**UK Armed Forces Veterans Census 2021**

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Shropshire has proportionately more veterans than England

**14,847** people in Shropshire had previously served in the UK armed forces **5.5%** of the population aged 16 and over (England 3.8%)



Larger clusters of Veterans typically living around current or previous military bases



**12,605** (85%) were Male **2,241** (15%) female



**13,800** (9.4%) households with one or more people who had served in the UK Armed Forces. (England 6.7%)



**6,588** (44%) are aged 60 to 84 years (England 43%).

82% are over the age of 50 (England 79%) and **53%** are over 65 (England 53%)



**98.9%** of Veterans were White (England 96.2%)



67.3% described themselves as Christian (England 64.6%). 27% described themselves as having no religion. Veterans more likely to describe themselves as Christian than non-veteran population (67.3% compared with 57.4%)

It is worth noting any male over the age of 80 years would have been required to complete National Service which ended in 1963

4,581 (31%) of Veterans Disabled (England 32%) general population aged 16 plus (21%) (not age standardized)



Veteran health was not as good as people who had not served in the UK armed forces where 21.8% of people reported not good health (32.7% Veteran)




14% thought that their activities were limited a lot (England 15%). compared to 9% for the general population aged over 16.



**67.3%** of Veterans in Shropshire said that their health was good (64.5% England) **32.7%** said their health was not good (35.2% England)

#### Percentage of total Veterans in Good or Not Good Health



Health of veterans can be influenced by the older demographic of the veteran population which is also majority male.





41.6% of Shropshire veterans were Economically Active and in Employment (England 40.6%) (Shropshire non-veterans 57.2%)




Fewer Veterans were Economically Active Unemployed (1.2%) compared to (2.5%) for non-veterans



Veterans more likely to be Economically Inactive (57.2%) compared to non-veterans (40.7%). Mainly due to Retirement (51% retired compared to 27.2% for non-veterans)

The veteran population is older and more likely to be retired or not working, which is reflected in these figures





Veterans more likely to be employed as managers, directors and senior officials, associate professional and technical roles, plant and machine operatives than non-veterans



Veterans are less likely to be employed caring, leisure and service occupations and administrative and technical roles than non-veterans





Veterans in Shropshire more likely to own their own home (74.4% compared to 62.8% non-veterans) 50.5% will own outright compared to 33.3% non-veterans.



Fewer Veterans rented homes (25.6% compared to 37.2% non-veterans)

The veteran population is an older population more likely to own their own home or no longer have a mortgage, the age structure needs to be considered when comparing the veteran population and non-veteran population.

Separated, but still legally married or still legally in a civil partnership	2.5%	2.5%	2.0%
Widowed or surviving civil partnership partner	12.5%	13.4%	7.0%



A greater number of Veterans are married (61.3% compared with 48.8% for Shropshire non-veterans). Fewer veterans had never been married (11.8%) compared to 32.4 non-veterans

Greater number of Veterans **divorced (12%)** compared to 9.8% for non-veterans and **12.5% widowed** (7% non-veterans)

These figures were similar for England. These proportions are influenced by the older age profile of veterans as older people are more likely to be married or widowed than the general population.

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- I. Middle Layer Output Areas (MLSOA) 2021 boundaries. MLSOA are a statistical geography created by the Office for National Statistics for the Census. They are areas consisting of a minimum of 5,000 residents and 2,000 households with an average population size of 7,800.
- II. The **household reference person** is the member of the household in whose name the accommodation is owned or rented, or is otherwise responsible for the accommodation
- III. The veteran population is older in age compared to the non-veteran population. This is likely to influence some of the comparisons. ONS have included some estimates to show if any, difference would exist between veterans and non-veterans if the two populations had the same age, sex and regional distribution by making adjustments to account for this. More on this is included in the Characteristics of UK armed forces listed above.
