditions are given or assumed by the Council in respect of any information which is provided to the Contractor by the Council and any such representations, warranties or conditions are excluded, save to the extent that such exclusion is prohibited by law.

## 11. Authorised Officer and Contractor Representative:

- 11.1 The Authorised Officer shall be appointed by the Council to act in the name of the Council for the purposes of the contract evidenced by this Agreement.
- 11.2 The Contractor shall appoint a Contractor Representative to act in the name of the Contractor for the purposes of the contract evidenced by this Agreement
- 11.3 The Parties shall notify each other in writing of any replacement
  Authorised Officer or Contractor Representative or if any person ceases
  to be either the Authorised Officer or Contractor Representative.
- **11.4** The Authorised Officer shall monitor on behalf of the Council, the provision

of the Services supplied by the Contractor and act as liaison officer with the Contractor's Representative in respect of the operation of the Services. Any issues raised by the Authorised Officer with regard to the delivery of the Services shall in the first instance be addressed and dealt with by the Contractor's Representative on the Contractor's behalf.

# 12. Intellectual Property

- 12.1 In the absence of prior written agreement by the Council to the contrary, all Intellectual Property created by the Contractor or any employee, agent or subcontractor of the Contractor:
  - **12.1.1** in the course of performing the Services; or
  - **12.1.2** exclusively for the purpose of performing the Services, shall vest in the Council on creation.
- 12.2 Unless stated expressly in writing in this Agreement, neither Party will acquire any ownership interest in or licence of the other's Intellectual Property by virtue of this Agreement
- 12.3 The Contractor shall indemnify the Council against all claims, demands, actions, costs, expenses (including legal costs and disbursements on a solicitor and client basis), losses and damages arising from or incurred by reason of any infringement or alleged infringement (including the defence of such alleged infringement) of any Intellectual Property Right by the availability of the Services, except to the extent that they have been caused by or contributed to by the Council's acts or omissions.
- **12.4** This provision shall survive the expiration or termination of the Agreement.

# 13. Confidentiality

- **13.1** Subject to clause 13.2, the Parties shall keep confidential all matters relating to this Agreement and each Party shall use all reasonable endeavours to prevent their respective staff and Contractor Personnel from making any disclosure to any person of any matters relating hereto.
- **13.2** Clause 13.1 shall not apply to any disclosure of information:

- **13.2.1** required by any applicable law, provided that clause 23.1 shall apply to any disclosures required under the FOIA or the Environment Information Regulations;
- **13.2.2** that is reasonably required by persons engaged by a Party in the performance of such Party's obligations under this agreement;
- **13.2.3** where a Party can demonstrate that such information is already generally available and in the public domain otherwise than as a result of a breach of clause 13.1;
- **13.2.4** by the Council of any document to which it is a Party and which the Parties to this agreement have agreed contains no commercially sensitive information;
- **13.2.5** to enable a determination to be made under clause 31 (Disputes);
- **13.2.6** which is already lawfully in the possession of the receiving party, prior to its disclosure by the disclosing party;
- **13.2.7** by the Council to any other department, office or agency of the Government; and
- **13.2.8** by the Council relating to this Agreement and in respect of which the Contractor has given its prior written consent to disclosure.
- 13.3 On or before the Expiry Date the Contractor shall ensure that all documents and/or computer records in its possession, custody or control which relate to personal information of the Council's employees, rate-payers or service users, are delivered up to the Council or securely destroyed.
- **13.4** The provisions of this Clause shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

## 14. Agreement and Transparency

14.1 Further to the Local Government Transparency Code 2015 the Council is obliged to publish details of expenditure exceeding £500. The Parties acknowledge that, except for any information which is exempt from disclosure in accordance with the provisions of the FOIA, the content of this Agreement and any associated tender documentation provided by the Contractor (the Tender Submission) is not Confidential Information. The Council shall be responsible for determining in its absolute discretion

- whether any of the content of the Agreement or the Tender Submission is exempt from disclosure in accordance with the provisions of the FOIA.
- 14.2 Notwithstanding any other term of this Agreement, the Contractor hereby gives his consent for the Council to publish this Agreement and the Tender Submission in its entirety, including from time to time agreed changes to the Agreement, to the general public.
- **14.3** The Council may consult with the Contractor to inform its decision regarding any exemptions but the Council shall have the final decision in its absolute discretion.
- **14.4** The Contractor shall assist and cooperate with the Council to enable the Council to publish this Agreement and the Tender Submission.

# 15 <u>Data Protection</u>

- 15.1 The Contractor shall (and shall procure that any of its Contractor's Personnel involved in the provision of the agreement shall) comply with any notification requirements under the Data Protection Act 1998 (DPA) and the Data Protection Legislation and both Parties shall duly observe all their obligations under the DPA and Data Protection Legislation, which arise in connection with this Agreement.
- 15.2 Notwithstanding the general obligation in clause 15.1, where the Contractor is processing Personal Data as a Data Processor for the Council, the Contractor shall ensure that it has in place appropriate technical and contractual measures to ensure the security of the Personal Data (and to guard against unauthorised or unlawful processing of the Personal Data and against accidental loss or destruction of, or damage to, the Personal Data), as required under the Seventh Data Protection Principle in Schedule 1 to the DPA and to enable the Council to comply with its obligations under Article 32 of the GDPR and will at all times indemnify fully the Council from and/or against any cause or action which may be brought against the Council consequent to any breach or non-observance by the Contractor, its agents and servants; and
  - **15.2.1** provide the Council with such information as the Council may reasonably require to satisfy itself that the Contractor is complying

- with its obligations under the DPA and the Data Protection Legislation;
- 15.2.2 notify the Council of any actual or potential Personal Data Breach within twenty-four (24) hours of its becoming aware of its occurrence (or, in the case of a potential breach, the Contractor becoming aware of such breach), along with all supporting facts and information sufficient to allow the Council to make any required report(s) to any relevant Data Subjects, the Information Commissioner or other regulatory or governmental body or bodies to which it is subject; and
- 15.2.3 ensure it does not knowingly or negligently do or omit to do anything which places the Council in breach of the Council's obligations under the DPA and the Data Protection Legislation.
- 15.3 The Contractor shall not store, copy, disclose, or use the Council Data except as necessary for the performance by the Contractor of its obligations under this Agreement or as otherwise expressly authorised in writing by the Council and in particular the Contractor shall not store any Council Data, which the Council has notified the Contractor requires storage in an encrypted format, on any portable device or media unless that device is encrypted.
- 15.4 To the extent that Council Data is held and/or processed by the Contractor, the Contractor shall supply that Council Data to the Council as requested by the Council in any format specified in this Agreement or if none specified in any format reasonably requested by the Council.
- 15.5 The provisions of this clause shall apply during the continuance of this Agreement and indefinitely after its expiry or termination.

## 16. Protection of Personal Data

- **16.1** With respect to the parties' rights and obligations under this Agreement, the parties agree that the Council is the Data Controller and that the Contractor is the Data Processor.
- **16.2** The Contractor shall:

- 16.2.1 Process the Personal Data only in accordance with instructions from the Council (which may be specific instructions or instructions of a general nature as set out in this Agreement or as otherwise notified by the Council to the Contractor during the term of this Agreement);
- 16.2.2 Process the Personal Data only to the extent, and in such manner, as is necessary for the provision of the Services or as is required by law or any Regulatory Body;
- 16.2.3 implement appropriate technical and organisational measures, including but not limited to ensuring that Personal Data is not stored on any portable equipment or storage device or media unless encrypted, to protect the Personal Data against unauthorised or unlawful processing and against accidental loss, destruction, damage, alteration or disclosure. These measures shall be appropriate to the harm which might result from any unauthorised or unlawful Processing, accidental loss, destruction or damage to the Personal Data and having regard to the nature of the Personal Data which is to be protected;
- **16.2.4** take reasonable steps to ensure the reliability of any Contractor Personnel who have access to the Personal Data;
- 16.2.5 obtain prior written consent from the Council in order to transfer the Personal Data to any Sub-contractors or Affiliates for the provision of the Services;
- 16.2.6 ensure that all Contractor Personnel required to access the

  Personal Data are informed of the confidential nature of
  the Personal Data and comply with the obligations set out in this
  Protection of Personal Data clause;
- 16.2.7 ensure that no Contractor Personnel publish, disclose or divulge any of the Personal Data to any third party unless directed in writing to do so by the Council;
- **16.2.8** notify the Council (within five Working Days) if it receives:
  - a) a request from a Data Subject to have access to that person's Personal Data; or

- b) a complaint or request relating to the Council's obligations under the Data Protection Legislation;
- **16.2.9** provide the Council with full cooperation and assistance in relation to any complaint or request made, including by:
  - a) providing the Council with full details of the complaint or request;
  - b) complying with a data access request within the relevant timescales set out in the Data Protection Legislation and in accordance with the Council's instructions:
  - c) providing the Council with any Personal Data it holds in relation to a Data Subject (within the timescales required by the Council); and
  - d) providing the Council with any information requested by the Council:
- 16.2.10 permit the Council or the Council Representative (subject to reasonable and appropriate confidentiality undertakings), to inspect and audit, in accordance with the Audit clause, the Contractor's data Processing activities (and/or those of its agents, subsidiaries and Sub-contractors) and comply with all reasonable requests or directions by the Council to enable the Council to verify and/or procure that the Contractor is in full compliance with its obligations under this Agreement;
- 16.2.11 provide a written description of the technical and organisational methods employed by the Contractor for processing Personal Data (within the timescales required by the Council); and
- **16.2.12**not process Personal Data outside the United Kingdom without the prior written consent of the Council and, where the Council consents to a transfer, to comply with:
  - a) the obligations of a Data Controller under the Eighth Data Protection Principle set out in Schedule 1 of the Data Protection Act 1998 by providing an adequate level of protection to any Personal Data that is transferred; and
  - b) any reasonable instructions notified to it by the Council

- 16.2.13The Contractor shall comply at all times with the Data Protection Legislation and shall not perform its obligations under this Agreement in such a way as to cause the Council to breach any of its applicable obligations under the Data Protection Legislation.
- **16.2.14**The Contractor shall ensure that its employees and agents are aware of and comply with this clause and shall indemnify the Council against any loss or damage sustained or incurred as a result of any breach of this clause.

#### 17. IMPLEMENTATION OF THE GENERAL DATA PROTECTION REGULATION

- 17.1 With effect from 25th May 2018 clause 18 and the definitions set out therein shall become an operative clause within this Agreement.
- 17.2 After the 25th May 2018, where there is any conflict, ambiguity or inconsistency between clause 18 below (including any associated definitions) and the remainder of this Agreement, clause 18 shall take precedence.

#### 18. DATA PROTECTION

- 18.1 In interpreting this clause the words and expressions set out below shall have the following meanings and any other words and expressions used are as defined elsewhere in this Agreement:
  - (a) Data Protection Legislation: (i) the General Data Protection Regulation ((EU) 2016/679) for as long as it is directly applicable in the UK and any national implementing laws, regulations and secondary legislation, as amended or updated from time to time, in the UK; (ii) any successor legislation to the GDPR or the Data Protection Act 1998; (iii) all applicable Law about the processing of personal data and privacy.
  - (b) Controller, Processor, Data Subject, Personal Data, Personal Data Breach, Data Protection Officer shall have the meaning given in the GDPR;
  - (c) Data Loss Event: any event that results, or may result, in unauthorised access to, or unauthorised or unlawful processing of, Personal Data held by the Contractor under this Agreement, and/or actual or potential loss and/or damage to or destruction of Personal Data in breach of this Agreement, including any Personal Data Breach;

- (d) Data Subject Access Request: a request made by, or on behalf of, a Data Subject in accordance with rights granted pursuant to the Data Protection Legislation to access their Personal Data.
- (e) Law: means any law, subordinate legislation within the meaning of Section 21(1) of the Interpretation Act 1978, bye-law, enforceable right within the meaning of Section 2 of the European Communities Act 1972, regulation, order, regulatory policy, mandatory guidance or code of practice, judgment of a relevant court of law, or directives or requirements with which the Contractor is bound to comply;
- (f) Protective Measures: appropriate technical and organisational measures which may include: pseudonymising and encrypting Personal Data, ensuring confidentiality, integrity, availability and resilience of systems and services, ensuring that availability of and access to Personal Data can be restored in a timely manner after an incident, and regularly assessing and evaluating the effectiveness of the such measures adopted by it;
- **(g) Sub-processor**: any third party appointed to process Personal Data on behalf of the Contractor related to this Agreement.
- 18.2 Both parties will comply with all applicable requirements of the Data Protection Legislation and agree to take account of any guidance issued by the Information Commissioner's Office. This clause 18 is in addition to, and does not relieve, remove or replace, a party's obligations under the Data Protection Legislation.
- 18.3 The parties acknowledge that for the purposes of the Data Protection Legislation, the Council is the Controller and the Contractor is the Processor. The only processing that the Contractor is authorised to do is as set out in this agreement which includes Schedule 3 sets out the scope, nature and purpose of processing by the Contractor, the duration of the processing and the types of Personal Data and categories of Data Subject.
- 18.4 The Contractor shall notify the Council immediately if it considers that any of the Council's instructions infringe the Data Protection Legislation.
- 18.5 Without prejudice to the generality of clause 18.2, the Contractor shall, in relation to any Personal Data processed in connection with the performance by the Contractor of its obligations under this agreement:
  - (a) process that Personal Data only in accordance with Schedule 3 or otherwise on the written instructions of the Council unless the Contractor is required to do otherwise by Law. If it is so required the Contractor shall promptly notify the Council before processing the Personal Data prohibited by Law;

- (b) ensure that it has in place Protective Measures, reviewed and approved by the Council as appropriate, to protect against a Data Loss Event having taken account of the:
  - (i) the nature of the data to be protected;
  - (ii) the harm that might result from a Data Loss Event;
  - (iii) the state of technological development; and
  - (iv) the cost of implementing any Protective Measures;
- (c) take reasonable steps to ensure the reliability and integrity of any Contractor Personnel who have access to the Personal Data;
- (d) ensure that all personnel who have access to and/or process Personal Data:
  - (i) do not process Personal Data except in accordance with this Agreement;
  - (ii) are informed of the confidential nature of the Personal Data and do not publish, disclose or divulge any of the Personal Data to any third Party unless directed in writing to do so by the Council or as otherwise permitted by this Agreement;
  - (iii) are obliged to keep the Personal Data confidential; and
  - (iv) have undergone adequate training in the use, care, protection and handling of Personal Data;
- (e) not transfer any Personal Data outside of the European Union unless the prior written consent of the Council has been obtained and the following conditions are fulfilled:
  - the Council or the Contractor has provided appropriate safeguards in relation to the transfer as determined by the Council;
  - (ii) the Data Subject has enforceable rights and effective legal remedies;
  - (iii) the Contractor complies with its obligations under the Data Protection Legislation by providing an adequate level of protection to any Personal Data that is transferred; and
  - (v) the Contractor complies with reasonable instructions notified to it in advance by the Council with respect to the processing of the Personal Data;
- (f) at the written direction of the Council, delete or return Personal Data and copies thereof to the Council on termination of the agreement unless required by Law to retain the Personal Data; and

- (g) maintain complete and accurate records and information to demonstrate its compliance with this clause 18 and allow for audits by the Council or the Council's designated auditor.
- 18.6 The Contractor shall notify the Council immediately if it:
  - (a) receives a Data Subject Access Request (or purported Data Subject Access Request);
  - (b) receives any other request, complaint or communication relating to either Party's obligations under the Data Protection Legislation;
  - (c) receives any communication from the Information Commissioner or any other regulatory authority in connection with Personal Data processed under this Agreement;
  - receives a request from any third party for disclosure of Personal Data where compliance with such request is required or purported to be required by Law; or
  - (e) becomes aware of a Data Loss Event.
- 18.7 Taking into account the nature of the processing, the Contractor shall provide the Council with full assistance in relation to either Party's obligations under Data Protection Legislation and any complaint, communication or request made under clause number(18.6 herein) (and insofar as possible within the timescales reasonably required by the Council) including by promptly providing:
  - (a) the Council with full details and copies of the complaint, communication or request;
  - (b) such assistance as is reasonably requested by the Council to enable the Council to comply with a Data Subject Access Request within the relevant timescales set out in the Data Protection Legislation;
  - (c) the Council, at its request, with any Personal Data it holds in relation to a Data Subject;
  - (d) assistance as requested by the Council following any Data Loss Event;
  - (e) assistance as requested by the Council with respect to any request from the Information Commissioner's Office, or any consultation by the Council with the Information Commissioner's Office.
- 18.8 The Contractor shall maintain complete and accurate records and information to demonstrate its compliance with this clause. This requirement does not apply where the Contractor employs fewer than 250 staff, unless:
  - (a) the Council determines that the processing is not occasional;

- (b) the Council determines the processing includes special categories of data as referred to in Article 9(1) of the GDPR or Personal Data relating to criminal convictions and offences referred to in Article 10 of the GDPR; and
- (c) the Council determines that the processing is likely to result in a risk to the rights and freedoms of Data Subjects.
- 18.9 The Contractor shall allow for audits of its Data Processing activity by the Council or the Council's designated auditor.
- 18.10 The Contractor shall designate a data protection officer if required by the Data Protection Legislation.
- 18.11 Before allowing any Sub-processor to process any Personal Data related to this Agreement, the Contractor must:
  - (a) notify the Council in writing of the intended Sub-processor and processing;
  - (b) obtain the written consent of the Council;
  - (c) enter into a written agreement with the Sub-processor which give effect to the terms set out in this clause 18 such that they apply to the Sub-processor; and
  - (d) provide the Council with such information regarding the Sub-processor as the Council may reasonably require.
- 18.12 The Contractor shall remain fully liable for all acts or omissions of any Sub-processor.
- 18.13 Either party may, at any time on not less than 30 days' notice, revise this clause by replacing it with any applicable controller to processor standard clauses or similar terms forming party of an applicable certification scheme (which shall apply when replaced by attachment to this Agreement) or to ensure that it complies with any guidance issued by the Information Commissioner's Office.

# 19. Council Data and Personal Information Audit

- **19.1** Except where an audit is imposed on the Council by a Regulatory body, the Council may, acting reasonably, conduct an audit for the following purposes:
  - **19.1.1** to review the integrity, confidentiality and security of the Council Data;
  - **19.1.2** to review the Contractor's compliance with the Data Protection Act 1998, the Freedom of Information Act 2000 in accordance with the

- Protection of Personal Data and Freedom of Information clauses and any other legislation applicable to the Services;
- **19.2** The Council shall use its reasonable endeavours to ensure that the conduct of each audit does not unreasonably disrupt the Contractor or delay the provision of the Services.
- 19.3 Subject to the Council's obligations of confidentiality, the Contractor shall on demand provide the Council (and/or its agents or representatives) with all reasonable co-operation and assistance in relation to each audit, including:
  - **19.3.1** all information requested by the Council within the permitted scope of the audit;
  - **19.3.2** reasonable access to any Sites controlled by the Contractor and to any equipment used (whether exclusively or non-exclusively) in the performance of the Services;
  - 19.3.3 access to Contractor Personnel
- **19.4** The Contractor shall implement all measurement and monitoring tools and procedures necessary to measure and report on the Contractor's performance of the Services.
- **19.5** The Council shall endeavour to (but is not obliged to) provide at least 5 Working Days notice of its intention to conduct an audit.
- **19.6** The Parties agree that they shall bear their own respective costs and expenses incurred in respect of compliance with their obligations under this clause.
- 19.7 This clause shall not apply to any audit or inspection regarding the provision of the Services specified in the Service Specification or elsewhere in this Agreement which may be conducted as specified in this Agreement.

# 20. <u>Assignment, Transfer and Sub-contracting</u>

20.1 Neither Party shall be entitled to assign, novate or otherwise dispose of any or all of its rights and obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other Party PROVIDED that the Council may,

- (a) assign any of its rights under this Agreement; or
- (b) transfer all of its rights or obligations by novation, to another person.
- without the Contractor's consent where such assignment, transfer or novation is to an Associated Person of the Council;
- **20.2** Any consent required under Clause 20.1 must not be unreasonably withheld or delayed and if not expressly refused within five Working Days shall be deemed given.
- 20.3 The Contractor will not, without the written consent of the Council, subcontract its right or obligations under this Agreement nor allow Services to be provided other than through the Contractor Personnel and using its own equipment.
- 20.4 In the event that consent is given by either Party to the other Party to the placing of sub-contracts, copies of each sub-contract and order shall be sent by the sub-contracting Party to the consenting Party immediately it is issued
- 20.5 Subject to clause 20.1, in the event that either Party wishes to assign its rights and obligations under this Agreement, the assignor must obtain a written undertaking from the assignee to the consenting Party that it will be bound by the obligations of the assignor under this Agreement.
- 20.6 Notwithstanding the Contractor's right to sub-contract pursuant to this clause 20, the Contractor shall remain responsible for all acts and omissions of its Sub-contractors and the acts and omissions of those employed or engaged by the Sub-Contractors as if they were its own and shall be responsible for the work of the Sub-Contractor whose work shall be undertaken to the same standard as stated in the Specification.

# 21. Public Interest Disclosure ('Whistleblowing')

The Contractor will ensure that his employees and agents are made aware of the Council's policy "Speaking Up About Wrongdoing" and that the details of this policy are fully explained to them and shall provide the Council with evidence of doing so upon request.

# 22. Publicity

The Contractor will not make any press or other release or public announcement

in relation to this Agreement without the prior approval of the Council

## 23. Prevention of Bribery

#### **23.1** The Contractor:

- a) shall not, and shall procure that all Contractor Personnel shall not, in connection with this Agreement commit a Prohibited Act;
- b) warrants, represents and undertakes that it is not aware of any financial or other advantage being given to any person working for or engaged by the Council, or that an agreement has been reached to that effect, in connection with the execution of this Agreement, excluding any arrangement of which full details have been disclosed in writing to the Council before execution of this Agreement.

#### 23.2 The Contractor shall:

- a) if requested, provide the Council with any reasonable assistance, at the Council's reasonable cost, to enable the Council to perform any activity required by any relevant government or agency in any relevant jurisdiction for the purpose of compliance with the Bribery Act;
- b) the Contractor shall, within 10 Working Days of a request from the Council, certify to the Council in writing (such certification to be signed by an officer of the Contractor) the Contractor's compliance with this clause 23 and provide such supporting evidence of compliance with this clause 23 by the Contractor as the Council may reasonably request.
- **23.3** If any breach of clause 23.1 is suspected or known, the Contractor must notify the Council immediately.
- 23.4 If the Contractor notifies the Council that it suspects or knows that there may be a breach of clause 23.1, the Contractor must respond promptly to the Council's enquiries, co-operate with any investigation, and allow the Council to audit books, records and any other relevant documentation. This obligation shall continue for two years following the expiry or termination of this Agreement.
- 23.5 The Council may terminate this Agreement by written notice with immediate effect, and recover from the Contractor the amount of any loss directly resulting from the cancellation, if the Contractor or Contractor Personnel (in all cases whether or not acting with the Contractor's

knowledge) breaches clause 23.1. At the Council's absolute discretion, in determining whether to exercise the right of termination under this clause 23.5, the Council shall give consideration, where appropriate, to action other than termination of this Agreement unless the Prohibited Act is committed by the Contractor or a senior officer of the Contractor or by an employee, Sub-Contractor or supplier not acting independently of the Contractor. The expression "not acting independently of" (when used in relation to the Contractor or a Sub-Contractor) means and shall be construed as acting:

- a) with the Council; or,
- with the actual knowledge;
   of any one or more of the directors of the Contractor or the Sub-Contractor (as the case may be); or
- c) in circumstances where any one or more of the directors of the Contractor ought reasonably to have had knowledge.
- 23.6 Any notice of termination under clause 23.5 must specify:
  - a) the nature of the Prohibited Act;
  - b) the identity of the party whom the Council believes has committed the Prohibited Act; and
  - c) the date on which this Agreement will terminate.
- 23.7 Despite clause 33 (Disputes), any dispute relating to:
  - a) the interpretation of this clause 23; or
  - b) the amount or value of any gift, consideration or commission, shall be determined by the Council and its decision shall be final and conclusive.
- 23.8 Any termination under clause 23.5 will be without prejudice to any right or remedy which has already accrued or subsequently accrues to the Council.

# 24. Warranties, liability and indemnities

The Contractor warrants, represents and undertakes that:

- **24.1** it will carry out the work by the Expiry Date
- 24.2 it will perform the Services with all due skill and diligence and in a good

- and workmanlike manner, and in accordance with the Best Practice within the industry of the Contractor and will have adequate numbers of Contractor Personnel to provide the Service
- 24.3 its Contractor Personnel will have the necessary skill, professional qualifications and experience to deliver the Services in accordance with the Specification and Best Practice
- 24.4 NOT USED
- **24.5** it has full capacity and authority to enter into this Agreement
- **24.6** it has obtained all necessary and required licences, consents and permits to provide the Services
- 24.7 it shall be responsible for all costs, fees, expenses and charges for training necessary or required for the Contractor Personnel to perform the Services
- **24.8** NOT USED
- **24.9** The Contractor shall where appropriate take account of the Human Rights Act 1998 and shall not do anything in breach of it.
- **24.10** The Contractor will at all times in providing the Services to the Council comply with the provisions of the Health and Safety at work Act 1974 and provide evidence of doing so to the Council at any time upon request and:
  - **24.10.1** The Contractor shall promptly notify the Council of any health and safety hazards which may arise in connection with the performance of this Agreement.
  - **24.10.2** NOT USED
  - **24.10.3** NOT USED
  - **24.10.4** The Contractor shall report all accidents and/or injuries relating to the provision of the Services to the Council immediately.
  - **22.10.5** The Contractor shall ensure that its health and safety policy statement (as required by the Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974) is made available to the Council upon request.
- **24.11** The Contractor warrants that none of its current Directors have been involved in liquidation or receivership or have any criminal convictions.
- **24.12** If the Contractor performs the Services (or any part thereof) negligently or in breach of this Agreement, then if requested by the Council, the

- Contractor will re-perform the Services or relevant part thereof at no additional cost to the Council. The Council's request must be made within 6 months of the Expiry Date or termination of this Agreement
- 24.13 the Contractor warrants that the signing of this Agreement on its behalf has been validly authorised and the obligations expressed as being assumed by the Contractor under this Agreement constitute valid legal and binding obligations of the Contractor enforceable against the Contractor in accordance with their terms.
- 24.14 The Contractor acknowledges and confirms that:
  - 24.14.1 it has had an opportunity to carry out a thorough due diligence exercise in relation to the Services and has asked the Council all the questions it considers to be relevant for the purpose of establishing whether it is able to provide the Services in accordance with the terms of this Agreement;
  - 24.14.2 it has received all information requested by it from the Council pursuant to sub-clause 24.14.1 to enable it to determine whether it is able to provide the Services in accordance with the terms of this Agreement;
  - 24.14.3 it has made and shall make its own enquiries to satisfy itself as to the accuracy and adequacy of any information supplied to it by or on behalf of the Council pursuant to sub-clause 24.14.2;
  - 24.14.4 it has raised all relevant due diligence questions with the Council before the Commencement Date; and
  - 24.14.5 it has entered into this Agreement in reliance on its own diligence
  - as at the Commencement Date, the Contractor warrants and represents that all information contained in the Tender remains true, accurate and not misleading, save as may have been specifically disclosed in writing to the Council prior to execution of the Agreement AND shall promptly notify the Council in writing if it becomes aware during the performance of this Agreement of any inaccuracies in any

information provided to it by the Council during such due diligence which materially and adversely affects its ability to perform the Services

- 24.14.7 The Contractor shall not be entitled to recover any additional costs from the Council which arise from, or be relieved from any of its obligations as a result of, any matters or inaccuracies notified to the Council by the Contractor in accordance with sub-clause 24.14.6 save where such additional costs or adverse effect on performance have been caused by the Contractor having been provided with fundamentally misleading information by or on behalf of the Council and the Contractor could not reasonably have known that the information incorrect or misleading at the time such information was provided.
- 24.15 The Contractor agrees that where requested in writing during the term of this Agreement it will ensure that an appropriately authorised representative of the Contractor shall attend a Committee meeting of the Council upon being invited to do so by the Council
- 24.16 In performing its obligations under this Agreement, the
  Contractor shall and shall ensure that each of its subcontractors shall comply with all applicable anti-slavery and
  human trafficking laws, statutes, regulations and codes from
  time to time in force including but not limited to the Modern
  Slavery Act 2015

# 25. <u>Freedom of Information Act 2000 & Environmental Information</u> Regulations 2004

**25.1** The Contractor acknowledges that the Council is subject to the requirements of the FOIA and the Environmental Information Regulations

- and shall assist and cooperate with the Council to enable the Council to comply with its Information disclosure obligations.
- 25.2 The Contractor shall notify the Council of any Commercially Sensitive Information provided to the Council together with details of the reasons for its sensitivity and the Contractor acknowledges that any lists or schedules of Commercially Sensitive Information so provided are of indicative value only and that the Council may be obliged to disclose such information.
- **25.3** The Contractor shall and shall procure that its Sub-contractors shall:
  - **25.3.1** transfer to the Council all Requests for Information that it receives as soon as practicable and in any event within two Working Days of receiving a Request for Information;
  - 25.3.2 provide the Council, at the Contractor's expense, with a copy of all Information in its possession, or power in the form that the Council requires within five Working Days (or such other period as the Council may specify) of the Council's request; and
  - 25.3.3 provide, at the Contractor's expense, all necessary assistance as reasonably requested by the Council to enable the Council to respond to the Request for Information within the time for compliance set out in section 10 of the FOIA or regulation 5 of the Environmental Information Regulations.
- 25.4 The Council shall be responsible for determining in its absolute discretion and notwithstanding any other provision in this Agreement or any other agreement whether the Commercially Sensitive Information and/or any other Information is exempt from disclosure in accordance with the provisions of the FOIA or the Environmental Information Regulations and in considering any response to a Request for Information the Council may consult with the Contractor prior to making any decision or considering any exemption.
- **25.5** In no event shall the Contractor respond directly to a Request for Information unless expressly authorised to do so by the Council.
- 25.6 The Contractor acknowledges that (notwithstanding the provisions of this Freedom of Information clause) the Council may, acting in accordance with the Department of Constitutional Affairs' Code of Practice on the

Discharge of the Functions of Public Authorities under Part 1 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ("the Code"), be obliged under the FOIA, or the Environmental Information Regulations to disclose information concerning the Contractor or the Services:

- 25.6.1 in certain circumstances without consulting the Contractor; or
- **25.6.2** following consultation with the Contractor and having taken their views into account:

provided always that where sub-clause 25.6.1 above applies the Council shall, in accordance with any recommendations of the Code, take reasonable steps, where appropriate, to give the Contractor advanced notice, or failing that, to draw the disclosure to the Contractor's attention after any such disclosure.

- 25.7 The Contractor shall ensure that all Information required to be produced or maintained under the terms of this Agreement, or by law or professional practice or in relation to the Agreement is retained for disclosure for at least the duration of the Agreement plus one year together with such other time period as required by the Agreement, law or practice and shall permit the Council to inspect such records as requested from time to time.
- 25.8 The Council shall in no event be liable for any loss, damage, harm, or detriment, howsoever caused, arising from or in connection with the reasonable disclosure under FOIA, or any other law, of any information (including Exempt Information) whether relating to this Agreement or otherwise relating to any other party.
- **25.9**<sup>5</sup> Where the Contractor is a Public Body the parties acknowledges that such obligations and duties of the Council as set out above are reciprocal to the Contractor. The Council and the Contractor acknowledge and agree that:
  - 25.9.1 as Public Bodies they are subject to legal duties under the FOIA and EIR which may require either party to disclose on request information relating to this Agreement or otherwise relating to the other party;
  - **25.9.2** they are required by law to consider each and every Request for Information made under FOIA;

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- **25.9.3** that all decisions made by the other pursuant to a request under the FOIA are solely a matter for the Receiving Party and at the discretion of the Receiving Party.
- 25.9.4 Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary (including but without limitation any obligations or confidentiality), the Receiving Party shall be entitled to disclose information in whatever form pursuant to a request made under FOIA, save that in relation to any information that is Exempt Information the Receiving Party shall consult the other party before making any such decision and shall not:
  - (a) confirm or deny that information is held by the other party, or
  - (b) disclose information required to the extent that in the Receiving Party's opinion the information is eligible in the circumstances for an exemption and therefore the Receiving Party may lawfully refrain from doing either of the things described in part (a) and (b) of this clause.
- 25.9.5 each party shall bear its own costs of:
  - a) assessing the application of any exemption under FOIA and/or
  - b) responding to any FOIA notice and/or
  - c) lodging any appeal against a decision of the Information
     Commissioner in relation to disclosure
- 25.9.6 the Receiving Party shall in no circumstances be liable for any loss, damage, harm, or detriment, howsoever caused, arising from or in connection with the reasonable disclosure under FOIA of any Exempt Information or other information whether relating to this Agreement or otherwise relating to the other party.
- **25.9.7** the other party shall assist the Receiving Party with the request as reasonably necessary to enable the Receiving Party to comply with its obligations under FOIA.

## 25. Freedom of Information

The Parties acknowledge their respective duties under the FOIA and EIR and must give all reasonable assistance to each other where appropriate or necessary to comply with such duties.

# 26. Equalities

- 26.1 The Contractor and any Sub-Contractor employed by the Contractor shall not unlawfully discriminate either directly or indirectly on such grounds as race or ethnic origin, disability, gender, sexual orientation, religion or belief, or age
  - a) in the supply and provision of Services under this Agreement, and
  - b) in its employment practices.
- 26.2 Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, the Contractor shall not unlawfully discriminate within the meaning and scope of the Equality Act 2010 (or other relevant legislation, or any statutory modification or reenactment thereof).
- 26.3 In addition, the Contractor and any Sub-Contractor or person(s) employed by or under the control of the Contractor in providing Services to the Council will comply with the general duty imposed on local authorities by Section 149 of the Equality Act 2010 to eliminate discrimination, harassment and victimisation and promote equality of opportunity between persons who share a protected characteristic and those who do not share it and to foster good relations between persons who share a protected characteristic and those who do not share it
- 26.4 The Contractor and any Sub-Contractor will take all reasonable steps to observe as far as possible the Codes of Practice produced by Equality and Human Rights Commission, which give practical guidance to Councils on the elimination of discrimination.
- 26.5 In the event of any finding of unlawful discrimination being made against the Contractor and any Sub-Contractor during the contract period, by any court or employment tribunal, or any adverse finding or formal investigation by the Equality and Human Rights Commission over the same period, the Contractor and any Sub-Contractor shall inform the Council of this finding and shall take appropriate steps to prevent repetition of the unlawful discrimination.
- 26.6 The Contractor and any Sub-Contractor employed by the Contractor will provide a copy of its policies to the Council at any time upon request. In addition, the Council may reasonably request other information from time

to time for the purpose of assessing the Contractor's compliance with the above conditions.

# 27. Non-compliance

- 27.1. If the Council identifies areas of the Services which do not comply with the requirements of this Agreement (including any Schedules to this Agreement) it may send the Contractor a non-compliance notice detailing
  - (i) the areas of non-compliance;
  - (ii) the action to be taken; and
  - (iii) the date by which the action must be taken (which for the avoidance of doubt must not be a date less than 14 days from the date of the notice).
- 27.2 If the Contractor fails to take any or all of the necessary action by the date given in the non-compliance notice, the Council may send the Contractor a final non-compliance notice detailing
  - (i) the areas of non-compliance;
  - (ii) the action to be taken; and

or

- (iii) the date by which action must be taken (which for the avoidance of doubt must not be a date less than 14 days from the date of the notice).
- 27.3 If, in the reasonable opinion of the Council, the Contractor fails to undertake all of the remedial actions in the final non-compliance notice by the due date this may be considered a material breach of this Agreement and the Council shall be entitled to take either of the following steps depending on the seriousness of the non-compliance (which in the event of dispute shall be determined in accordance with clause 33 (Disputes):
  - (a) to make arrangements to take its own corrective action either itself or through the appointment of another Contractor and to either:
    - (i) deduct all costs in connection therewith from any sums due or to become due to the Contractor under the terms of this Agreement;
  - (ii) to recover such sums from the Contractor as a debt; And/or
  - (b) to terminate the Agreement in accordance with clause 35 Termination

## 28. Waiver

The failure by either Party to enforce at any time or for any period any one or more of the terms and conditions herein shall not be a waiver of them or of the right at any time subsequently to enforce all the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

## 29. Sustainability

The Contractor will at all times use its best endeavours to assist the Council and operate themselves in a manner which meets the aims and objectives set out in the sustainable policies of the Council, copies of which are available on the Council's website

# 30. Audit And Monitoring

The Contractor will allow access for the Council and its officers to all relevant information for the purposes of audit and the monitoring of this Agreement.

# 31. <u>Safeguarding</u>

- **31.1** Where the Service or activity being undertaken in this Agreement is a Regulated Activity the Contractor shall :
  - (a) ensure that all individuals engaged in the provision of the Service or activity, and prior to commencing the provision of the service or activity, are subject to a valid enhanced disclosure check undertaken through the Disclosure and Barring Service including a check against the adults' barred list or the children's barred list, as appropriate; and
  - (b) monitor the level and validity of the checks under this clause 29.1 for each member of the Contractor's Personnel.
- 31.2 The Contractor warrants that at all times for the purposes of this Agreement it has no reason to believe that any person who is or will be employed or engaged by the Contractor in the provision of a Service or activity that is a Regulated Activity is barred from the activity in accordance with the provisions of the Safeguarding Vulnerable Groups Act 2006 and any regulations made thereunder, as amended from time to time.

- 31.3 The Contractor shall immediately notify the Council of any information that it reasonably requests to enable it to be satisfied that the obligations of this clause 28 have been met.
- 31.4 The Contractor shall refer information about any person carrying out the Services or the activity to the Disclosure and Barring Service where it removes permission for such person to carry out the Services or activity (or would have, if such person had not otherwise ceased to carry out the Services or the activity) because, in its opinion, such person has harmed or poses a risk of harm to the Service users, children or vulnerable adults.
- 31.5 The Contractor shall not employ or use the services of any person who is barred from, or whose previous conduct or records indicate that he or she would not be suitable to carry out Regulated Activity or who may otherwise present a risk to Service users.
- 31.6 Where the service requirement or specification specifies that the Service or activity to be provided under this Agreement involves a Regulated Activity, or the Council otherwise notifies the Contractor, acting reasonably, that the Contractor's Personnel are required to be subject to a Disclosure and Barring Service check, the Contractor shall comply with clause 28.1 above..
- 31.7 The Contractor shall in addition comply with clause 4.9.4 above

## 32. Complaints Procedure

- 32.1 The Contactor shall operate a complaints procedure in respect of any services or works provided under this Agreement to deal with any complaint received about the standard of services or the manner in which any services have been supplied or work has been performed or any other matter connected with the performance of the Contractor's obligations under this Agreement ("the Complaints Procedure"). For the avoidance of doubt any complaint or issue that the Council has in respect of the Contractor's performance of this Agreement shall be dealt with in accordance with the remainder of this Agreement.
- 32.2 The Contractor's Complaints Procedure shall comply with applicable Law and the requirements of any regulatory body to which the Contractor is subject or which are applicable to the service being provided (including

any change in such requirements) and shall meet the following minimum standards:

- 32.2.1 is easy for complainants to access and understand
- **32.2.2** clearly sets out time limits for responding to complaints and keeping the complainant and the Council informed of progress;
- **32.2.3** provides confidential record keeping to protect employees under this Agreement and the complainant
- **32.2.4** provides information to the Contractor's management so that services can be improved
- **32.2.5** provides effective and suitable remedies
- **32.2.6** is regularly monitored and audited and which takes account of complainant and Council feedback
- 32.3 The Contractor shall inform any users of the services or works provided under this Agreement of the existence of the complaints procedure and how to access it and will make its Complaints Procedure available on request.
- **32.4** The Contractor shall investigate and deal with any complaints it receives about the services or works, whether direct from the public or services users, or referred to it by the Council, in accordance with its published complaints procedure.
- 32.5 The Contactor shall ensure that:
  - **32.5.1** it promptly, and within a maximum of 10 days of receiving the complaint, notifies the complainant that the Contractor is dealing with the complaint
  - **32.5.2** under no circumstances is a complaint investigated by a member of its staff employed under this contract who may be part of the complaint.
  - **32.5.3** someone who is independent of the matter complained of carries out the investigation
  - 32.5.4 the complainant is made aware that they are entitled to have the complaint investigated by the Council if they are not satisfied with either the process of investigation or finding of the Contactor's investigations

- 32.5.5 it deals with the complaint fully, expeditiously and fairly and shall use its reasonable endeavours to resolve the complaint within 60 Working Days of receiving the complaint
- **32.5.6** where a complaint is received by the Contractor relating to the policy or decisions of the Council rather than the Contractor's delivery of its obligations under this Agreement, the Contractor shall promptly, and within two Working Days, refer the complaint to the Council for investigation.
- 32.6 The Contactor shall ensure that all its employees and persons employed under this Agreement are made aware of its Complaints Procedure and shall designate one employee (who shall be identified to the Council) to whom a complaint may be referred should the complainant not be satisfied with the initial response to their complaint
- 32.7 The Contactor shall keep accurate and complete written records of all complaints received and the responses to them and shall make these records available to the Council within 5 Working Days of being requested or at 12 monthly intervals in any event.
- **32.8** Where the Council is investigating a complaint the Contactor is required to participate fully in all investigations within the timescales requested by the Council.
- 32.9 The Contractor should note that if a complaint is made to the Council by a third party relating to the services or works provided, the Local Government Ombudsman has the power to investigate such a complaint and the Council requires the Contractor to fully to co-operate in such investigation. If the Council is found guilty of maladministration or injustice by the Local Government Ombudsman because of the act or default of the Contractor the Contractor shall indemnify the Council in respect of the costs arising from such maladministration or injustice.

## 33. Disputes

33.1 If any dispute or difference shall arise between the parties as to the construction of this Agreement or any matter or thing of whatever nature arising under this Agreement or in connection with it then the same shall be dealt with as follows:-

- **33.1.1** In the first instance a special meeting of both the Parties shall be arranged on 14 days written notice to the other party and the matter shall be discussed and the representatives shall use their reasonable endeavours to resolve the dispute
- 33.1.2 If the dispute cannot be resolved in accordance with the preceding sub-clause then either one of the Parties may serve the Council's Director of Operations and the Contractor or other authorised officer whose details have been notified to the Council, with notice of the dispute and those officers shall then appoint their representative to adjudicate and use their reasonable endeavours to resolve the dispute within 21 days of receipt of such notice
- 33.1.3 If the dispute cannot be resolved in accordance with the preceding sub-clause then it shall be referred to a single arbitrator to be agreed between the Parties and failing such agreement within 14 days of the request of one Party to the other in writing that the matter be referred to arbitration such reference shall be to a single arbitrator appointed for that purpose on the written request of either Party by the President for the time being of the Law Society of England and Wales and any reference to arbitration under this clause shall be deemed to be a reference to arbitration within the meaning of the relevant Arbitration Acts and it is further agreed that if any matter is referred to arbitration then each Party will bear its own costs of such referral

# 34. Force Majeure

- 34.1 Neither the Council nor the Contractor shall be in breach of this Agreement nor liable for any failure or delay in performing their obligations under this Agreement where it is directly caused, arising from or attributable to acts, events, omissions or accidents beyond its reasonable control ("Force Majeure Event"), provided that:-
  - **34.1.1** any delay by a sub-contractor or supplier of the Party who is delayed will not relieve that Party from liability for delay except

- where the delay is beyond the reasonable control of the subcontractor or supplier concerned; and
- **34.1.2** staff or material shortages or strikes or industrial action affecting only the Party who is delayed will not relieve that Party from liability for delay.
- **34.2** If a Party is subject to a Force Majeure Event it shall not be in breach of this Agreement provided that:-
  - **34.2.1** it promptly notified the other Party in writing of the nature and extent of the Force Majeure Event causing its failure or delay in performance; and
  - **34.2.2** it has used its reasonable endeavours to mitigate the effect of the Force Majeure Event, to carry out its obligations under this Agreement in any way that is reasonably practicable and to resume the performance of its obligations as soon as reasonably possible
  - in which case the performance of that Party's obligations will be suspended during the period that those circumstances persist and that Party will be granted a reasonable extension of time for performance up to a maximum equivalent to the period of the delay.
- 34.3 Save where that delay is caused by the act or failure to act of the other Party (in which event the rights, remedies and liabilities of the Parties will be those conferred by the other terms of this Agreement and by law):-
  - **34.3.1** any costs arising from that delay will be borne by the Party incurring the same; and
  - **34.3.2** either Party may, if that delay continues for more than 5 weeks, terminate this Agreement immediately on giving notice in writing to the other. Such termination shall be without prejudice to the rights of the parties in respect of any breach of this Agreement occurring prior to such termination.

#### 35. Rights of Third Parties

The Parties to this Agreement do not intend that any of its terms will be enforceable by any person not a party to it by virtue of the Contracts (Rights of Third Parties) Act 1999 (or any amendment or re-enactment thereof).

#### 36. Notices

- 36.1 Unless otherwise communicated to the Party in writing any notice to be given by either party to the other may be served by email, fax, personal service or by post to the address of the other party that is the registered office or main place of business of the Contractor or if the Council, the Shirehall, Abbey Foregate, Shrewsbury SY2 6ND
- 36.2 A Notice sent by email shall be deemed to be received providing receipt is acknowledged and confirmed, Notice sent by fax shall be deemed to be served on receipt of an error free transmission report, Notice given by letter shall be deemed to have been served at the time at which the letter was delivered personally or if sent by second class post shall be deemed to have been delivered in the ordinary course of post and if by first class post shall be deemed to have been delivered 48 hours after posting and acknowledged

#### 37. <u>Termination</u>

- **37.1** Either Party may terminate this Agreement by giving to the other Party at least 3 months' notice in writing
- **37.2** Either Party may terminate this Agreement by notice in writing to the other if:
  - 37.2.1 the other Party commits a material breach of this Agreement and, in the case of a breach capable of being remedied, fails to remedy it within 14 calendar days of being given notice in writing setting out the breach and indicating that failure to remedy the breach may result in termination of this Agreement.
  - the other Party commits a series of minor breaches which, when taken together, amount to a material breach;
  - the other Party commits a material breach of this Agreement which cannot be remedied under any circumstances;
  - 37.2.4 The Council may terminate this Agreement forthwith by notice where the Contractor commits a material breach as a result of a failure to comply with a non-compliance notice issued in accordance with clause 27 (Non-Compliance).
  - 37.2.5 the other Party passes a resolution for winding up (other

- than for the purpose of solvent amalgamation or reconstruction), or a court of competent jurisdiction makes an order to that effect;
- 37.2.6 the other Party ceases to carry on its business or substantially the whole of its business; or
- 37.2.7 the other Party is declared insolvent, or convenes a meeting of or makes or proposes to make any arrangement or composition with its creditors; or a liquidator, receiver, administrative receiver, manager, trustee or similar officer is appointed over any of its assets.
- 37.3 This Agreement is contingent upon funding from government and the Council can in no way warrant represent or guarantee the continuation of this funding. In the event that the government withdraws funding the Council may terminate this Agreement in whole or in part by serving reasonable written notice on the Contractor
- **37.4** Where notice to terminate is given pursuant to this clause 35, this Agreement shall terminate with effect on the date specified in the notice

#### 38. Consequences of Termination

- **38.1** Other than as set out in this Agreement, neither Party shall have any further obligations to the other under this Agreement after its termination
- 38.2 Any provision of this Agreement which expressly or by implication is intended to come into or continue in force on or after termination of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect
- **38.3** Termination of this Agreement, for any reason, shall not affect the accrued rights, remedies obligations or liabilities of the Parties existing at termination
- 38.4 Notwithstanding its obligations in this clause 38, if a Party is required by law, regulation, or government or regulatory body to retain any documents or materials containing the other Party's Confidential Information, it shall notify the other Party in writing of such retention, giving details of the documents and/or materials it must retain.
- 38.5 upon termination of this Agreement for any reason, the Contractor shall, at its own cost, deliver, and require that its employees, agents and sub-

contractors deliver, to the Council all information and any other property of the Council which are in the possession or control of the Contractor or the Contractor's employees, agents or Sub-Contractors at the date of termination.

# 39. <u>Transfer of Undertakings (Protection of Employment) Regulations</u> 2006 (TUPE)<sup>6</sup>

The Parties agree that the provisions of Schedule 2 shall apply to any Relevant Transfer of staff under this Agreement

- 40. Staffing Security Not used
- 41. Security Requirements NOT USED
- 42. Governing Law And Jurisdiction

It is the responsibility of the Contractor to comply with all relevant European and English legislation. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with English law and the parties agree to submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English Courts

#### 43. Severance

If any provision of this Agreement prohibited by law or judged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unlawful, void, invalid or unenforceable, the provision shall, to the extent required, be severed from this Agreement and rendered ineffective as far as possible without modifying the remaining provisions of this Agreement and shall not in any way affect any other circumstances of or the validity or enforcement of this Agreement.

#### 44. Parent Company Guarantee<sup>7</sup>

It is a condition of this Agreement that if the Contractor is a subsidiary company then its Ultimate Group/Holding Company must guarantee the performance of this contract and provide a letter to that effect signed by a duly authorised signatory of the Ultimate Group/Holding Company.

#### 45. Amendments

This Agreement may only be amended in writing signed by duly authorised representatives of the Parties.

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#### 46. Agency, Partnership etc

This Agreement shall not constitute or imply any partnership, joint venture, agency, fiduciary relationship or other relationship between the Parties other than the contractual relationship expressly provided for in this Agreement. Neither Party hall have, nor represent that it has, any authority to make any commitments on the other Party's behalf.

#### 47. Conflict of Terms

If there is any ambiguity or inconsistency in or between the Contract Documents the Council shall determine, at its sole discretion, the priority of the documents.

#### 48. Entire Agreement

This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the Parties relating to the subject matter and supersedes any previous agreements, arrangements, undertakings or proposals, oral or written.

#### SCHEDULE 1

#### **SPECIFICATION**

Universal Credit: Universal Support guidance and specification 2018/2019 (Source: Department for Work & Pensions)

This guidance is for Local Authorities (LA) and should be issued to partners who are providing Universal Support (Personal Budgeting Support). It supplements information in the Grant Funding Agreement (GFA), which sets out the grant terms and conditions.

#### 1. Background

Universal Credit (UC) brings a cultural change and behavioural shift for claimants. The transition to monthly payments and housing costs paid directly to claimants requires them to be responsible for managing their monthly payment and paying their bills. UC full service is also delivered via online self–service. Some people will need help with this.

Universal Support (US) is advice, assistance and support provided by UC or agreed US partners such as LAs, Citizens Advice, Credit Unions, Registered Social Landlords or relevant registered charities who are qualifying persons in accordance with the Social Security (Information-sharing in relation to Welfare Services etc.) (Amendment) Regulations 2015 which can be found here:

http://www.legislation.gov.uk/uksi/2015/46/regulation/2/made

for purpose of assisting claimants with:

- Managing their claim or award of UC including accessing and using online services;
- Managing their financial affairs.

The expansion of UC full service to a broader range of claimants started in May 2016, and will be completed in 2018. After the expansion process is complete, we will begin migrating claimants on legacy benefits, like Jobseeker's Allowance and Tax Credits, to the full service from July 2019. By 2022, all existing legacy claimants will have moved to UC.

#### 2. Working in Partnership

DWP has made funding available to LAs to help deliver US. US consists of Assisted Digital support (AD) and Personal Budgeting Support (PBS). This guidance details what is required from Personal Budgeting Support.

Local partners are best placed to understand local demographics and the likely needs of UC claimants with complex needs and ensure the right support services are in place so that claimants get joined up holistic support. Most District Partnership Managers (DPM) will already be working in partnership with their LAs and have US in place. LAs may choose to deliver US themselves, or they may commission agreed partners to provide the services.

#### 3. Universal Support – PBS provision

Before the start of an operational year, DWP, usually DPMs, and LAs will discuss what support is required for their area. The minimum support that LAs/partners should offer for PBS is in Annex A; the list is not exhaustive.

Once the detail of the local US provision has been agreed, LAs are responsible for communicating details of the support to DPMs and other stakeholders/interested parties. DPMs should also be notified of the referral process, i.e. written notification that's emailed via the secure network (from gcsx to gsi.gov.uk) or by telephone, and will update IT systems so staff are aware of the provision.

Support should be delivered face-to-face; however, it is possible to provide PBS support by telephone by exception, for example, in rural locations where public transport is not readily available or infrequent.

Operational evidence shows that in addition to DWP, UC claimants' US needs are often identified by partners and third parties. Since April 2017, LAs have been able to accept referrals directly through US providers; this will help identify the claimants who need support, deliver the right help at the right time and reduce handoffs.

#### 4. Management Information

The LA will be responsible for collating and retaining Management Information (MI) as detailed in the Grant Funding Agreement.

Quarterly MI returns should be emailed to DWP via the trusted network to UNIVERSAL.SUPPORTRETURNS@DWP.GSI.GOV.UK) and copied to their DPM by the 15th of the following month, e.g., Q1 returns are due by 15 July 2018.

For non-DWP referrals, the US provider is responsible for confirming eligibility before any PBS is delivered. It is likely that a claimant will need more than one US session but LAs should ensure that irrespective of the number of delivered sessions, a claimant is recorded only once on the MI template.

The claimant-specific MI will be used to inform regular local partnership performance improvement discussions and made available as and when required by DWP or other authorised persons as detailed in the GFA.

Partners will receive an MI template from their LA.

#### 5. Sharing Information and Data Protection

Claimants must give consent for appropriate personal data to be shared between DWP and LAs for US purposes. As explained in section 3, LAs will decide their process for receiving referrals. If email is the preferred option, LAs should share their trusted email address (xxxx@gcsx.gov.uk) with DWP. If DWP staff refer a claimant by email, they must only use this address.

Where the LA has commissioned partners to provide US and DWP staff identify a claimant with US requirements, they must only send the notification via the LA and if by email, via the trusted network address. DWP staff are not authorised to send US referrals directly to US delivery partners.

Where an agreed US delivery partner receives a notification/referral from a source other than DWP, they are responsible for:

- providing the LA with assurance that they supported the claimant with the online claim for UC or have observed that the claimant has a UC account (eligibility check for UC funding)
- ensuring data sharing consent is captured and retained
- ensuring MI is captured
- only claiming PBS funding once per claimant.

If the partnership develops processes that need data to be shared differently, a local Privacy Impact Agreement will be needed before implementation. DPMs will have access to more detailed guidance.

#### 6. Local Governance and Reviews

LAs and DPMs should have monthly meetings to review performance and discuss any US strategic/operational issues that have arisen and to identify good practice/areas for improvement. The resolution process for national issues is set out in the GFA.



#### Annex A

## What outputs might US providers deliver to help claimants transition to UC?

#### **Personal Budgeting Support**

PBS is offered to all UCFS claimants when they transition to UC. This is to support claimants to manage their monthly payments and prioritise essential bills such as rent/utilities.

LAs will provide support for claimants who require personal budgeting support to manage their UC payments. This will be achieved through:

- Processing all personal budgeting support referrals from Jobcentre Plus including those claimants who have alternative payment arrangements;
- Identifying the appropriate channel and provider to deliver personal budgeting support (may not be the LA) and referring the claimant to the right place immediately;
- Providing (or arranging provision of) telephone or face to face personal budgeting support and follow up action as appropriate;
- Referring claimants to Jobcentre Plus who may need an alternative payment arrangement e.g. because of rent arrears or vulnerability
- Referrals to external organisations for other support services such as debt advice or help with pass-ported benefits

Resulting in claimants being able to:

- Understand their UC award and what they can claim
- · Work out monthly income and outgoings

#### **SCHEDULE 2**

#### **TUPE AND PENSION CLAUSES**

#### Section 1 EMPLOYMENT PROVISIONS

Unless otherwise stated in each Section, the following definitions shall apply:

**Contractor Personnel**: all directors, officers, employees, agents, consultants and contractors of the Contractor and/or any Sub-contractor engaged in the performance of the Contractor's obligations under this Contract;

**Contractor's Final Personnel List**: a list provided by the Contractor of all Contractor Personnel who will transfer under the Employment Regulations on the Service Transfer Date:

Contractor's Provisional Personnel List: a list prepared and updated by the Contractor of all Contractor Personnel who are engaged in or wholly or mainly assigned to the provision of the Services or any relevant part of the Services which it is envisaged as at the date of such list will no longer be provided by the Contractor and who are expected, if they remain in the employment of the Contractor or of any sub-contractor as the case may be until immediately before the termination date or the expiry date of the (as appropriate), would be Transferring Contractor Employees;

Data Protection Legislation: the Data Protection Act 1998, the Data Protection Directive (95/46/EC), the Regulation of Investigatory Powers Act 2000, the Practice) Telecommunications (Lawful Business (Interception Communications) Regulations 2000 (SI 2000/2699), the Electronic Communications Data Protection Directive (2002/58/EC), the Privacy and Electronic Communications (EC Directive) Regulations 2003 (SI 2426/2003) and all applicable laws and regulations relating to the processing of personal data and privacy, including where applicable the guidance and codes of practice issued by the Information Commissioner.

"Direct Loss" all damage, loss, liabilities, claims, actions, costs, expenses (including the cost of reasonably and necessarily incurred legal or professional services), proceedings, demands and charges whether arising under statute, contract or at common law but, to avoid doubt, excluding Indirect Losses;

**Effective Date:** the date(s) on which the Services (or any part of the Services), transfer from the Council or any Former Provider to the Contractor or Sub-Contractor, and a reference to the Effective Date shall be deemed to be the date on which the employees in question transferred or will transfer to the Contractor or Sub-Contractor.

**Employee Liability Information:** the information that a transferor is obliged to notify to a transferee under regulation 11 of the Employment Regulations:

- (a) the identity and age of the employee;
- (b) the employee's written statement of employment particulars (as required under section 1 of the Employment Rights Act 1996);
- (c) information about any disciplinary action taken against the employee and any grievances raised by the employee, where a Code of Practice issued under Part IV of the Trade Union and Labour Relations (Consolidation) Act 1992 relating exclusively or primarily to the resolution of disputes applied, within the previous two years;
- (d) information about any court or tribunal case, claim or action either brought by the employee against the transferor within the previous two years or where the transferor has reasonable grounds to believe that such action may be brought against the Contractor arising out of the employee's employment with the transferor;
- (e) information about any collective agreement that will have effect after the Effective Date or the Service Transfer Date, as the case may be, in relation to the employee under regulation 5(a) of TUPE.

**Employee Liabilities**: all claims, actions, proceedings, orders, demands, complaints, investigations (save for any claims for personal injury which are covered by insurance) and any award, compensation, damages, tribunal awards, fine, loss, order, penalty, disbursement, payment made by way of settlement and costs, expenses and legal costs reasonably incurred in connection with a claim or investigation related to employment including in relation to the following:

- (a) redundancy payments including contractual or enhanced redundancy costs, termination costs and notice payments;
- (b) unfair, wrongful or constructive dismissal compensation;
- (c) compensation for discrimination on grounds of sex, race, disability, age, religion or belief, gender reassignment, marriage or civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity or sexual orientation or claims for equal pay;
- (d) compensation for less favourable treatment of part-time workers or fixed term employees;
- (e) outstanding employment debts and unlawful deduction of wages including any PAYE and national insurance contributions;
- (f) employment claims whether in tort, contract or statute or otherwise;
- (g) any investigation relating to employment matters by the Equality and Human Rights Commission or other enforcement, regulatory or supervisory body and of implementing any requirements which may arise from such investigation;

**Employment Regulations**: the Transfer of Undertakings (Protection of Employment) Regulations 2006 (SI 2006/246) as amended or replaced or any other regulations implementing the Acquired Rights Directive

**Former Provider**: a Contractor supplying services to the Council before the Service Transfer Date that are the same as or substantially similar to the Services (or any part of the Services) and shall include any sub-contractor of such Contractor (or any sub-contractor of any such sub-contractor);

**Indirect Losses** means loss of profits (other than profits directly and solely attributable to carrying on of the Business), loss of use, loss of production, increased operating costs, loss of business, loss of business opportunity, loss of reputation or goodwill or any other consequential or indirect loss of any nature, whether arising in tort or on any other basis;

**Notified Sub-contractor:** a Sub-contractor identified in Annex D to whom Transferring Council Employees and/or Transferring Former Provider Employees will transfer on a Relevant Transfer Date:

**Relevant Transfer**: a transfer of employment to which the Employment Regulations applies;

**Replacement Services**: any services which are the same as or substantially similar to the Services and which the Council receives in substitution for any of the Services following the expiry or termination of Partial Termination of this Contract, whether those services are provided by the Council internally and/or by any third party;

**Replacement Provider:** any third party provider of Replacement Services appointed by the Council from time to time (or where the Council is providing replacement Services for its own account, the Council);

**Replacement Sub-contractor**: a sub-contractor of the Replacement Provider to whom Transferring Contractor Employees will transfer on a Service Transfer Date (or any sub-contractor of any such Sub-contractor);

Retendering Information: as defined in paragraph 6.10;

**Service Transfer:** any transfer of the Services (or any part of the Services), for whatever reason, from the Contractor or any Sub-contractor to a Replacement Provider or a Replacement Sub-contractor;

**Service Transfer Date:** the date on which the Services (or any part of the Services), transfer from the Contractor or Sub-Contractor to the Council or any Replacement Provider giving rise to a Relevant Transfer;

**Staffing Information**: in relation to all persons identified on the Contractor's Provisional Personnel List or Contractor's Final Personnel List, as the case may be, such information as the Council may reasonably request (subject to all applicable provisions of the Data Protection Legislation, but including in an anonymised format:

- (a) their ages, dates of commencement of employment or engagement and gender;
- (b) details of whether they are employed, self employed contractors or consultants, agency workers or otherwise;
- (c) the identity of the employer or relevant contracting Party;
- (d) their relevant contractual notice periods and any other terms relating to termination of employment, including redundancy procedures, and redundancy payments;
- (e) their wages, salaries and profit sharing arrangements as applicable;
- (f) details of other employment-related benefits, including (without limitation) medical insurance, life assurance, pension or other retirement benefit schemes, share option schemes and company car schedules applicable to them;
- (g) any outstanding or potential contractual, statutory or other liabilities in respect of such individuals (including in respect of personal injury claims);
- (h) details of any such individuals on long term sickness absence, parental leave, maternity leave or other authorised long term absence;
- (i) copies of all relevant documents and materials relating to such information, including copies of relevant contracts of employment (or relevant standard contracts if applied generally in respect of such employees); and
- (j) any other Employee Liability Information

**Sub-Contractor:** the contractors engaged by the Contractor to provide goods, services or works to, for or on behalf of the Contractor for the purposes of providing the Services to the Council.

**Transferring Council Employees:** employees of the Council whose contracts of employment transfer with effect from the Effective Date to the Contractor by virtue of the application of the Employment Regulations. A list of the Transferring Council Employees, as at the date of execution of the Agreement, is attached at Annex B.

**Transferring Former Provider Employees:** employees of a Former Provider whose contracts of employment transfer with effect from the Effective Date to the Contractor or Sub-Contractor by virtue of the application of the Employment Regulations. An indicative list of the Transferring Former Provider Employees, as at the date of execution of the Agreement, is attached at Annex C.

**Transferring Contractor Employees**: those employees of the Contractor and/or the Contractor's Sub-contractors wholly or mainly engaged in the provision of the Services as the case may be as immediately before the expiry date or the termination date of the Contract to whom the Employment Regulations will apply on the Service Transfer Date whose contracts of employment transfer with effect from the Service Transfer Date to the Council or a Replacement Service Provider

#### 2. INTERPRETATION

Where a provision in this Schedule imposes an obligation on the Contractor to provide an indemnity, undertaking or warranty, the Contractor shall procure that

each of its Sub-contractors shall comply with such obligation and provide such indemnity, undertaking or warranty to the Council, Former Provider, Replacement Provider or Replacement Sub-contractor, as the case may be.

#### 3. PROCEDURE IN THE EVENT OF TRANSFER

- 3.1 The Council and the Contractor agree that the commencement of the provision of the Services or of any part of the Services will not be a Relevant Transfer in relation to any employees of the Council and/or any Former Provider.
- 3.2 If any employee of the Council and/or a Former Provider claims, or it is determined in relation to any employee of the Council and/or a Former Provider, that his/her contract of employment has been transferred from the Council and/or the Former Provider to the Contractor and/or any Sub-contractor pursuant to the Employment Regulations or the Acquired Rights Directive then:
  - (a) the Contractor shall, and shall procure that the relevant Sub-contractor shall, within five Working Days of becoming aware of that fact, give notice in writing to the Council and, where required by the Council, give notice to the Former Provider; and
  - (b) the Council and/or the Former Provider may offer (or may procure that a third party may offer) employment to such person within 15 Working Days of the notification by the Contractor or the Sub-contractor (as appropriate) or take such other reasonable steps as the Council or Former Provider (as the case may be) considers appropriate to deal with the matter provided always that such steps are in compliance with applicable Law.
- 3.3 If an offer referred to in clause 3.2(b) is accepted (or if the situation has otherwise been resolved by the Council and/or the Former Provider), the Contractor shall, or shall procure that the Sub-contractor shall, immediately release the person from his/her employment or alleged employment.
- 3.4 If by the end of the 15 Working Day period specified in clause 3.2(b):
  - (a) no such offer of employment has been made;
  - (b) such offer has been made but not accepted; or
  - (c) the situation has not otherwise been resolved,

the Contractor and/or the Sub-contractor may within five Working Days give notice to terminate the employment or alleged employment of such person.

#### 4. INDEMNITIES

- 4.1 Subject to the Contractor and/or the relevant Sub-contractor acting in accordance with the provisions of clause 3.2 to clause 3.4 and in accordance with all applicable employment procedures set out in applicable Law and subject also to clause 4.4, the Council shall:
- (a) indemnify the Contractor and/or the relevant Sub-contractor against all Employee Liabilities arising out of the termination of the employment of any employees of the Council referred to in clause 3.2 made pursuant to the provisions of clause 3.4 provided that the Contractor takes, or shall procure that the Notified Sub-contractor takes, all reasonable steps to minimise any such Employee Liabilities; and
- (b) procure that the Former Provider indemnifies the Contractor and/or any Notified Sub-contractor against all Employee Liabilities arising out of termination of the employment of the employees of the Former Provider made pursuant to the provisions of clause 3.4 provided that the Contractor takes, or shall procure

that the relevant Sub-contractor takes, all reasonable steps to minimise any such Employee Liabilities.

- 4.2 If any such person as is described in clause 3.2 is neither re employed by the Council and/or the Former Provider as appropriate nor dismissed by the Contractor and/or any Sub-contractor within the 15 Working Day period referred to in clause 3.4 such person shall be treated as having transferred to the Contractor and/or the Sub-contractor (as appropriate) and the Contractor shall, or shall procure that the Sub-contractor shall, comply with such obligations as may be imposed upon it under Law.
- 4.3 Where any person remains employed by the Contractor and/or any Sub-contractor pursuant to clause 4.2, all Employee Liabilities in relation to such employee shall remain with the Contractor and/or the Sub-contractor and the Contractor shall indemnify the Council and any Former Provider, and shall procure that the Sub-contractor shall indemnify the Council and any Former Provider, against any Employee Liabilities that either of them may incur in respect of any such employees of the Contractor and/or employees of the Sub-contractor.
- 4.4 The indemnities in clause 4.1:
- (a) shall not apply to:
- (i) in any case in relation to any alleged act or omission of the Contractor and/or any Sub-contractor, any claim for: (A) discrimination, including on the grounds of sex, race, disability, age, gender reassignment, marriage or civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity or sexual orientation, religion or belief; or (B) equal pay or compensation for less favourable treatment of part-time workers or fixed-term employees; or
- (ii) any claim that the termination of employment was unfair because the Contractor and/or any Sub-contractor neglected to follow a fair dismissal procedure; and
- (b) shall apply only where the notification referred to in clause 3.2(a) is made by the Contractor and/or any Sub-contractor to the Council and, if applicable, Former Provider within six months of the Effective Date.

#### 5. PROCUREMENT OBLIGATIONS

Where in this schedule the Council accepts an obligation to procure that a Former Provider does or does not do something, such obligation shall be limited so that it extends only to the extent that the Council's contract with the Former Provider contains a contractual right in that regard which the Council may enforce, or otherwise so that it requires only that the Council must use reasonable endeavours to procure that the Former Provider does or does not act accordingly.

#### 6. RETENDERING AND PRE-SERVICE TRANSFER OBLIGATIONS

- 6.1 The Contractor agrees that within 20 Working Days of the earliest of:
  - (a) receipt of a notification from the Council of a Service Transfer or intended Service Transfer;
  - (b) receipt of the giving of notice of early termination or any Partial Termination of this Contract:

- (c) the date which is 12 months before the end of the Term; and
- (d) receipt of a written request of the Council at any time (provided that the Council shall only be entitled to make one such request in any six month period),

it shall provide at no cost to the Council and in a suitably anonymised format so as to comply with the Data Protection Legislation, the Contractor's Provisional Personnel List, together with the Staffing Information in relation to the Contractor's Provisional Personnel List and it shall provide an updated Contractor's Provisional Personnel List at such intervals as are reasonably requested by the Council.

- 6.2 At least 28 Working Days prior to the Service Transfer Date, the Contractor shall provide to the Council or at the direction of the Council to any Replacement Provider and/or any Replacement Sub-contractor:
  - (a) the Contractor's Final Personnel List, which shall identify which of the Contractor Personnel are Transferring Contractor Employees; and
  - (b) the Staffing Information in relation to the Contractor's Final Personnel List (insofar as such information has not previously been provided).
- 6.3 The Council shall be permitted to use and disclose information provided by the Contractor under clause 6.1 and clause 6.2 for the purpose of informing any prospective Replacement Provider and/or Replacement Sub-contractor.
- 6.4 The Contractor:
  - (a) shall promptly notify the Council forthwith in writing of any material changes to the information provided pursuant to clause 6.1 and clause 6.2 as and when such changes arise; and
    - (b) warrants, for the benefit of the Council, any Replacement Provider, and any Replacement Sub-contractor that all information provided pursuant to clause 6.1 and clause 6.2 shall be true and accurate in all material respects at the time of providing the information.
- 6.5 From the date of the earliest event referred to in clause 6.1(a), clause 6.1(b) and clause 6.1(c), the Contractor agrees, that it shall not, and agrees to procure that each Sub-contractor shall not, assign any person to the provision of the Services who is not listed on the Contractor's Provisional Personnel List and shall not without the approval of the Council (not to be unreasonably withheld or delayed):
  - (a) replace or re-deploy any Contractor Personnel listed on the Contractor Provisional Personnel List other than where any replacement is of equivalent grade, skills, experience and expertise and is employed on the same terms and conditions of employment as the person he/she replaces;
  - (b) make, promise, propose or permit any material changes to the terms and conditions of employment of the Contractor Personnel (including any payments connected with the termination of employment):
  - (c) increase the proportion of working time spent on the Services (or the relevant part of the Services) by any of the Contractor Personnel save for fulfilling assignments and projects previously scheduled and agreed;

- (d) introduce any new contractual or customary practice concerning the making of any lump sum payment on the termination of employment of any employees listed on the Contractor's Provisional Personnel List;
- (e) increase or reduce the total number of employees so engaged, or deploy any other person to perform the Services (or the relevant part of the Services); or
- (f) terminate or give notice to terminate the employment or contracts of any persons on the Contractor's Provisional Personnel List save by due disciplinary process, and shall promptly notify, and procure that each Subcontractor shall promptly notify, the Council or, at the direction of the Council, any Replacement Provider and any Replacement Sub-contractor of any notice to terminate employment given by the Contractor or relevant Sub-contractor or received from any persons listed on the Contractor's Provisional Personnel List regardless of when such notice takes effect.
- 6.6 During the Term, the Contractor shall provide, and shall procure that each Sub-contractor shall provide, to the Council any information the Council may reasonably require relating to the manner in which the Services are organised, which shall include:
  - (a) the numbers of employees engaged in providing the Services;
  - (b) the percentage of time spent by each employee engaged in providing the Services; and
  - (c) a description of the nature of the work undertaken by each employee by location.
- 6.7 The Contractor shall provide, and shall procure that each Sub-contractor shall provide, all reasonable cooperation and assistance to the Council, any Replacement Provider and/or any Replacement Sub-contractor to ensure the smooth transfer of the Transferring Contractor Employees on the Service Transfer Date including providing sufficient information in advance of the Service Transfer Date to ensure that all necessary payroll arrangements can be made to enable the Transferring Contractor Employees to be paid as appropriate. Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, within 5 Working Days following the Service Transfer Date, the Contractor shall provide, and shall procure that each Sub-contractor shall provide, to the Council or, at the direction of the Council, to any Replacement Provider and/or any Replacement Sub-contractor (as appropriate), in respect of each person on the Contractor's Final Personnel List who is a Transferring Contractor Employee:
  - (a) the most recent month's copy pay slip data;
  - (b) details of cumulative pay for tax and pension purposes;
  - (c) details of cumulative tax paid;
  - (d) tax code:
  - (e) details of any voluntary deductions from pay; and
  - (f) bank/building society account details for payroll purposes.
- 6.8 The Council regards compliance with this paragraph 6 as fundamental to the Agreement. In particular, failure to comply with paragraphs 6.1 and 6.2 in respect of the provision of accurate information about the Transferring Contractor Employees shall entitle the Council to suspend payment of the Charges until

such information is provided, or indefinitely. The maximum sum that may be retained under this paragraph 6.8 shall not exceed an amount equivalent to the Charges that would be payable in the [three] month period following the Contractor's failure to comply with paragraphs 6.1 or 6.2, as the case may be.

- 6.9 Any change to the Staffing Information which would increase the total employment costs of the staff in the [six] months prior to termination of this Agreement shall not (so far as reasonably practicable) take place without the Council's prior written consent, unless such changes are required by law. The Contractor shall supply to the Council full particulars of such proposed changes and the Council shall be afforded reasonable time to consider them.
- 6.10 The Contractor shall indemnify and shall keep indemnified in full the Council and at the Council's request any Replacement Provider against all Direct Losses arising from any claim by any party as a result of the Contractor or subcontractor failing to provide or promptly to provide the Council and/or any Replacement Provider where requested by the Council with any information required under this Clause 6.1 to 6.4 inclusive ("the Retendering Information") and/or Employee Liability Information or to provide full Retendering Information and/or Employee Liability Information or as a result of any material inaccuracy in or omission from the Retendering Information and/or Employee Liability Information provided that this indemnity shall not apply to the extent that such information was originally provided to the Contractor or any sub-contractor by the Council and was materially inaccurate or incomplete when originally provided.

#### 7. EMPLOYMENT REGULATIONS EXIT PROVISIONS

- 7.1 The Council and the Contractor acknowledge that subsequent to the commencement of the provision of the Services, the identity of the provider of the Services (or any part of the Services) may change (whether as a result of termination or Partial Termination of this Contract or otherwise) resulting in the Services being undertaken by a Replacement Provider and/or a Replacement Sub-contractor. Such change in the identity of the Contractor of such services may constitute a Relevant Transfer to which the Employment Regulations and/or the Acquired Rights Directive will apply. The Council and the Contractor further agree that, as a result of the operation of the Employment Regulations, where a Relevant Transfer occurs, the contracts of employment between the Contractor and the Transferring Contractor Employees (except in relation to any contract terms disapplied through operation of regulation 10(2) of the Employment Regulations) will have effect on and from the Service Transfer Date as if originally made between the Replacement Provider and/or a Replacement Subcontractor (as the case may be) and each such Transferring Contractor Employee.
- 7.2 The Contractor shall, and shall procure that each Sub-contractor shall, comply with all its obligations in respect of the Transferring Contractor Employees arising under the Employment Regulations in respect of the period up to (and including) the Service Transfer Date and shall perform and discharge, and procure that each Sub-contractor shall perform and discharge, all its

obligations in respect of all the Transferring Contractor Employees and other employees or former employees of the Contractor or each Sub-contractor (who had been engaged in the provision of the Services) arising in respect of the period up to (and including) the Service Transfer Date (including the payment of all remuneration, benefits, entitlements and outgoings, all wages, accrued but untaken holiday pay, bonuses, commissions, payments of PAYE, national insurance contributions and pension contributions which in any case are attributable in whole or in part to the period ending on (and including) the Service Transfer Date) and any necessary apportionments in respect of any periodic payments shall be made between: (i) the Contractor and/or the Sub-contractor (as appropriate); and (ii) the Replacement Provider and/or Replacement Sub-contractor.

- 7.3 Subject to clause 7.4, the Contractor shall indemnify the Council and/or the Replacement Provider and/or any Replacement Sub-contractor against any Employee Liabilities in respect of any Transferring Contractor Employee (or, where applicable any employee representative as defined in the Employment Regulations) arising from or as a result of:
  - (a) any act or omission of the Contractor or any Sub-contractor whether occurring before, on or after the Service Transfer Date;
  - (b) the breach or non-observance by the Contractor or any Sub-contractor occurring on or before the Service Transfer Date of:
  - (i) any collective agreement applicable to the Transferring Contractor Employees; and/or
  - (ii) any other custom or practice with a trade union or staff association in respect of any Transferring Contractor Employees which the Contractor or any Sub-contractor is contractually bound to honour;
  - (c) any claim by any trade union or other body or person representing any Transferring Contractor Employees arising from or connected with any failure by the Contractor or a Sub-contractor to comply with any legal obligation to such trade union, body or person arising on or before the Service Transfer Date:
  - (d) any proceeding, claim or demand by HMRC or other statutory Council in respect of any financial obligation including, but not limited to, PAYE and primary and secondary national insurance contributions:
    - (i) in relation to any Transferring Contractor Employee, to the extent that the proceeding, claim or demand by HMRC or other statutory Council relates to financial obligations arising on and before the Service Transfer Date; and
    - (ii) in relation to any employee who is not a Transferring Contractor Employee, and in respect of whom it is later alleged or determined that the Employment Regulations applied so as to transfer his/her employment from the Contractor to the Council and/or Replacement Provider and/or any Replacement Sub-contractor, to the extent that the proceeding, claim or demand by HMRC or other statutory Council relates to financial obligations arising on or before the Service Transfer Date:
  - (e) a failure of the Contractor or any Sub-contractor to discharge or procure the discharge of all wages, salaries and all other benefits and all

- PAYE tax deductions and national insurance contributions relating to the Transferring Contractor Employees in respect of the period up to (and including) the Service Transfer Date);
- (f) any claim made by or in respect of any person employed or formerly employed by the Contractor or any Sub-contractor other than a Transferring Contractor Employee for whom it is alleged the Council and/or the Replacement Provider and/or any Replacement Sub-contractor may be liable by virtue of this Contract and/or the Employment Regulations and/or the Acquired Rights Directive; and
- (g) any claim made by or in respect of a Transferring Contractor Employee or any appropriate employee representative (as defined in the Employment Regulations) of any Transferring Provider Employee relating to any act or omission of the Contractor or any Sub-contractor in relation to its obligations under regulation 13 of the Employment Regulations, except to the extent that the liability arises from the failure by the Council and/or Replacement Provider to comply with regulation 13(4) of the Employment Regulations.
- 7.4 The indemnities in clause 7.3 shall not apply to the extent that the Employee Liabilities arise or are attributable to an act or omission of the Replacement Provider and/or any Replacement Sub-contractor whether occurring or having its origin before, on or after the Service Transfer Date, including any Employee Liabilities:
  - (a) arising out of the resignation of any Transferring Contractor Employee before the Service Transfer Date on account of substantial detrimental changes to his/her working conditions proposed by the Replacement Provider and/or any Replacement Sub-contractor to occur in the period on or after the Service Transfer Date); or
  - (b) arising from the Replacement Provider's failure, and/or Replacement Sub-contractor's failure, to comply with its obligations under the Employment Regulations.
- 7.5 If any person who is not a Transferring Contractor Employee claims, or it is determined in relation to any person who is not a Transferring Contractor Employee, that his/her contract of employment has been transferred from the Contractor or any Sub-contractor to the Replacement Provider and/or Replacement Sub-contractor pursuant to the Employment Regulations or the Acquired Rights Directive, then:
  - (a) the Council shall procure that the Replacement Provider shall, or any Replacement Sub-contractor shall, within five Working Days of becoming aware of that fact, give notice in writing to the Contractor; and
  - (b) the Contractor may offer (or may procure that a Sub-contractor may offer) employment to such person within 15 Working Days of the notification by the Replacement Provider and/or any and/or Replacement Sub-contractor or take such other reasonable steps as it considers appropriate to deal with the matter provided always that such steps are in compliance with Law.
- 7.6 If such offer is accepted, or if the situation has otherwise been resolved by the Contractor or a Sub-contractor, the Council shall procure that the

Replacement Provider shall, or procure that the Replacement Sub-contractor shall, immediately release or procure the release of the person from his/her employment or alleged employment.

- 7.7 If after the 15th Working Day period specified in clause 7.5(b) has elapsed:
  - (a) no such offer of employment has been made;
  - (b) such offer has been made but not accepted; or
  - (c) the situation has not otherwise been resolved

the Council shall advise the Replacement Provider and/or Replacement Subcontractor, as appropriate that it may within five Working Days give notice to terminate the employment or alleged employment of such person.

- 7.8 Subject to the Replacement Provider and/or Replacement Sub-contractor acting in accordance with the provisions of clause 7.5 to clause 7.7, and in accordance with all applicable proper employment procedures set out in applicable Law, the Contractor shall indemnify the Replacement Provider and/or Replacement Sub-contractor against all Employee Liabilities arising out of the termination pursuant to the provisions of clause 7.7 provided that the Replacement Provider takes, or shall procure that the Replacement Sub-contractor takes, all reasonable steps to minimise any such Employee Liabilities.
- 7.9 The indemnity in clause 7.8:
  - (a) shall not apply to:
    - (i) in any case in relation to any alleged act or omission of the Replacement Provider and/or Replacement Sub-contractor, any claim for: (A) discrimination, including on the grounds of sex, race, disability, age,
    - gender reassignment, marriage or civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity or sexual orientation, religion or belief; or (B) equal pay or compensation for less favourable treatment of part-time workers or fixed-term employees; or
    - (ii) any claim that the termination of employment was unfair because the Replacement Provider and/or Replacement Sub-contractor neglected to follow a fair dismissal procedure; and
  - (b) shall apply only where the notification referred to in clause 7.5(a) is made by the Replacement Provider and/or Replacement Sub-contractor to the Contractor within six months of the Service Transfer Date.
- 7.10 If any such person as is described in clause 7.5 is neither re-employed by the Contractor or any Sub-contractor nor dismissed by the Replacement Provider and/or Replacement Sub-contractor within the time scales set out in clause 7.5 to clause 7.7, such person shall be treated as a Transferring Contractor Employee and the Replacement Provider and/or Replacement Sub-contractor shall comply with such obligations as may be imposed upon it under applicable Law.
- 7.11 Not Used.
- 7.12 The Contractor shall, and shall procure that each Sub-contractor shall, promptly provide to the Council and any Replacement Provider and/or

Replacement Sub-contractor, in writing such information as is necessary to enable the Council, the Replacement Provider and/or Replacement Sub-contractor to carry out their respective duties under regulation 13 of the Employment Regulations. The Council shall procure that the Replacement Provider and/or Replacement Sub-contractor, shall promptly provide to the Contractor and each Sub-contractor in writing such information as is necessary to enable the Contractor and each Sub-contractor to carry out their respective duties under regulation 13 of the Employment Regulations.

- 7.13 Subject to clause 7.14, the Council shall procure that the Replacement Provider indemnifies the Contractor on its own behalf and on behalf of any Replacement Sub-contractor and its sub-contractors against any Employee Liabilities in respect of each Transferring Contractor Employee (or, where applicable any employee representative (as defined in the Employment Regulations) of any Transferring Contractor Employee) arising from or as a result of:
  - (a) any act or omission of the Replacement Provider and/or Replacement Sub-contractor;
  - (b) the breach or non-observance by the Replacement Provider and/or Replacement Sub-contractor on or after the Service Transfer Date of:
    - (i) any collective agreement applicable to the Transferring Contractor Employees; and/or
    - (ii) any custom or practice in respect of any Transferring Contractor Employees which the Replacement Provider and/or Replacement Subcontractor is contractually bound to honour;
  - (c) any claim by any trade union or other body or person representing any Transferring Contractor Employees arising from or connected with any failure by the Replacement Provider and/or Replacement Sub-contractor to comply with any legal obligation to such trade union, body or person arising on or after the Service Transfer Date;
  - (d) any proposal by the Replacement Provider and/or Replacement Sub-contractor to change the terms and conditions of employment or working conditions of any Transferring Contractor Employees on or after their transfer to the Replacement Provider or Replacement Sub-contractor (as the case may be) on the Relevant Transfer Date, or to change the terms and conditions of employment or working conditions of any person who would have been a Transferring Contractor Employee but for their resignation (or decision to treat their employment as terminated under regulation 4(9) of the Employment Regulations) before the Service Transfer Date as a result of or for a reason connected to such proposed changes;
  - (e) any statement communicated to or action undertaken by the Replacement Provider or Replacement Sub-contractor to, or in respect of, any Transferring Contractor Employee on or before the Service Transfer Date regarding the Relevant Transfer which has not been agreed in advance with the Contractor in writing;
  - (f) any proceeding, claim or demand by HMRC or other statutory Council in respect of any financial obligation including, but not limited to, PAYE and primary and secondary national insurance contributions:

- (i) in relation to any Transferring Contractor Employee, to the extent that the proceeding, claim or demand by HMRC or other statutory Council relates to financial obligations arising after the Service Transfer Date; and
- (ii) in relation to any employee who is not a Transferring Contractor Employee, and in respect of whom it is later alleged or determined that the Employment Regulations applied so as to transfer his/her employment from the Contractor or Sub-contractor, to the Replacement Contractor or Replacement Sub-contractor to the extent that the proceeding, claim or demand by HMRC or other statutory Council relates to financial obligations arising after the Service Transfer Date;
- (g) a failure of the Replacement Provider or Replacement Sub-contractor to discharge or procure the discharge of all wages, salaries and all other benefits and all PAYE tax deductions and national insurance contributions relating to the Transferring Contractor Employees in respect of the period from (and including) the Service Transfer Date; and
- (h) any claim made by or in respect of a Transferring Contractor Employee or any appropriate employee representative (as defined in the Employment Regulations) of any Transferring Contractor Employee relating to any act or omission of the Replacement Provider or Replacement Sub-contractor in relation to obligations under regulation 13 of the Employment Regulations.
- 7.14 The indemnities in clause 7.13 shall not apply to the extent that the Employee Liabilities arise or are attributable to an act or omission of the Contractor and/or any Sub-contractor (as applicable) whether occurring or having its origin before, on or after the Service Transfer Date, including any Employee Liabilities arising from the failure by the Contractor and/or any Sub-contractor (as applicable) to comply with its obligations under the Employment Regulations.
- 7.15 The parties shall co-operate to ensure that any requirement to inform and consult with the employees and or employee representatives in relation to any Relevant Transfer to a Replacement Provider will be fulfilled.
- 7.16 The parties agree that the Contracts (Rights of Third Parties) Act 1999 shall apply to clause 6 and 7, to the extent necessary to ensure that any Replacement Provider shall have the right to enforce the obligations owed to, and indemnities given to, the Replacement Provider by the Contractor or the Council in its own right under section 1(1) of the Contracts (Rights of Third Parties) Act 1999.
- 7.17 Despite clause 7.16, it is expressly agreed that the parties may by agreement rescind or vary any terms of this Agreement without the consent of any other person who has the right to enforce its terms or the term in question despite that such rescission or variation may extinguish or alter that person's entitlement under that right.

#### **Contract Description/Specification**

In accordance with Section 31 of the Local Government Act 2003; and pursuant to Chapter 3 of the Welfare Reform Act 2012 and The Universal Credit Regulations 2013, Shropshire Council is working in partnership with the Department for Work & Pensions (DWP) to assist in the successful roll out of Universal Credit (UC) across Shropshire by identifying eligible citizens with complex needs who are transferring onto UC and who are in need of Personal Budgeting Support (PBS) to help them manage their finances.

Under the partnership agreement, DWP provide grant funding to the Council based on estimated numbers of those requiring support. The council wishes to procure a County-wide service to provide PBS to those identified as requiring such support.

Delivery providers must be able to show that they can be classified as "Qualifying Partners" as required by Regulation 10 (1) (e) of the Social Security (information sharing in relation to welfare services etc.) Regulations 2012

#### **Personal Budgeting Support for Universal Credit**

**1.** Requirements of Service Provider:

The objective of Universal Credit Personal Budgeting Support is to help claimants transitioning onto Universal Credit with budget management skills that enable them to manage their money and pay their bills on time, prioritising rent payments. This will be achieved through:

- Providing Shropshire Council with assurance that they supported the claimant with the required PBS activities.
- Ensuring data sharing consent is captured and retained;
- **2.** The Outcomes of Personal Budgeting Support should include but not be restricted to the Claimant being capable of undertaking the following activities:
  - Work out monthly income and outgoings
  - Recognise priority bills, such as rent
  - Identify and cut back on non-essentials
  - Complete and maintain a budgeting plan
  - Convert from a Post Office card account / simple payments to more appropriate banking products
  - Have a transitional bank account
  - Set up a direct debit for prioritised payments

- 3. The referrals process will be as follows: Only those transferring onto Universal Credit are able to receive PBS via this agreement. Jobcentre Plus staff will identify to Shropshire Council those Universal Credit claimants needing help to budget. Shropshire Council will provide basic information and contact details to the provider in order that they can arrange for PBS to be delivered. Referrals between the Council and the provider and will be via a secure electronic system (ECINS), use of which the provider is expected to sign up to. There will be no licence costs to the provider in respect of use of this system. The provider will send completed work reports incorporating the required management statistics via the ECINS system.
- **4.** In addition, referrals for support can be identified directly through support providers, these will only attract funding for support where the need for PBS is due to transfer onto Universal Credit and where this has not already been delivered via any previous referral.
- **5.** The provider may, with appropriate consent from the client, refer on to other sources of support such as debt advice where appropriate
- **6.** The provider is required to refer claimants requiring an Alternative Payment Arrangement for example due to rent arrears or vulnerability, to the DWP
- 7. Amount of funding and payment: The amount of funding allocated to the Council for the purpose of providing PBS is set by the DWP according to their estimates of likely need, cost per hour per referral and is made available under strict conditions and to strict limits which cannot be exceeded. Payment of £43,246, equivalent to 50% of estimated support need is guaranteed in advance with the possibility for this to be increased via further quarterly payments in arrears if management returns show actual take up of support exceeds this initial 50% of expectation. The provider will be required to maintain accurate records of successful delivery of PBS to each individual, and to the required standard, accounted for against this initial payment. The completion of regular management information as required will determine whether take up exceeds these initial DWP estimates and the amount of any additional funding as a result.
- **8.** Funding for PBS is based on a total of 2 hours support per UC claimant, set at a maximum cost of £63.00 gross, delivered either face to face or alternatively telephone advice where appropriate with no payment made for any subsequent contact or advice. This limit is absolute and no further payment in respect of an individual can be claimed or paid. The provider is responsible for ensuring that only one claim for payment per client is made in accordance with these conditions.
- **9** The Council makes the assumption that payment will continue for future years based on DWP's assumption of future need –however is not guaranteed and the Service Provider should note this.
- 10 The Council is required to keep separate, accurate and up-to-date accounts and records in respect of the PBS for two years after the last day of the DWP Grant Period. Accordingly, the Service Provider needs to comply with Secure Record Keeping when formalising the Personal Budgeting Support in order

that the council can meet its obligation to DWP.

**11** The following obligations are placed on the Council as the recipient of grant funding from the DWP. These obligations will pass equally to the Service Provider as detailed:

- The Recipient (and any person acting on its behalf) shall permit:
- (a) the Comptroller and Auditor General or appointed representatives;
- (b) the Funder or appointed representatives;

free access at all reasonable times to all documents (including computerised documents and data) and other information as are connected to the Grant payable under this Agreement. - The Council shall ensure a segregation of duties within its (or Third Parties engaged in providing PBS) operation between those employees directly involved in delivering PBS and those reporting management information to the Funder;
- The Council shall ensure that an audit system is implemented to provide periodic checks, to ensure effective and accurate recording and reporting of management information to the Funder.
- The Council shall on a quarterly basis provide the Funder with the required Management Information as well as any other information subsequently requested and in such formats as the Funder may reasonably require.
- The Council acknowledges that the Funder is subject to the requirements of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) and the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 and shall assist and co-operate with the Funder (at the Recipient's expense) to enable the Funder to comply with these information disclosure requirements.
- The service provider needs to demonstrate at all times during the contract duration that it is GDPR compliant and provide an adequate guarantee that it has, or can, implement appropriate technical and organisational measures that are sufficient to secure that the processing will (a) meet the requirements of the GDPR and (b) ensure the protection of the rights of the data subject.
