The above named order made on 16th January 2020 by the Shropshire Council ("the Council") under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980, will **divert**

the full width of that part of Bridleway 48A Culmington, from point A on the order map (SO 4757 8453), running in a general north westerly direction between hedges and then continues in the same direction across the garden associated with 15 The Knotches to point B on the order map (SO 4743 8467); a total distance of approximately 202 metres; **onto a line** to be created from point A on the order map (SO 4757 8453), running in a general north westerly direction along a stone surfaced track for approximately 168 metres to point C on the order map (SO 4745 8464) where the route leaves the track via a bridleway gate and turns to follow a general northerly direction between a fence and hedge for approximately 40 metres to point B on the order map (SO 4743 8467) where it rejoins the remainder of Bridleway 48A; a total distance of approximately 208 metres with a width of 3 metres throughout.
