

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER AND DEFINITIVE MAP
AND STATEMENT MODIFICATION ORDER**

**HIGHWAYS ACT 1980
WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981**

**THE SHROPSHIRE COUNCIL (FOOTPATH 22 (PART), PARISH OF UPTON MAGNA)
PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2019**

The above named order made on 16th May 2019 by the Shropshire Council (“the Council”) under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980, will **divert**:

the full width of that part of Footpath 22, Upton Magna, from point A on the order map (SJ 5567 1251) where it leaves, Pelham Road, running in a general easterly direction across the garden and corner of number 10 Pelham Road, then continues across the garden of number 9 Pelham Road before crossing a field to point B on the order map (SJ 5580 1250); a total distance of approximately 131 metres; **onto a line** from a gate at point B on the order map (SJ 5580 1250), a footpath to be created running in a general west-north-westerly direction following a field boundary to a pedestrian gate in the hedge line at point C on the order map (SJ 5569 1257) at its junction with Pelham Road; a total distance of approximately 124 metres with a width of 2 metres throughout.

A copy of the order and the order map and an explanatory statement have been placed and may be seen free of charge at the Council offices at The Shirehall, Abbey Foregate, Shrewsbury during normal office hours or via the Council’s website at <https://shropshire.gov.uk/outdoor-partnerships/countryside-access-and-public-rights-of-way/current-public-path-orders/>. Copies of the order and map may be bought from the Council, at the above address at a cost of £6.50.

Any representations about or objections to the order may be sent in writing to Shropshire Outdoor Partnerships, Rights of Way Mapping and Enforcement Manager, The Shirehall, Abbey Foregate, Shrewsbury, SY2 6ND, or by email to outdoor.recreation@shropshire.gov.uk, not later than 14th June 2019. Please state the grounds on which they are made.

If no such representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Council may confirm the order as an unopposed order. If the order is sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for confirmation any representations and objections which have not been withdrawn will be sent with the order.
