<p>It would appear that the applicant seeks off sales of alcohol for 111 of the 168 hours that there are in a week. Over 66%. The facility will have almost no passing trade: off sales will be either to customers leaving late, or those who find it handy for drinking in the quiet of St Mary's Churchyard.</p> <p>There are appropriate, and appropriately located, retail outlets for alcohol, with almost equal opening hours. This proposed outlet is neither appropriate nor appropriately located.</p> <p>I object.</p>

THE PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

It would appear that the applicant seeks off sales of alcohol for 111 of the 168 hours that there are in a week. Over 66%. The facility will have almost no passing trade: off sales will be either to customers leaving late, or those who find it handy for drinking in the quiet of St Mary's Churchyard.

This is likely to produce more nuisance for the neighbours around St Mary's Square, and a great deal more litter, including broken glass. This is not acceptable. There are problems enough from substance abuse in that area, which have in effect cost the various people and premises a lot of money. We do not need this one.

Intoxicated people talk and laugh and shout more loudly and with less self-control than sober people. They make a noise. They make a noise that is very annoying to those who have a right to enjoy a quiet life in the neighbourhood. Although the Government Guidance on this topic speaks of night time economy, this proposal is for all day and late night economy and will be outrageously disruptive to anyone within earshot at any time of day.

Were the premises to be hermetically sealed, much of this element of my objection would be removed. But it is not. It will be outdoors, and probably with doors opening wide onto the outdoor area. The "chatter" noise 16 hours a day, 7 days a week, will be absolutely appalling. This is quite different noise from that experienced from a nearby café – alcohol-free.

Add to this the intent to play music – whether live or canned it will be electronically amplified, and you have just condemned a whole local population to lifelong antidepressants or worse. It is impossible to escape from noise being pumped in to one's own home. It will be worse in warm weather when both local residents and premises customers want the windows and doors open.

I can see no possible merit in this application. It is without any thought or consideration for its neighbours and will undoubtedly be a public nuisance for a large part of the Loop.

I object.
