PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER

Dear Licensing Team, I wish to object to the application from Aaron Brown and Vivek Bhatia for the license to provide outdoor dining, drinking and music/live events at the Parade, St Mary's Place, Shrewsbury. My objection is based on concerns that this license will exacerbate, amongst other things, public disorder and noise nuisance for the many residents not only in the Parade but the The Nursing home, Watergate Mansion's and across the river to the Old Meadows development. This is a long established residential area in the heart of Shrewsbury and as such will suffer greatly should such a license be granted. The area is already suffering from an entrenched problem of drug related activities especially around the St Mary's Church site which is already well documented and it is my fear, therefore, that an establishment of this nature offering further the potential for these sort of activities to increase would make the area more dangerous

PUBLIC SAFETY

The plan is to have a large number of outdoor tables and chairs on the forecourt in front of units 25 and 26 thereby blocking the gated access onto the forecourt, this would severely hamper the access for emergency services should they ever need to attend an incident. Furthermore, the security that the current metal railings to the front and side of the Parade forecourt provide is inadequate -trespassers regularly climb over them to gain access to the banking/terrace in front of the parade which stretches the whole length of the site and evidence of vandalism including the daubing of graffiti onto the walls is increasing and likely to carry on should more public access be permitted to this area.

THE PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE


To permit an establishment of this nature run by owners of already existing, similar establishments only a stones throw from the significantly residential area that is the Parade and St Mary's Place in general would, in my humble opinion, detrimentally impact on what is a mature residential area by introducing and spreading the same problems of public nuisance, noise, and public health hazards that are already being experienced in those areas of the town more especially involved in promoting the "evening economy". By keeping and developing the "evening economy" in areas where it can be more easily and satisfactorily monitored and controlled by the relevant authorities would be a benefit of not only the establishments but their clientele, residents and the general public as well.
