1.	Footpath along Telford Way: This had been improved and subsequently dug up by the electricity board who had failed to put right afterwards.	<p>It was confirmed that it was the utility company's responsibility to restore the footpath and they would be asked to do so.</p> <p>In addition Enforcement officers have confirmed that the reinstatement of the footpath on Telford Way will need to have been completed as utility companies have a short time in which to complete such works. However, if it was improvement works then this would likely to have been a Council scheme. Any defects would be picked up by inspectors during the routine inspection of highways.</p>
2.	Footpath between Monkmoor Road Bus Stop, where road bridge drops down to Robertson Way: This route down to the footpath alongside the allotments was filled with deep holes which were particularly dangerous for cyclists and pedestrians, particularly older people and those with push chairs. It was impassable following heavy rain.	<p>Councillor Kenny reported that he was aware of and seeking action to deal with the problems on this diverted Right of Way. He was looking into whether locals could fill the holes themselves with material from the allotment as this appeared to be the quickest way to get things done.</p> <p>Further information would be available from the Chairman.</p>
3.	The unused Post Office parcel deposit/storage box which had fallen into disrepair on Portland Crescent still had not been moved. Location: Portland Crescent/Preston Street/Reynaulds Close Junction	<p>July 2012: A letter was issued to the Post Office requesting action to remove the now disused storage box – no response received.</p> <p>March 2013: Further correspondence issued to the Royal Mail asking them to take action – no response received.</p> <p>July 2013: Further investigation with Highways Officers the clerk has contacted Royal Mail Manager, Martin Hall, directly via email requesting they confirm what action they intend to take.</p>

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4.
