THE PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

Nothing has changed since the previous representations made by local residents last year. I can only repeat what was said then about how inappropriate this natural 'amphitheatre' is for anything that generates noise as it amplifies everything. The properties of water, the river in this case, in magnifying sounds are well documented. The hundreds of residents love the tranquility of this place and are horrified by the prospect of relaxing the current restrictions - which are tolerable if not ideal - in any way. Common sense and experience tell you that giving customers longer to consume alcohol only adds to their potential to create disturbances later at night.
