Prevention of harm to children

Immediately adjacent to the rugby club is the riverside park, playground and football pitch. It is used by families, children and young people. The availability and consumption of alcohol nearby will have a detrimental impact.

Prevent public nuisance

Within the conservation area there will be significantly increased noise and light pollution until late. Noise will come from the entertainment from inside the clubhouse but also from outside and with from public leaving the venue late at night. It will also have negative impact on the Bowls, Tennis and Croquet clubs.

Prevent crime and disorder

There likely to be an increase in antisocial behaviour resulting from extended hours and the frequency of events. Young people will be attracted to a venue with accessibility to loud music and alcohol, which may spread outside the club and its premises. There is no CCTV in the area to monitor behaviour; it is highly unlikely that there will be greater police presence.

Public safety

Linney is a narrow road which already suffers from increasing traffic use from cars, lorries, cyclists and pedestrians. Much of the road is not wide enough for two way traffic. Increase the number of vehicles and pedestrians will have a significant impact on safely. The Spring festival will increase the footfall (upto six thousand people per day for 3 days). There will also be vehicles servicing events and shuttling visitors from parking areas. This will have a significant impact on safety.
