THE PREVENTION OF HARM TO CHILDREN

• The map accompanying the licensing application does not show the adjacent childrens play area which attracts families, children and young boys and girls enjoying a safe play area. Their safety will be compromised by the attendance of large numbers of adults under the influence of alcohol. Their safety will be compromised by increased vehicular movement. —see continuation page 2

TO PREVENT PUBLIC NUISANCE

• Clearly the level of noise pollution will be significant if the application to have live music, dance, theatre, disco etc. outside until 2am/3am is permitted. The proximity of my residence will make such events intolerable. —see continuation... 2 page 2A

TO PREVENT CRIME & DISORDER

• Increased threat to order by:-

- volume of traffic (and associated traffic violations)
- volume of human traffic under influence of alcohol/drugs
- inevitable public order offences magnified by volume.
- insufficient and appropriate detail in the application to ensure public and community safety

PUBLIC SAFETY

- Local residents and 'normal' visitors to Ludlow will have their personal safety prejudiced by the volumes associated with large scale events.

① THE PREVENTION OF HARM TO CHILDREN

- continued -

The access road to Ludlow Rugby Club is alongside the play area, is single track and with the potential movement of traffic including commercial vehicles will be an inherent danger.

The licence application suggests that any person found intoxicated by drink/drugs will be evicted from their site, inevitably upset and disappointed onto the children's play area. There is obviously an ~~increase~~ decrease to children safety in this regard.

② TO PREVENT PUBLIC NUISANCE

- continued -

The current licence, which is acceptable, allows for entertainment 11am to 1am with live music, recorded music, 'loud' events to be confined to indoors. The limit of attendance to 499 is itself sufficiently maximum given the noise generation factor. Interestingly we can already hear the playing /trouping of rugby from within our property with the windows closed!

- The current level of light pollution from the Rugby Club and nearby Tennis and Bowls Club is at the maximum tolerable levels for local residents. Any additional lighting would create significant nuisance.
- The existing road/footpath infrastructure will not facilitate the large numbers of attendees for any 'festival'. The potential volume of traffic and public footfall will impact significantly, be unmanageable, prejudice safety, create a nuisance and lead to unwarranted disruption to local residents. To suggest c6000 persons per day can access the facility without impact is naive.
- The inevitable impact of alcohol has its knock-on effects. The magnification of such by large numbers and extended hours will exacerbate an already concerning problem.
- The Rugby Club and our property and surrounding area sits in a 'conservation area'. The impact of the implementation of this licence mitigates against the rubric of 'conservation'.

③ TO PREVENT CRIME & DISORDER

-continued.

The current licence held by the Rugby Club provides sufficient scope for 'large' events which, whilst potentially challenging, can be managed satisfactorily given the facilities and infrastructure available.

④ PUBLIC SAFETY

In an already confined and limited vehicular and pedestrian throughroute, the challenge of accepting significantly increased volumes will increase the risk of harm to the public.

The normal day-to-day movement of traffic and pedestrians is already not without risk. To escalate this risk so significantly is a real concern. The potential for hindrance of emergency services vehicles is real. There is a potential for risk to life should any 'festival' event be held at this site.
