The applicant purchased these premises and transferred the Premises Licence application finalised in April, 2020.

Greene King Brewing & Retailing Ltd seek to invest in the refurbishment of this premises to improve the facilities that have been on offer to members of the public for many years as a food led licensed premises with accommodation.

The applicant is proposing to refurbish the premises to improve standards throughout the building both internally and externally. The Riverside Inn is to continue to operate as a food led outlet with a small accommodation provision under the applicant's brand "Chef & Brewer". The Chef & Brewer pubs offer an "authentic Country pub experience with roaring log fires and cosy nooks to set the perfect scene at winter to beautiful outdoor spaces and beer gardens to help enjoyment of long summer days alongside an excellent dining experience".

The Licence itself dates back to conversion in 2005 and contains a number of conditions relating to the previous Public Entertainment Licence in force. The conditions are outmoded and do not suit the current and proposed operation of the premises.

In summary the request for the variation falls into a number of parts as follows:-

- 1. The extension of the hours for sale by retail of alcohol to permit such licensable activity daily 09.00 to 00.30 with the premises closing to the public 30 minutes thereafter.
- 2. To retain the ability to sell alcohol to residents 24 hours a day, seven days a week.
- 3. To remove the restrictive conditions of non-standard timings upon the Licence for licensable activities on Good Friday and Christmas Day and for those days to be licensed as per the standard hours for licensable activities on the Licence.
- To permit late night refreshment by way of extension for the same hours as the sale by retail of alcohol.
- 5. To permit the provision of films for the same hours as sale of alcohol to non residents.
- 6. To remove conditions on the Licence relating to those conditions endorsed as part of the previous Public Entertainment Licence and "Embedded Restrictions" and one other condition and to replace these with a modernised version of the conditions under the Licensing Act 2003. A document attached marked "Schedule A" indicates the conditions requested to be removed from the Premises Licence.
- 7. To approve the opening times of the premises to non-residents to 06.00 to 01.00 Monday to Sunday for the provision of breakfasts and refreshment prior to the commencement of the licensable activities for non-residents upon the Licence.
- 8. No application is made to amend the recorded music licensable activity hours by virtue of this variation. This is to remain as existing both internally and externally.
- 9. To approve the proposed layout of the premises in accordance with the plans deposited with the Licensing Authority (plan number 7882/26 Rev a dated 06.01.20), briefly these alterations comprise as follows:-
 - Refurbishment throughout both internally and externally at the premises as reflected on the deposited plans.
 - Removal and reconfiguration of bar servery area by the taking out of the old central bar and its repositioning to the left of the bar area as reflected on the deposited plans.
 - Reconfiguration and enlargement of the toilet provision at the premises.
 - Reconstruction and improvement of the conservatory area as shown on the plans.
 - Reconfiguration and improvement of the coach house area with bar servery to be included within the licensed area for the sale of alcohol, recorded music and late night refreshment.
 - The incorporation of the external areas as shown on the plans within the licensed area. The
 external area at these premises have historically been used for consumption of food and drinks
 for many years without issue.
- 10. As part of the application it is proposed to update and offer additional conditions as detailed in the Operating Schedule paragraph M(a) to (e).

- Staff will receive training on matters concerning underage sales, drugs policies and operating procedures.

Embedded Restrictions

By converting the licence under the Licensing Act 2003, the following embedded restrictions are carried over from the Licensing Act 1964.

Permitted Hours

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours. In this condition, permitted hours means:

- a) On weekdays, other than Christmas Day, Good Friday or New Year's Eve, 10:00am to 11:00pm
- b) On Sundays, other than Christmas Day or New Years Eve, 12:00 noon to 10:30pm
- c) On Good Friday, 12:00 noon to 10:30pm
- d) On Christmas Day 12:00 noon to 3:00pm and 7:00pm to 10:30pm
- e) On New Year's Eve, except on a Sunday, 10:00am to 11:00pm
- f) On New Year's Eve on a Sunday, 12:00 noon to 10:30pm

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- a) During the first twenty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
- b) During the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;

he above restrictions do not prohibit:

- a) During the first twenty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
- b) During the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- c) During the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meal:
- g) The sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's navel, military or air forces:

Alcohol may be sold or supplied (for one hour following the hours set out above and) (on Christmas day, between 15:00 and 19:00) to persons taking table meals in the premises usually set apart for the service of such persons and for consumption by such a person in that part of the premises as ancillary to his meal. For other purposes or in other parts of the premises the hours set out above shall continue to apply.

Children in Bars

No person under fourteen (14) shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:

- a) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence.
- b) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.
- c) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.
- d) The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary. In this condition "bar" includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.

Consumption

Alcohol sold for off licence consumption shall not be sold in an open container or be consumed in the licensed premises.

This licence is subject to such further conditions as are consistent with any restrictions imposed on the use of the premises for the existing licensable activities under the licence by virtue of the enactments hereinafter set out:-

Children and Young Persons Act 1933 Cinematrograph (Safety) Regulations 1955 Sporting Events (Control of Alcohol etc) Act 1985
