It aims to protect Greenbelt around Albrighton which is extremely important to me and my family and many residents in the village. Protecting Greenbelt is essential for farming areas, the character of the village, natural surrounding landscapes and the environment and protection against climate change.

I am supportive of the Local Plan because it clearly defines the allocated areas for current and future housing development in Albrighton. This will ensure housing needs are met in Shropshire until 2038 and beyond while maintaining control of the locations and densities. I believe that the Local Plan is consistent with National Policy and has considered my needs as a resident of Albrighton now and into the future. It is also encouraging to see joint engagement across nearby counties to ensure its success within the wider West Midlands community. Shropshire Local Plan - Additional Sustainability Appraisal Report 12.1 - 12.3

Shropshire Council have conducted a housing review which has concluded that there are better sites in Shropshire to utilise for housing needs in this area. By consulting with the public they have also taken into consideration local residents views.

There are already plans in place for housing needs in the Abrighton area, and we see no reason why other sites should be made available, especially Green Belt sites.

Additional Sustainability Appraisal Report Appendix 3; Updated Stage 3 Site Assessment:

It is really important that the draft Local Plan has already assessed the Albrighton South sites P36A and P36B (which Boningale Homes want to build on) and decided that they should **not** be built on. These sites are not suitable for housing:

- 1: they should stay as green fields + Green Belt for future generations
- 2: why build on greenbelt for housing when there are other suitable sites available?
- 3: they are near listed buildings and the Boningale Conservation area
- 4: there is not sufficient infrastructure for a site of that size







5: totally unsuitable for housing; especially for people for 'Black Country need'

6: they will create loads of traffic problems, increasing flow of traffic through and around the village, particularly the hight street, compromising safety for pedestrians and other road user.

Please do not let any developers build on this important Green Belt land (P36A and P36B)

Shropshire Local Plan - Housing and Employment Topic Paper 7.63 and 7.64

The current plan to build 500 homes by 2038 will cover the housing needs for this area without impacting the character and environment of the village providing careful consideration and planning are adhered to.

Large scale building on Green which has not been include in the plan should be rejected and thrown out.

Albrighton currently has over 500 new houses planned, being built or recently built - including at Millfields, Wain Estates (ALB017) and east of Wain Estates (ALB021)

Table 8.3 ● The houses in ALB017 & ALB021 (Wain Estates and next to it) should be built steadily over a 10 year period ● Following this burst of house building at Millfields and next to it at Wain Estates etc, there should be less development in the village at the end of the period up to 2038

8.7 - 8.8 • Albrighton is surrounded by Green belt which should not be built on, we need to protect and sustain our green belt land for environmental and biodiversity reasons.

16.64 ● Albrighton should not have large new employment buildings built on its Green Belt land; even if they provided jobs. If large scale building is allowed, including supermarkets, drive throughs, secondary schools, healthcare centres etc, this will change Alrbighton from a rural village and turn it into a town like Wolverhampton.

Shropshire Local Plan - Updated Green Belt Topic Paper 4.14 - 4.21

I believe that Shropshire's current housing plan has been considered carefully and therefore should be adhered to. Do not allow builders who are only interested in making huge profits to destroy our beautiful village by ignoring local needs and diverting from the agreed plan. I agree the Black Country need housing and it should be in Tasley, Shrewsbury and the former Ironbridge Power Station.

5.24 - 5.27

I agree that there should be land safeguarded from development so that it is kept clear for houses to be built after 2038 and Developers not be given permission to build on that land before 2038.

6.4 - 6.8

It's really important that Greenbelt around Albrighton is kept clear of houses

Any developers that try and build on Green Belt should be thrown out

New housing in Albrighton should be built on Millfields, ALB017 & ALB021 (Wain Estates and next to it)

Any new large buildings for employment / jobs should be at RAF Cosford and in smaller ad-hoc buildings

We agree that there should be 3 sites safeguarded from development in Albrighton so they are kept clear to be built on after 2038: ALB014 (Cross Road), P32a (By-Pass) and part of P35 (Kingswood Rd)

Developments in Albrighton must be phased so that the village does not become overwhelmed, lose its character and community feel
