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LOCAL JOINT COMMITTEE (LJC) BUDGET

Summary

The report provides the Committee with details of funding bids that have been received since its last meeting on 10 December 2009. Members are requested to agree a budget contribution towards projects highlighted in Appendix A.

Recommendations

Members are asked to consider the funding applications outlined in paragraph 3 and to approve budget allocations accordingly.

Background

- 1. The Committee has a budget of £26,000 for the 2009/10 financial year. This must be spent to improve service standards, support the delivery of parish plans and/or to provide grants to local voluntary organisations. The sum that remains unallocated prior to this meeting is £14,075.00. The Committee has discretion to carry forward unallocated balances to the next financial year.
- 2. To date members have approved grant funding as follows:

Applications Received

3. The following applications for funding have been received since the last LJC meeting:

a) Minsterley Parish Hall

Project outline: Purchase and install new light guards at the village hall to allow

for youth activities to take place at the parish hall

Total project cost: £652.68

Amount Requested from LJC: £652.68 Recommended grant award: £500

Additional Information: This project is supported by the Shropshire Council Youth Worker for the area, as the installation of the guards will allow Shropshire Youth service to continue to use the hall.

b) Minsterley Parish Council

Project Outline: The Parish Council would like to purchase and install a new notice board in the village, to allow more parish council and community notices to be displayed. **Total project cost:** £1350.00

Amount Requested from LJC: £1,000 Recommended grant award: £1,000

Additional Information: The new board will be installed while major bridge repairs take place in Minsterley in the spring of 2010

c) Shropshire Youth

Project Outline: Purchase of equipment for Minsterley Youth Club. Equipment will include badminton nets, quick cricket, football goals and Wii games.

Total project cost: £740.33

Amount Requested from LJC: £740.33 Recommended grant award: £740.33

d) Pontesbury Sports Association

Project Outline: To purchase, and install, safety netting at Pontesbury Sports Field. This will improve the safety of neighbouring properties from cricket balls etc being hit out of the field.

Total project cost: £2217

Amount Requested from LJC: £1000 (in addition to £1000 already awarded)

Recommended grant award: £1000

Additional Information: This organisation applied for LJC funding amounting to £4,800 in September 2009. They were awarded £1000 and advised to apply to

Sport England's Awards for All grant scheme to secure the additional funds needed. Unfortunately the application to Sport England was turned down. The Sport Association have subsequently scaled down the project so that its total cost is now £2217. They have requested that the LJC consider increasing their grant offer to help them meet the cost of the project.

e) Rea Valley Environmental Network

Project Outline: Funding to support the development of the group's funding application to the Big Lottery SOS Fund. The group has got to the final round of this fund and could potentially secure £ 350,000 of the grant for their project.

Total project cost: £10,000

Amount Requested from LJC: £2,000

Recommended grant award: £2,000 (to be ring fenced pending development of

the group's progress in the lottery bid)

Additional information: The group's final application to the Big Lottery will be submitted on 3rd March. A decision on the grant will be made in early May 2010.

f) Douglas Swire Memorial Hall - Longden

Project Outline: Installing a new heating system at the hall to improve the quality and efficiency of the hall's heating. This is part of a continuing programme to modernise the hall and make it a more inviting venue for community groups to use.

Total project cost: £13,282

Amount Requested from LJC: £5000

Recommended grant award: This application was submitted subsequently to the planning meeting at which grant applications were initially assessed. Committee members are recommended to review this application on 10th March and make a decision on the grant at the LJC meeting

Additional information: The hall's management committee are looking at further improvements to the hall. If these were combined into a larger project they could be eligible for funding from the Shropshire Community Fund, which provides capital grants of £10,000 to £50,000 and is open to new applications from March 2010.

q) Plealey Residents Group

Project Outline: The residents group plan to hold a 2 day community event in June 2010 to bring the community together and celebrate its history. The event would include an exhibition of local crafts, an exhibition of local artefacts, a flower festival and conjurer. As part of the project a book about the history of the village will be produced along with a commemorative mug. These items will be sold to help meet the costs of holding the event

Total project cost: £3270.00

Amount Requested from LJC: £1070.00

Proposed grant award: This application was submitted subsequently to the planning meeting at which grant applications were initially assessed. Committee members are recommended to review this application on 10th March and make a decision on the grant at the LJC meeting
