

Description of Path:

Path starts at Near Wallop Cottages SJ32810764 and ends at Bridleway on Parish Boundary south of the Hazels. SJ31660655

Way is a cleared wide track sometimes hedged on either side. It passes through woodland where the whole width has been fenced across in two places to form stiles. Evidence of hinged posts remain at one of these stiles. The final stile on footpath 0438/38A/1 has a hinged post lying beside it on the ground. At the parish boundary a bridleway gate marks the junction of this footpath with two bridleways. (BW 0566/38/1 and BW 0438/40/2.)

Current Recorded Status:

Only part of the path is recorded on the Definitive Map

Documentary Evidence

Path is shown as an inferior road not suitable for cyclists.

Primary Evidence:

Inland Revenue Valuation Records - Finance (1908-10) Act 1910

Shows claimed route below the Tiled House as white between hereditaments. Public vehicular highways were usually excluded from adjoining land parcels (hereditaments) and so appear as white roads.

Tithe Records

Shows the way in Westbury Parish leading from near Wallop Cottages passing Tiled House and through the first area of woodland in the same manner as the road it leaves near Wallop Smithy which is a road today. At the second area of woodland numbered 250 it is shown as a double hatched way indicating an unenclosed way. It proceeds in this manner to the parish boundary with Worthen where a destination to Brockton is shown.

Other Evidence:

Definitive Map Records

Claimed route is recorded as number 38 in Worthen parish and 38a in Westbury. In 1952 stiles were replacing gates. Such a case is recorded in the written survey. A stile had replaced a gate on bridleway number 40 at Hampton Hayes Cottage.

Parish Boundary Records

The Ordnance Survey was given the duty of ascertaining and recording all public boundaries by the Ordnance Survey Act 1841. The Act allowed the Ordnance Survey to summon the Clerk of the Peace and any books, maps, papers or other documents he held. It was an offence to obstruct or hinder the Ordnance Survey surveyor. The production of the Boundary Sketch Map was advertised and the map was open to public inspection.

The Boundary Remark Books were prepared by mermen, a representative from each of the parishes, who walked and agreed the boundary and noted the landmarks on the boundary.

The claimed route is shown with the destination "To Brockton." This was confirmed on the 7th to 8th September 1880 by the local meresman. This confirmation was made 40 years after the Tithe Map declared the same destination. A cart track to fields would not be given a destination.

Further Evidence

Complaints concerning obstructions to the bridle road and footpath between Wallop and Brockton near the Hazels were reported by the Condover Highway Board and Worthen Civil Parish. These complaints were made between 1885 and 1957.

Summary and Statement of Reasons:

Map evidence supports a physical existence of the claimed way from the early 1800's. A walk along the route is open and clear and presents an enjoyable experience. Three stiles cross the route two of which have the remains of oak posts with hinges present. Notes from the Condover Highway Board and Worthen Parish Council give recognition to this route as a Public Bridleway and Footpath. Public money was spent on providing a footway bridge at the Hazels Farm and obstructions were recorded near Tiled House and on the Westbury and Worthen Parish boundary. Complaints were regularly directed to the Westbury Parish Council where most of these offences occurred. The Tithe Map gives a destination to Brockton on the parish boundary showing that the way continued. Working farm horses in the past were regularly walked to the nearest local blacksmith to be re-shod. Wallop Smithy lies very close to the end of the claimed route providing a raison d'etre for public bridleway use. Many definitive map anomalies can be found on parish boundaries where two parish councils record different path status's on either side. The evidence provided for this claim indicates that this took place during the creation of the Definitive Map. The Definitive Map is a minimum record of public rights of way and does not preclude the possibility that unrecorded rights may exist, nor that higher rights may exist than those shown.

Shown as a 3rd class fenced road from Wallop Smithy, later becoming unfenced passing the Hazels as an unfenced 3rd class road.





Key to Map.






Ordnance Survey 25 inch, Shropshire XXX1X.8, 1882 Shows Tiled House Lane with parcel number 1972.








FP on way from Hazels.








Route shown double hatched to Hazels and parish boundary.



Paths at parish boundary are all shown in the same manner. Today's bridle way to the south and east was then show as a FP.




Close up of Tiled House showing gates across route.




Bartholomew Half Inch, Sheet 17 Shropshire, 1903

Shows uncoloured road (unsuitable for cyclists) passing by Hazels Farm to road.























Lost Ways CD Tithe Wesbury, 1840




Lost Ways CD Tithe Wesbury, IR 30 29 68, 1840




Bridleway Hazels


Bridleway Obstructions


The clerk was instructed to give notice to the occupiers of land where obstruction to bridleways exist at Rowley, and on the Bridleway leading between Hampton and Wallop.

Considering matters arising out of minutes, the clerk reported that he had inspected the obstruction on the bridlepath between Hampton and Wallop, and found that only one obstruction was situate in Worthen Parish, the others referred to being in Westbury Parish. He had interviewed the occupier concerned & had obtained his assurance that the wire fence would be removed. It was resolved to erect a wicket gate on the footpath between Hampton & Wallop at a point near Hazels, and to repair the footpath between Lanes' end & Tantree road. It was resolved to ask Mr R Pritchard Rowley to give a tender for carrying out this work.
