3	Appointment of Vice-Chair It was proposed seconded and duly resolved that David Turner be appointed vice chair of the Broseley and Barrow LJC for the forthcoming municipal year

7	<p>Current Policing Issues – PACT (Partners and Communities Together)</p> <p>Sgt Bailey gave an update on local crime.</p> <p>Concerns raised by residents:</p> <p>Inconsiderate parking in Dark Lane and outside JW school. Parking on double yellow lines – Sgt Bailey confirmed that this is the responsibility of the civil enforcement officers. Both schools are being looked at by Traffic Management at SC.</p> <p>ASB – Sgt Bailey urged residents to report matters so they are recorded. JJ said that a portable CCTV system is being installed at the Library car park as it has been identified as a hot spot.</p>	
8	<p>Broseley Library Service and Community Assets Transfer</p> <p>Ian Pickles gave an update.</p> <p>Broseley Town Council are continuing to negotiate with Shropshire Council on the transfer of the library and car park.</p> <p>Key issues: consultation, finance and costs all still to be finalised.</p> <p>Car park – important that this is not lost as it is important to the town, however, SC have confirmed it cannot be negotiated separately. The car park comes with the library.</p>	
9	<p>Local Youth Commissioning</p> <p>George Candler gave an update on youth services following the youth service consultation</p> <p>Key themes coming out of the consultation for Broseley were:</p> <p>Youth club is well attended Concerns from young people and parents about youth club closing Concerns about the loss of youth workers who have built up a trust with young people Concerns from young people about ASB and bullying when they use the Birchmeadow Park</p> <p>He proposed that a one off offer of up to £1500 be offered to Broseley LJC as match funding for youth activities.</p> <p>JJ explained the role of Broseley Youth Partnership and proposed that the LJC delegate this funding to them and task them with obtaining match funding and</p>	

	<p>putting a programme together for youth activity provision in Broseley. This was agreed by members.</p>	
10	<p>Broseley Youth Day</p> <p>Caroline Bagnall of Broseley Youth Partnership gave a brief overview of activities planned for the Youth Day which will take place on 27th September 2015.</p>

UPDATE – Local Youth Commissioning

1. Summary

Following a period of public and stakeholder consultation, the commissioning model for youth activities was developed.

A funding mechanism for youth activities to respond to specific areas of unmet need in Local Joint Committee (LJC) areas was developed and Broseley did not receive any funding.

Much Wenlock and Shipton LJC area was allocated £3,000 linked to its rural make-up and therefore it was agreed that Much Wenlock LJC share its funding allocation with Broseley LJC to benefit all of the appropriate young people living within the LJC areas.

Following a public consultation regarding the closure of Broseley Youth Club, Broseley and Barrow LJC received a one off payment (subject to match funding) of up to £1500.00 from Shropshire Council.

Broseley and Barrow LJC agreed to delegate this funding to Broseley Youth Partnership and task them with obtaining match funding.

2. Feedback

Broseley Youth Partnership applied to Much Wenlock and Shipton LJC for £1500.00 and were awarded the full amount to use as match.

Over the next 12 months, Broseley Youth Partnership will endeavour to:

Make sure that all families in Broseley get to find out what is going on in the Town and surrounding parishes for young people.

Have an “information stand” to promote BYP- what its aims are and to publicise the opportunities in the town for young people.

Make Broseley youth day an even bigger and better event by involving young people in the planning of the day and giving them more opportunities to be involved in the day.

Work locally to ensure that the Birchmeadow park is a safe place for children to play.

Work in partnership with the Victoria Hall Management Committee in developing a new youth club.

3. Progress

Following the closure of Broseley Youth Club in July 2015, Broseley Youth Partnership have commissioned Shropshire Youth Association (SYA) to provide youth club sessions. Sessions restarted in November 2015 and the Partnership is working closely with SYA and the Youth Club to ensure the sustainability of the club.

This year the Partnership will also work on finding funding for some detached youth work sessions on Birchmeadow park and also Broseley Youth Day.
