This will be created by erecting a stud wall and providing UV protection to windows. The store will provide the correct environmental conditions i.e. humidity, temperature, and light as per the Museum and Library Association accreditation standards. In addition, a study area will be created for the public to use in order to access the Collection Catalogue and for the study of documents. This will be wheelchair accessible.	£689.00
N	Whitchurch Chamber Of Commerce	The aim of this project is to purchase a mobile stage for use on the Bullring and other areas of Whitchurch Town. Local artists and groups will provide music and entertainment to attract visitors to the town.	£4,460.00

This will cover the cost of resurfacing of the school Tennis Court including storage facilities for bulky items currently stored away from the facility. The area accommodates four full size tennis courts and associated equipment. The Tennis Court is used extensively by students for primarily tennis and netball but is also utilised in other ways as part of the school physical education curriculum. In addition, the court is used by students as a playground with open access during breaks, lunch and before and after school, when it is extensively used by students for ball games which are not permitted in other parts of the college grounds.	£10,000.00

Shropshire Youth bid to the Whitchurch and Prees LJC in September 2009 to create a ring-fenced sum of money for young people in the local area. £9,000 was awarded and an amount of £1,195 was rolled forward from the previous year, making a total of £10,195 available.

The thinking behind this bid was to work towards “Hear by right standard 4” within the new councils LJC structure. This level of involvement by young people means that young people are actively involved and lead the process with support from appropriate adults.

As a result of the LJC’ generosity in topping up last years allocation, local young people were required to write their own bids (following an amended LJC application form*), which were then assessed by a panel of independent young people from the local area. This process was supported by Youth Workers, with Julie Ruler and Councillor Gerald Dakin from the LJC observing.

The Young Peoples Panel have up to £10,195.00 to award this year (2009/10) and plan to bid for a similar amount to support youth activities annually. Information about the fund was made public through Shropshire Youth Association, Shropshire Youth and via the LJC and its officers. We plan to run a second round in February to award the balance.

The table below illustrates who bid for the money, how much, the amount recommended together with scores and observations made by the Youth Panel.

I would like to bring a group of young people to the final LJC of the year, so that they can demonstrate how the funds have been spent and talk about the difference it has made.

By operating at this standard the Whitchurch & Prees LJC are setting a standard that other LJC’ in Shropshire may wish to emulate.
