PREVENTION OF HARM TO CHILDREN

THE RUGBY CLUB IS ADJACENT TO LUDLOW BOWLS AND TENNIS CLUB; THE JOINT CLUB EACH HAVE JUNIOR MEMBERS. ALSO ADJACENT TO THE RUGBY CLUB IS A CHILDREN'S PLAYGROUND AND RECREATION AREA.

TO PREVENT PUBLIC NUISANCE (SEE SEPARATE SHEET)

WE LIVE AT CLIFF PARK, A RESIDENTIAL PARK HOME SITE FOR PEOPLE OVER THE AGE OF 50. THE VAST MAJORITY OF PARK HOME OWNERS AT CLIFF PARK ARE BETWEEN 60 AND 85. NOISE TRAVELS TO THE PARK FROM THE RUGBY CLUB GROUND ON MATCH DAYS AND TRAINING DAYS. (SEE SEPARATE SHEET)

TO PREVENT CRIME & DISORDER

THE CLIFF PARK ENJOYS RELATIVE ANONYMITY AND THEREFORE THERE ARE NO ISSUES AS REGARDS CRIME AND DISORDER. HOWEVER AN INCREASE IN ACTIVITY AT THE CLUB WILL RISK MORE PEOPLE BEING AWARE WE EXIST WITH THE PURSUANT RISK OF CRIME AND DISORDER.

PUBLIC SAFETY

INCREASED ROAD TRAFFIC IN AN AREA WHERE ROADS ARE NARROW AND FOOTPATHS SPARSE IMPACTS ON PUBLIC SAFETY. THERE IS NO QUESTION THAT THERE WOULD BE AN INCREASE IN ROAD TRAFFIC. THE EXTRA TRAFFIC WILL PUT PRESSURE ON AN ALREADY NARROW THOROUGHFARE AND CREATE ADDITIONAL RISKS FOR PEDESTRIANS, CYCLISTS, MOTORISTS AND THEIR PASSENGERS.

The Prevention of harm to children.

Any untoward behaviour by adults, which may occur as a result of the licensing plans, could have a negative impact on any children in the vicinity. Children also come down to the river to swim, paddle, canoe and generally take part in water sports. The car park by the river is often full to capacity. Extra pressure from an increase in events at the Rugby Club will limit the scope for children to take part in healthy activities by the river. The extra traffic, in itself, poses a risk to children as they seek to access the area.

To prevent public nuisance.

If the Rugby Club hosts a wedding or such like the noise is greater and further impinges on the quiet of the Park. Ourselves and our neighbours on the Park already find the current level of noise to be intrusive. If the licence is granted there is a strong possibility that there will be many more occasions when the Park residents will be disturbed by noise from the Club and this will pose a serious risk of having a detrimental effect on people's mental health.
