It is a relatively crime-free area, other than very occasional drug related incidents, and the nuisance from late-night revellers leaving nearby pubs. My concern is that a venue such as that proposed would expose an as yet relatively unknown, peaceful part of town, to groups of people that don't always have the best intentions. The area in question is mostly free of litter, cigarette butts, and vomit that very often blight other areas of town closer to pubs and late-night venues.

The sale of alcohol on the premises would also promote late-night revelling, raised voices, and general noise in the area. The average age of residents in The Court is well above the average age of late-night revellers, and these are the people that would be most exposed to the noise generated in a late-night venue.
