O	<p>Shropshire Council (Licensing Department) – Pilot Taxi Marshall Scheme</p>	<p>Following a successful scheme in Shrewsbury the Shropshire Licensing Enforcement Group consider that a Taxi Marshall scheme in Oswestry Town Centre, close to 3 late night entertainment venues of Gibson’s, Boar’s Head and Wetherspools, would be of benefit to all members of public. The aim of the Taxi Marshall scheme is to reduce late night economy anti-social behaviour by enabling members of the public to be quickly disbursed at the end of their evening out.</p> <p>The LJC can fund these projects because, although Shropshire Council are administrating this scheme, it is not something that, ordinarily, the Council has responsibility for.
