Electoral Services – Scale of Fees 2025/26

1. Synopsis

To agree the scale of fees for electoral events held during 2025/26, with particular reference to those re-charged to town and parish councils.

2. Executive Summary

- 2.1 In May 2025 all unitary and town and parish council seats will be up for election. The Returning Officer has the responsibility for administering those elections and Shropshire Council has an obligation to provide sufficient resources for the Returning Officer to carry out those duties. Where town and parish council elections are held, the costs of those polls are reimbursed by those councils to Shropshire Council.
- 2.2 In order to run elections, costs are incurred including printing, postage, logistics, premises hire and staff. Duties of staff have increased in recent years as a result of electoral reform. Recruiting and retaining sufficient experienced staff to run polling stations is cited by Returning Officers nationally as a significant challenge. Indicative staffing pay bands have been laid out by Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government (MHCLG) who reimburse costs for national polls. In practice staff pay is in line for national and local polls.

2.3 This report therefore seeks approval for those costs and also a delegation in order for those costs to be adjusted annually to cover by-elections before the following round of local elections in 2029.

3. Recommendations

- 3.1. That the Council agree the Scale of Fees for 2025/26 as set out in Appendix A and B.
- 3.2. That Council delegates to the Chief Executive the power to set fees annually in between scheduled local elections.

Report

4. Risk Assessment and Opportunities Appraisal

- 4.1 The Council needs to ensure it complies with statutory requirements. One element of this is to ensure that the Returning Officer has sufficient staff and resources required to operate an election. Staffing of polling station roles continues to present one of the biggest challenges in the running of elections. The Council needs to pay a competitive rate, as it will become increasingly difficult to staff elections because of fees.
- 4.2 The impact of the Elections Act 2022 has also increased the complexity in the administration for polling station staff (Presiding Officers, Poll Clerks and Polling Station Inspectors), who are now expected to, amongst other reforms, verify the identity of every voter before a ballot paper is issued.
- 4.3 The Scale of Fees must be balanced against setting a rate that is fair, ensures that we can recruit suitable staff and doesn't risk any rate being paid dropping below the National Living Wage.

5. Financial Implications

- 5.1 Total costs depend on many factors including the number and cost of staff and polling stations. The Electoral Commission recommends ratios when allocating electors and staff to Polling Stations which dictates that each Polling Station requires a Presiding Officer and between 1 and 3 Poll Clerks. Due to the changes required to be made to the electoral register following the Local Government Boundary Review, the final maximum number of polling stations required in the May 2025 elections is not yet determined. It will also depend on how many unitary and parish elections are contested. However, it is estimated that there will be around 270 polling stations in use.
- 5.2 In 2021, the parish and town elections were combined with the Shropshire Council and the Police and Crime Commissioner elections, therefore a third of the relevant costs were recharged to the parish and town councils at that time.

- 5.3 In 2025, the parish and town elections will be combined with the Shropshire Council elections only, therefore the costs will be shared between the two election types. This will increase the proportion attributable to each election type.
- 5.4 Fees set out cover Returning Officer fees as well as staffing fees. For Unitary Council elections the Returning Officer fees are payable to the Returning Officer by the Council. No increase is proposed to those, thus not increasing this cost to the Council.
- 5.5 The overall cost incurred locally for administration of national elections is recoverable from Government via the Electoral Claims Unit in MHCLG.
- 5.6 The overall cost incurred locally for the administration of local elections is not recoverable and is funded by the Councils concerned.

6. Climate Change Appraisal

6.1. There are no direct climate change impacts arising from this report.

7. Background

- 7.1 Each Local Authority is required to appoint a Returning Officer (RO). The RO is appointed in an independent capacity by the Council to organise and run elections free from the political structure of the authority. Councils must provide their RO with the resources they need to run elections. This includes the cost of recruiting and paying staff to act as Presiding Officers and Poll Clerks, along with any other ancillary staff necessary for the success of a poll.
- 7.2 For national polls the government issues a Fees and Charges schedule which identifies for each authority a "maximum recoverable amount" along with a fee which may be claimed by the appointed RO for the rendering of their services. The RO will pay their appointed staff from the monies provided by government and will account for their expenditure by way of a return to the Election Claims Unit (ECU) at the Cabinet Office.
- 7.3 MHCLG is responsible for central government elections and last year launched a project to introduce indicative fee bands for all election roles at polls which they fund. This introduced set fees which should be paid to elections staff at UK Parliamentary elections, Police and Crime Commissioner elections and national referenda.
- 7.4 For all such national elections, the RO will be expected to adhere to the range proposed for each role by the MHCLG. To pay outside of this range will require special agreement from the ECU or risk the ECU refusing to reimburse the difference where roles exceed their expected amounts.
- 7.5 Although local elections are not formally subject to the same fees as national elections, in practice the scale of fees should be uniform across all election types as having separate fees for local and national elections would cause confusion and major issues with staffing elections which pay different amounts to those held either at the same time or in other years.

- 7.6 The cost of scheduled elections will also include the costs of running the counts and these will include count staffing and premises. The amounts charged to Town and Parishes will depend on the number of electors in their area, numbers of postal votes, turnout, time taken to count and whether there are combined polls. As a guide, advice is usually given to allow £2.30 per elector overall for an average size ward taking account of the fact it may be more for smaller areas.
- 7.6 The proposed scales of fees in respect of Unitary elections are detailed at Appendix A and for Town and Parish elections at Appendix B. These rates would be applicable at the 1 May 2025 local elections.
- 7.7 Additionally, elections staff are entitled to statutory holiday pay, at 12.07%, and this should be reflected separately on a payslip.

8. Conclusions

8.1 The rates set out reflect the pay bands issued by MHCLG and therefore are an appropriate basis to set the fees for forthcoming scheduled polls and unscheduled by-elections, and to recover them from town and parish councils.
