QUESTION regarding PROGRESS OF THE DRAFT LOCAL PLAN EXAMINATION

We wish to raise our concerns on the progress of the Examination.

We acknowledge the time Officers spent in preparing their response to the Inspectors' queries of 15th February 2023 (ID28), which you approved at your 19th July meeting and submitted to the Inspectors (GC24)

However, it is clearly apparent from the Inspectors' letter 4th October (ID36) that the Officers response fundamentally didn't address the points they had raised regarding the Black Country housing and employment land provision within Shropshire in the Draft Plan.

At 16th November no reply to that letter from the Council had appeared on the Examination website

Our concern is that unless satisfactory responses are provided to the Inspectors they will consider the whole Draft Plan to be 'unsound' and throw it out.

We are very concerned that any further delay with the Examination or any requirement to revisit large parts of it or, worst case having to recommence, will push

back adoption beyond the current LDS date of June 2024, increasing risk of an 'Out of Date' Plan.

We would request an update on the Examination, in particular

• progress on the Council's response to the Inspectors' questions (ID28) (ID36),

• assurances that Officers are being provided with the necessary resources and expertise to address the Inspectors' concerns (particularly considering third party legal pre-actions),

• what alternative solutions are being considered for potential 'Main Modifications' to address the Inspectors' concerns should those be required to make the Plan for period 2016-2038 'sound' and recommend it for Adoption.
