## UPDATE - FUTURE COMMISSIONING AND PROVISION OF YOUTH ACTIVITIES IN MUCH WENLOCK AND SHIPTON LJC AREA

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### 1. Summary

This report summarises progress and next steps on changes to youth services and activity within the Much Wenlock and Shipton LJC Area.

Following a period of public and stakeholder consultation, the commissioning model for youth activities was developed.

Local Joint Committees (**LJCs**), together with young people and supported by the Community Enablement Team (**CET**), are responsible for **commissioning** youth activities in their area. A county-wide **infrastructure support partner** will provide commissioning practice support to LJCs and capacity building support to existing and new activity providers.

LJCs will locally commission youth activity in their areas and will receive SC funding for this. This reflects the council's ambition for LJCs to become local governance structures that enable local councillors, town and parish councils, communities and partners to shape and influence how public money is spent locally and to work with officers in their role as local commissioners.

The provision of youth activities will contribute to the following outcome areas in the Shropshire's Children, Young People and Families Plan 2014:

1. Ensuring all Children & Young People are safe and well looked after in a supportive environment
2. Narrowing the achievement gap in education & work
3. Ensuring emotional wellbeing of Children & Young People by focusing on prevention and early intervention
4. Keeping more Children & Young People healthy and reducing health inequalities

Local outcomes will be developed that reflect the above and the needs and circumstances of the particular area. Outcomes should also be linked to the long term sustainability of provision.

A funding mechanism for future youth activities to respond to specific areas of unmet need in LJC areas has been developed and Much Wenlock and Shipton LJC area has been allocated £3,000 linked to its rural make-up.

Broseley LJC has not received any funding for youth locality commissioning and recognising the opportunities that exist through working together and that different partners can bring different

resources to the locality commissioning table, it is proposed that Much Wenlock LJC shares its funding allocation with Broseley LJC to achieve shared outcomes that will benefit all of the appropriate young people living within the LJC areas.

## **2. Recommendations**

That members provide feedback and comment in respect of progress to date and the next stages of the youth commissioning process.

That members agree to set up a working group which will include members of Broseley Youth Partnership.

That Much Wenlock LJC shares its funding allocation with Broseley LJC to achieve shared outcomes that will benefit all of the appropriate young people living within the LJC areas.

## **3. Risk Assessment and Opportunities Appraisal**

- 3.1 In determining these recommendations the LJC has considered reputational risk and the course of action minimises this risk.
- 3.2 The recommendations contained in this report are compatible with the provisions of the Human Rights Act 1998.
- 3.3 The proposals under consideration will improve the levels of community based and community driven activity in the LJC area.

## **4. Financial Implications**

- 4.1 The funding devolved to the LJC is to be used for youth activities over the year to address local priorities. Funding by the LJC must comply with the general Financial Rules for LJC's.
