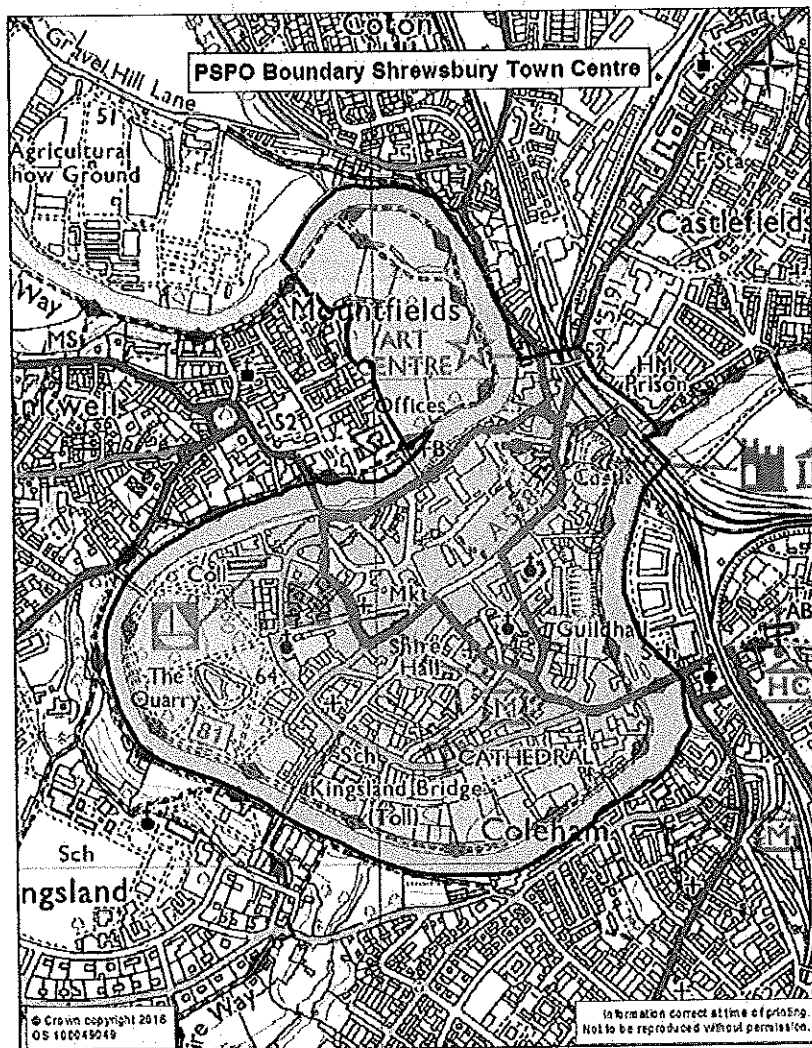
Proposal to introduce a Public Space Protection Order for Shrewsbury Town Centre
