Shrewsbury Children's Bookfest	To involve local children in literature and the arts	£3,000	A number of primary schools have been reading and commenting on a list of nearly 50 titles nominated for the award by ten of the major children's publishers, Using their comments, the Book Award Steering Group will draw up a shortlist of 6 titles which will be announced this month (December 09). A further 14 schools have been approached and invited to take part in the second phase of the project with Market Drayton Junior School included. At the beginning of January, each participating school will receive a complimentary box of 3 copies of each of the shortlisted titles, together with a set of voting cards. Pupils will then have until 31st March to read the books and vote for their favourite. Voting cards will be collected during the first week in April. Each participating school will be allocated a maximum of 30 tickets to come to the Award Ceremony, which will take place in Theatre Severn on Friday 28th April.	To be monitored
Market Drayton Tennis Club	To build a practice wall	£1,000	There has been a delay in this project for which the Tennis Club apologised. Market Drayton Tennis Club were waiting for Greenfields Sports Association to build a shed and spectator stand next door to them which may have impacted on the position and size of the practice wall. After researching the various options for a wall it is felt that a brick built wall would not be suitable and that the mesh rebound wall is required at a cost of £5,000. This will enable adults to play while children use the mesh wall. The Club estimate that they will have obtained the additional funds to build the wall by the Spring of 2010.	To be monitored
Market Drayton Town Council	Towards a play area in Buntingsdale	£10,000	The budget has been agreed for this project at approximately £60,000. The Town Council has received £10,000 from the LJC, £7,500 from North Shropshire District Council and the remainder has recently been approved for funding from the Playbuilder Scheme. Six designs went out to consultation with schools in years 5,6 and 7 and 68% approved one design which will provide an area for age 8 to 13 years and a junior play area.
