What is this strategy about?



Shropshire Council and Shropshire County PCT want to make sure that people with learning disabilities living in Shropshire have the chance to do all the things that other people do.



To help them do this they have a written a big plan for Shropshire.
This is called the Learning Disability Strategy. The strategy says what will happen in the next 3 years.



The strategy explains which services are included, the people who are involved in the strategy and what is covered. It says how we want to make services better for people with learning disabilities.

The strategy is in three parts.

The blue section tells us about what is happening now.

The green section explains what will happen and what we will do in the next 3 years.

The orange section explains how everyone will work together to make things happen.

Who is this strategy for?

Making sure that people receive good health care





Making sure that people are treated well and can do things just like everyone else.



Making sure that people have somewhere to live.



Helping people to speak up for themselves and to make choices.



Giving people choices about what happens in their lives and helping them to do new things



Involving everyone in saying how things should be done





Making sure that everyone knows what is happening



Making sure that everyone works together to make things better.

 How young people leave school when they are 19 and how they are supported to be an adult.

 How much money is spent on services for people with learning disabilities in Shropshire Council and the PCT.



 How poor health affects people with learning disabilities and what health care is available.

 How we will help people with a learning disability to live safely and be protected from crime and from being hurt.

 What we are doing to help people with a learning disability make friends and have relationships and how we will support them if they become a parent






 Everything else about being part of society and being a citizen. These are things like transport, work, and things to do in your spare time, making sure you have the right benefits, voting and speaking up.
