

ACTION

1. Apologies for absence and substitutions

Apologies were received from.

Lynne Gray (Eaton-Under-Heywood and Hope Bowdler Parish Council) (Mr Tony Madeley substituted), Richard Hubbard (StrettonDale Area Partnership)

2. Disclosable Pecuniary Interests

Paul Harris declared an interest in the application for funding from Longnor Village Hall, and left the room whilst it was considered.

Hilary Clayton-Smith declared an interest in the application for funding from Church Stretton Town Council.

David Evans declared an interest on the grounds of bias in the application from Mayfair in relation for funding for Ring and Ride scheme, and left the room whilst it was considered.

3. Notes of the Meeting held on 27 June 2013

AGREED:

That the notes of the meeting held on 21 February 2013 be approved and signed as a correct record.

4. Public Questions and Suggestions for Agenda Items for Future Meetings

A question was raised as to whether or not changes to the planning system would be put out for consultation. The chairman responded that the proposals would be put to cabinet in December but there would not be any consultation and there are not significance changes.

A49 Closure:

The meeting was informed that the A49 would be closed from 8pm from Church Stretton to Wistanstow from 4 November for 30 nights.

Road closures were also planned for Sandford Avenue and Walls Bank.

Concern was raised about the lack of publicity regarding scheduled road closures, especially to neighbouring parishes.

AGREED:

That the LJC would write to express their concerns and that the

5. Community Safety Update

PC Preston gave an overview of the crime figures for the previous quarter. In summary there were 322 incidents, 30 recorded crimes, and 20 incidents of antisocial behaviour.

The team based out of Church Stretton (and also covers Craven Arms) now has 3 PCSO's, who now have additional powers, 4 special constables, PC Preston and Sgt Woolley.

The local police have been working in partnership with agencies such as South Shropshire Housing Association to manage and evict tenants.

Excellent work and initiative was shown by PCSO O'Neil in relation to enabling the arrest of a suspect for a burglary in the area.

Over the summer, speed checks were carried out in areas of Church Stretton, All Stretton, Hope Bowdler and Longville in the Dale as a result of these checks 44 motorists were advised and educated on speed awareness and two motorist were reported for summons.

More proactive work around speeding, community safety, and anti-social behaviour is planned in the coming months.

Steve Paige – Fire Service

The meeting was informed that there is currently a consultation taking place regarding the budget restrictions. All present were urged to visit the website <http://www.shropshirefire.gov.uk/> and have your say.

A public meeting is taking place in Clun (a station highlighted for closure) on Friday 29th November, 6pm at the Memorial Hall.

Final consultation results would be available in February 2014.

6. Briefing from Streetscene

Kate Adams, Streetscene Manager for the area gave an overview of the work undertaken in relation to dog fouling and the legal processes involved in prosecution.

The Commissioning work in Church Stretton had highlighted dog fouling as a cause for concern in the community.

Proactive work has taken place regarding patrols at different times of the day based on feedback from the community, and talks are currently planned for local groups and the police and the council are

working with year 10 and 11 pupils at the secondary school in relation to a community safety project they are carrying out. It is hoped that the young people will pass on the key messages to their wider family and friends.

Concern was raised by members of the public regarding the dog exclusion zones of 5 metres from a play area and suggested a fence needed to be erected around the play area on Brooksbury. It was reported that the Town Council and the parents involved are investigating the provision of suitable planting to act as a natural barrier as there is not funding available for fencing.

AGREED:

Church Stretton Town Council meets with those in attendance raising the concerns above.

7. Rural Transport Update

Matt Johnson from Shropshire Council gave an overview of the last 6 years of transport provision for rural areas, including the recently ceased Shropshire Link. On detailed analysis there were only 300 users countywide of the Shropshire Link which cost £650,000 per year to run.

The current situation is that a similar service is now provided by the community transport schemes across the county with a minimum of one day a week provision to the market town. There are still the commercial routes available such as the 435 and 540. In Church Stretton the Ring and Ride has been an essential means of transport for a number of years and the Good Neighbours Community Car scheme is also an extremely important part of the transport options available to local residents.

Members requested a summary of the transport options to be provided back to the committee.
