What is the Role of SAMDev?

- Second document in Shropshire's Local Development Framework
- It follows the Core Strategy, which establishes approach to new development and broad targets for Shropshire up to 2026
- The Core Strategy has been subject to extensive community involvement during its development
- The Core Strategy and the SAMDev will be used to prioritise development and assess planning applications



What is the Role of SAMDev?

- Implementing the strategy and development targets set in the Core Strategy through:
 - Setting out proposals for site allocations in settlements
 - Providing detailed policies to guide and manage future development
- Implementing the vision and priorities of the Sustainable Community Strategy (SCS):
 - Enterprise and growth, with strong market towns and rebalanced rural settlements
 - Responding to climate change and enhancing our natural and built environment
 - Healthy, safe and confident people and communities



Engaging in the Process

It is now important to get involved and have your say on development in your area

- This is the first opportunity for communities to have their say on the SAMDev DPD

What does the SAMDev Document Contain?

- Three key parts
 - Part A: Options for growth across
 Shropshire's market towns and key centres;
 - Part B: Development priorities in your area;
 - Part C: Future policies for managing development and creating Sustainable Communities



Part A: Market Towns and Key Centres

We are interested in your views on how much development and investment should be directed to each town and key centre

 Alternative options presented for the distribution of development for towns and key centres in each Spatial Zone (South, Central, East, North East and North West) up to 2026



Part A: Market Towns and Key Centres

- Questions asked for Part A:
 - A1: How do you think housing development should be distributed between the towns in your Spatial Zone?
 - A2: What scale of employment development do you think would be appropriate in each town in your Spatial Zone?
 - A3: What are your priorities for local infrastructure investment in each town, in association with development?



This section asks your views on the future role of your local community and its needs and aspirations

- Rural areas need to become more sustainable through some managed growth
- "Community Hubs" and "Community Clusters" to be identified through a partnership approach with communities
- Development looks to protect the countryside whilst providing community benefit to identified rural areas



- Questions asked for Part B:
 - B1: In your view, which villages in your area should be identified as "Community Hubs" or "Community Clusters" and why?
 - B2: How many new homes would be appropriate in each one, in the period to 2026?
 - B3: What are your priorities for local infrastructure investment in each settlement, in association with new development
 - B4: What type of sites (allocations for development) would be appropriate in each one?
 - **B5:** Should the village(s) you have identified have a development boundary?



This section also identifies potential directions for growth in a number of towns and villages across Shropshire

- Each leaflet includes maps with potential directions for growth in villages in their respective Local Joint Committee area
- At this stage these maps do **not show** allocations for development
- The maps only shows potential options for development
- Only some sites will be needed to meet the need
- No decisions have yet been made



Questions about directions for growth:

-B6: For each of the settlements with a map, what is the best direction(s) for their future growth?

-B7: Should any sites be identified for economic development / employment use?



Part C: Managing Development and Creating Sustainable Communities

This section considers what further policies may be required to help manage future development in Shropshire

Key Policy Themes include:

- Sustainable Design;
- Planning for Vibrant Town Centres;
- Managing the Release of Housing and Employment Land;
- Protecting the Countryside;
- Managing the Greenbelt
