We'd like to thank Lucy Yorke, a parent of a child supported by SIS, who kindly donated a sum of money to the Little Stars pre-school group, which is attended by children with visual impairments and their siblings.

Some of this money was used to fund a fun story-telling music session led by Sally Tonge on 5th February 2019, which was enjoyed by all.

Sally adapted her session to suit the children who attended the group on that day. It was a relaxed and informal interactive session. The children were encouraged to use props and percussion instruments to join in with popular songs e.g. 'Heads, shoulders, knees and toes', whilst Sally strummed on her guitar.

One activity the children particularly enjoyed was pretending to be pirates.

Little Stars runs on Tuesday mornings term time 9:30 am – 11:30 am.

SIS Habilitation Work

- You shape the activities you do, which may include conservation activities like coppicing and tree planting, and other activities like wildlife walks, bush craft, hiking and camping.

Who can apply?

You must be:

- . Able to attend both residential dates for your chosen venue.
- Blind or partially sighted.
- At least 12 years old on 31 July 2019.
- Aged 17 or under on 1 November 2019.

Unfortunately you can only attend the Vision England programme once, to allow more young people to benefit from the programme.

What does it cost?

£25 for an Engagement day, Introduction day and two 3 night residentials.

Sight Loss Shropshire

Your Chairman and I went to Princess Royal Hospital last Friday, 14th December, to present a cheque to Shrewsbury and Telford Hospital Trust (SaTH) for £1,226.39. This money will enable the Hospital's Paediatric Ophthalmology Department to replace 2 ageing retinoscopes. These instruments are needed to test and diagnose children's sight loss problems on referral to the Paediatric Ophthalmology Clinic.

Currently SaTH has 4 retinoscopes, but 2 require replacement as they are worn out. The 2 new instruments are expected to have a working life of around 10 years. Over the anticipated life-expectancy of the new instruments thousands of Shropshire children will benefit from the new retinoscopes the SLS money has enabled SaTH to buy.
