- Understanding the individual pupil and how to profile their strengths and their developmental needs.
- Understand the importance of building positive relationships with and around the pupil.
- Understand how to adapt the curriculum to meet the needs of the individual pupil.
- Understanding how to make the environment more accessible to autistic pupils.
- Developing practical strategies and techniques in promoting effective teaching and learning.

The AET is a programme led by two national autism charities – The National Autism Society and Ambitious about Autism. Established and supported by the Department for Education, the AET promotes and supports partnerships throughout the education system to improve educational access, experience and outcomes for children and young people with autism.
