

REPRESENTATIONS PROCEDURE NOTES

- A representation can be made against an application for a premises to carry on a licensable activity within the 28 day consultation period. Representations can also be made against applications to make variations to an existing licence.
- Representations may be made by:
 - Responsible authorities
 - Other persons
- To make a representation you much complete and send this form to licensing@shropshire.gov.uk. Representations may also be submitted by post to: Licensing Team, Business & Consumer Protection Service, Shirehall, Abbey Foregate, Shrewsbury, SY2 6ND.

<u>PLEASE NOTE:</u> The representation form must be received by the Licensing Team before the end of the consultation period stated on the site notice, newspaper notice and the Council's website, or it will not be accepted. Posted representations not received within a consultation period due to the postal system will be treated as late and not accepted.

- Where a representation is accepted as relevant, the Council will share the
 representation in its entirety with the applicant and their agent. This is to allow them
 an opportunity to consider the issues raised in the representation and discuss possible
 ways to mitigate the objector's concerns with them directly.
- Only in exceptional circumstances will personal details be redacted from representations.
 This will be when the Council considers that there is a genuine risk of intimidation /
 violence to the persons making representation. Persons making representations who
 consider this to be a risk should make it clear on their representation and they will be
 contacted to discuss further.
- At the end of the consultation period, if any representations remain, the name and address
 of persons making representations will be published on the report to the LicensingSub
 Committee, which will be publicly available.

THE PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER

The selling of alcohol would encourage a drinking culture on those nights when open and the possibility of an increase in low level disorder when guests are leaving the Bar which invariably will make its ways out into the local streets including down St Marys Water Lane where we are already experiencing ongoing anti-social behaviour particularly in the garage area and down along the river towpath. Another concern is the potential increase to the disposal of bottles and cans from the Parade car park area into the trees and shrubs behind Blackfriars.

PUBLIC SAFETY

The location overlooks the private Blackfriars meadow by the river which has tables and a bench. This may encourage patrons of the Bar to try and access with their drinks either down St Marys Water Lane or more dangerously over the metal boundary fence and down a very steep slope. This occurred last year at the pop up event when a number of groups of people approached the meadow from the Lane but fortunately they turned back to the venue on seeing the private sign on the gate but it was still disruptive.

The proposed location for this Bar is wholly inappropriate as it will sit in a predominately quiet residential area and will increase the possibility of public nuisance for the many private homes in the immediate vicinity, including my own which even though being the top floor of Upper Blackfriars is at the same level and only yards away from this proposed new venue. I am particularly concerned about noise nuisance as experienced last year at the pop up event in the same location when both the music and general noise was of an excessive volume and therefore intrusive. No outdoor music - the noise and sound generated from the new restaurant and bar because of its location will be amplified and carry towards and across the river and echo off the surrounding buildings including Blackfriars , The Parade and the Nurses Home and the residents in this immediate vicinity will be obliged to listen to any musical performances, whether they want to or not which again will not be tolerable.

 agent.
- If limited or withheld personal details are redacted from representations, where notice of a hearing is given to an applicant, the licensing authority is required under the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings)
 Regulations 2005 to provide the applicant with copies of the relevant representations that have been made.
