


<p><b>THE PREVENTION OF HARM TO CHILDREN</b></p> <p>Situated so close to both the Millenium Green and the playpark area, much used by children and families, any increased traffic represents a threat to children's safety. The ridiculously long licensing hours – 7 am through to 2am- means that any anti-social behaviour would not be confined merely to late evenings but would have an impact during lunch hours and after school.</p>
<p><b>TO PREVENT PUBLIC NUISANCE</b></p> <p>Clearly, the request for such long licensing hours means that the Rugby Club is anticipating events which last all day and through the night. This will inevitably result in nuisance from noise and anti- social behaviour. The topography of the Linney means that noise from the Rugby Club would be created in a sound bowl- we have the town walls, the castle and the hillside all around- and noise would echo around the area. This level of noise is not suitable or acceptable in any residential area. It is worth noting that on the odd occasion where amplified words and music is used at the Castle or the Market Square, it is clearly heard in the Linney area.</p>

**PUBLIC SAFETY**

Linney is both narrow and winding. Any journey to the Rugby Club, whether from the Dinham side or from Coronation Avenue invariably already leads to traffic congestion, due to the lack of passing places and traffic parked on narrow road. We have seen 2 accidents during December where cars have tried to negotiate the steep bend and hill from Upper Linney to Lower Linney.
