We have everything here, the traffic isn't too bad in the village and by where I we have a great mix of rural country side with normal flow of traffic, however with the new by proposition country lanes that you could once walk down won't be possible and certain areas in Albrig will be built up with traffic that was once no problem. The worrying point for me is people still wanting down country lanes e.g. Green lane or Patshull road with an extra 800 homes so roughly on average extra 1000-1200 cars going through Albrighton, I think is a potential for a disaster to happen. - Shropshire Council have done a thorough job of consulting with the public, assessing and reviewing housing sites in Shropshire.
- They've looked at all the sites and it is right that they've decided that the best place for the 'Black Country need' houses are in Tasley, Shrewsbury and Ironbridge power station.

- It's good that Albrighton has two sites planned for future housing after Millfield; ALB017 (Wain Estates site) & ALB021 (East of Wain Estates).
- No other sites should be made available in the Local Plan for housing in Albrighton; especially not any Green Belt sites; or for sites for any future 'Black Country need'.
- After these, we should have sites safeguarded for housing after 2038 as this gives us a good plan for long term housing

Additional Sustainability Appraisal Report Appendix 3; Updated Stage 3 Site Assessment

- It is really important that the draft Local Plan has already assessed the Albrighton South sites P36A and P36B (which Boningale Homes want to build on) and decided that they should not be built on. These sites are:
- not suitable for housing
- o should stay as green fields + Green Belt not destroy farming fields
- o they are really important fields for Albrighton
- o we don't need houses there are adequate other sites planned for housing
- o they are near listed buildings and the Boningale Conservation area
- o they are a long way from Albrighton centre so will split the village
- o totally unsuitable for housing; especially for people for 'Black Country need'
- o they will create loads of traffic problems, road traffic accidents in the village being probable, country lanes for walking being unaccesible and outright dangerous, the infrastructure of roads not being able to handle another 1000+ cars
- Please do not let any developers build on this important Green Belt land (P36A and P36B)

Shropshire Local Plan - Housing and Employment Topic Paper 7.63 and 7.64

- It's good that Shropshire Council has decided to increase the number of houses that it wants to build up to 2038 by 500 houses but I geniunely think that's sufficient.
- This isn't a massive amount of additional houses but it shows that we aren't against housing development it just needs to be planned out well and the thought of the impact this will have on residents.
- Any builders that try to develop on green fields or get Greenbelt released that aren't in the plan should be rejected and thrown out.
