UPDATE – Local Youth Commissioning

1. Summary

Following a period of public and stakeholder consultation, the commissioning model for youth activities was developed.

A funding mechanism for youth activities to respond to specific areas of unmet need in Local Joint Committee (LJC) areas was developed and Broseley did not receive any funding.

Much Wenlock and Shipton LJC area was allocated £3,000 linked to its rural make-up and therefore it was agreed that Much Wenlock LJC share its funding allocation with Broseley LJC to benefit all of the appropriate young people living within the LJC areas.

Following a public consultation regarding the closure of Broseley Youth Club, Broseley and Barrow LJC received a one off payment (subject to match funding) of up to £1500.00 from Shropshire Council.

Broseley and Barrow LJC agreed to delegate this funding to Broseley Youth Partnership and task them with obtaining match funding.

2. Feedback

Broseley Youth Partnership applied to Much Wenlock and Shipton LJC for £1500.00 and were awarded the full amount to use as match.

Over the next 12 months, Broseley Youth Partnership will endeavour to:

Make sure that all families in Broseley get to find out what is going on in the Town and surrounding parishes for young people.

Have an “information stand” to promote BYP- what its aims are and to publicise the opportunities in the town for young people.

Make Broseley youth day an even bigger and better event by involving young people in the planning of the day and giving them more opportunities to be involved in the day.

Work locally to ensure that the Birchmeadow park is a safe place for children to play.

Work in partnership with the Victoria Hall Management Committee in developing a new youth club.

3. Progress

Following the closure of Broseley Youth Club in July 2015, Broseley Youth Partnership have commissioned Shropshire Youth Association (SYA) to provide youth club sessions. Sessions restarted in November 2015 and the Partnership is working closely with SYA and the Youth Club to ensure the sustainability of the club.

This year the Partnership will also work on finding funding for some detached youth work sessions on Birchmeadow park and also Broseley Youth Day.
