

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1. Summary of Findings

Case file SH/172/008 was included in the research scope by the ARU during the course of research due to the discovery of evidence suggesting the existence of a public right of way.

From the documents examined it is possible to establish that the case file route is shown on the Finance Act Survey map uncoloured and excluded from hereditaments. This suggests that the route was considered to be a public highway at the time of the Finance Act Survey, but does not in itself provide evidence about the class of rights that existed over it. Two Non-Ordnance Survey Commercial maps demonstrate evidence for the route. The route is described under the heading "By-roads" in the key on Baugh's map. On Greenwood's map the route is described under the heading "Turnpike Roads" in the map key. Length B - C of the case file route is also shown as a through-route on the Tithe Survey map.

The Ordnance Survey 1" Revised New Series map demonstrates evidence for the route. The route is shown on the map and is described in the key under the heading "2nd class metalled roads" in the map key. For the purpose of the Discovering Lost Ways Project research it has been agreed that the showing of routes as 1st, 2nd or 3rd class metalled roads on OS 1" New Series maps will be taken as evidence of the existence of public vehicular rights. It is considered therefore that a public vehicular right of way existed over the route at the time of the survey. The class of public carriageway is therefore considered to be appropriate.

The evidence found meets the standards set out in Section 53 of the Wildlife & Countryside Act, 1981 that a public right of way subsists or is reasonably alleged to subsist and therefore been categorised as "Strong", supporting the making of a definitive map modification order application to add the route to the definitive map. However, as a consequence of the construction of the wartime airfield the case file route may have been stopped up. It is recommended that further research is conducted to determine whether the case file route has been stopped up and replaced by the through-route that now runs north of length A – B of the case file route.


2. Description of Route

The route begins at a junction with C2085/50 (the reference given on Shropshire County Council's List of Streets) at coordinate SJ6539 2331 (point A on the Case File Route Map). The route then heads in a north easterly direction to coordinate SJ6601 2365 (point B on the Case File Route Map). From here the route continues in a north easterly direction to where it terminates at a junction with U3243/10 (the reference given on Shropshire County Council's List of Streets) at coordinate SJ6615 2386 (point C on the Case File Route Map).


The route has a length of 971 metres.







The route is shown as a through route and is labelled on the map as "FROM WELLINGTON". The route is observed to terminate at the south east corner of parcel "J313" on the map.



The route is observed to commence at a junction with another route to the north west of the Letter "E" of the label "Eaton Upon Tern" on the map. The route is shown on the map and is depicted as consisting of one bold and one fine parallel solid black lines. The route is observed to terminate north of the first letter "s" of "Crows Nest" on the map.

Tithe Map, TNA IR 30/29/305, entitled "Rough drafts of the Parish of Stoke upon Tern in two parts Salop", dated 1838, demonstrates evidence part of route STK7 (A – B). The route is observed to commence at the south west corner of parcel "1180" on the map. The route is shown on the map unnumbered and not within a numbered parcel and is depicted as consisting of two parallel solid black lines (in-filled). The route is observed to terminate at the north east corner of parcel "1203" on the map.

Evidence of class:

Evidence of width:

This evidence relates to the legal width of the case file route – for example, legally defined widths (e.g. in Inclosure Awards).

There is no evidence to support a legal width for the route.

8. Overall Evaluation of Evidence

The evaluation of the evidence has been carried out in accordance with the Discovering Lost Ways Project's series of Research Standards (for specific references see Appendix A below).

Findings from the main documentary sources:

1. Tithe Survey Records

The Tithe Survey map demonstrates evidence for the route on two maps. Length A – B is shown on XX un-numbered and not within a numbered parcel therefore there is no evidence for the route in the associated apportionment. Length B – C is shown as a through-route on XX and is un-numbered and not within a numbered parcel. There is therefore no evidence for the route in the associated apportionment.

2. Finance Act Survey Records

The Finance Act Survey map demonstrates evidence for the route. The route is shown uncoloured and excluded from hereditaments. This suggests that the route was considered to be a public highway at the time of the Finance Act Survey, but does not in itself provide evidence about the class of rights that existed over it.

3. Estate Records

The Estate map demonstrates evidence for part of the route. The route is shown but is un-numbered and not within a numbered parcel and is depicted as consisting of two parallel solid black lines. The route is also shown as a through route.

4. Non-Ordnance Survey Commercial Mapping

Two Non-Ordnance Survey Commercial maps demonstrate evidence for the route. The route is described under the heading "By-roads" in the key on Baugh's map. On Greenwood's map the route is described under the heading "Turnpike Roads" in the map key.

5. Ordnance Survey Records

a. Ordnance Survey Surveyor's Drawings

The route is shown on the Ordnance Survey Surveyor's Drawing as a physical feature only.

b. Ordnance Survey 1" Old Series

The Ordnance Survey 1" Old Series map demonstrates evidence for the route as a physical feature only.

c. Ordnance Survey 25" 1st Edition

The Ordnance Survey 25" 1st Edition demonstrates evidence for the route. The route is shown on the map is described under the heading "Main Roads" in the 6" and 25" Ordnance Survey Characteristics Sheet.

d. Ordnance Survey 25" 2nd Edition

The Ordnance Survey 25" 2nd Edition demonstrates evidence for the route. The route is shown on the map is described under the heading "Main Roads" in the 6" and 25" Ordnance Survey Characteristics Sheet. The route is shown on the map un-named therefore the object name book has not been examined.

e. Ordnance Survey 1" Revised New Series

The Ordnance Survey 1" Revised New Series map demonstrates evidence for the route. The route is shown on the map and is described in the key under the heading "2nd class metalled roads" in the map key. For the purpose of the Discovering Lost Ways Project research it has been agreed that the showing of routes as 1st, 2nd or 3rd class metalled roads on OS 1" New Series maps will be taken as evidence of the existence of public vehicular rights. It is considered therefore that a public vehicular right of way existed over the route at the time of the survey.

Alignment of the case file route:

From the analysis of the Tithe Survey map and modern Ordnance Survey maps the route does not appear to have changed alignment.

Evidence of Width:

There is no evidence to support a legal width for the route.

Contradictory evidence:

No contradictory evidence was found for the route.

Outcome of the evaluation:

Case file SH/172/008 was included in the research scope by the ARU during the course of research due to the discovery of evidence suggesting the existence of a public right of way.

From the documents examined it is possible to establish that the case file route is shown on the Finance Act Survey map uncoloured and excluded from hereditaments. This suggests that the route was considered to be a public highway at the time of the Finance Act Survey, but does not in itself provide evidence about the class of rights that existed over it. Two Non-Ordnance Survey Commercial maps demonstrate evidence for the route. The route is described under the heading "By-roads" in the key on Baugh's map. On Greenwood's map the route is described under the heading "Turnpike Roads" in the map key. Length B - C of the acse file route is also shown as a through-route on the Tithe Survey map.

The Ordnance Survey 1" Revised New Series map demonstrates evidence for the route. The route is shown on the map and is described in the key under the heading "2nd class metalled roads" in the map key. For the purpose of the Discovering Lost Ways Project research it has been agreed that the showing of routes as 1st, 2nd or 3rd class metalled roads on OS 1" New Series maps will be taken as evidence of the existence of public vehicular rights. It is considered therefore that a public vehicular right of way existed over the route at the time of the survey. The class of public carriageway is therefore considered to be appropriate.

The evidence found meets the standards set out in Section 53 of the Wildlife & Countryside Act, 1981 that a public right of way subsists or is reasonably alleged to subsist and therefore been categorised as "Strong", supporting the making of a definitive map modification order application to add the route to the definitive map. However, as a consequence of the construction of the wartime airfield the case file route may have been stopped up. It is recommended that further research is conducted before an application is made to determine whether the case file route has been stopped up and replaced by the through-route that now runs north of length A – B of the case file route.
