Glad you enjoyed the show Archie!



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What is Little Stars?

Little Stars is a family group for preschool children with visual impairments where preschool siblings are also welcome to attend. Parents can chat with other parents and seek advice from qualified staff.



A qualified teacher of children with visual impairments (QTVI) is available to support the children achieve developmental targets around social and emotional development, communication and language, play and learning, movement and mobility, independence and self-care.

A sensory/light room is available for the children to work with a qualified teacher on visual targets.

Activities including craft, cookery/sensory activities, music/singing and the session always ends with a calm parachute session.

Parents who have attended Little Stars sessions with their chidren, have made the following comments;

"Little Stars have been there to support us through times of worry and the unknown."

"The people who run Little Stars have given advice and an ear to bend and a shoulder to cry on."

"The families I have met have become friends outside of the group and I think they will be friends for life."

"Luke and myself spent a couple of happy years going to Little Stars. We found the staff very friendly and welcoming. The environment was very safe and clean. Luke enjoyed mixing with his peers and the staff worked hard to set stimulating exercises to engage the children. Although as a dad carer I was outnumbered by ladies, this shouldn't put men off attending, everyone is welcome!"

"Finley enjoys going to Little Stars; he plays with all the toys, he paints and is involved in craft activities, he plays instruments, he sings, reads books, does jigsaws and when he was younger he enjoyed the light room (now all he wants to do is jump off the ledge and play swing with the light curtain!). He is so confident around all the people there and has told staff he loves them. We will truly miss going to group and we'd like to thank them from the bottom of our hearts for all their love and support...so thank you xx"

Little Stars is based at The Stepping Stones Centre, Brunel Road, Malinslee, Telford, TF3 2BF on Tuesdays in term-time from 9.30 to 11.30am

Sessions will be starting again from Tuesday 7th June.
