Notes:

The legislative requirements regarding the designation of a polling place:

- Each parish in England and community in Wales is to be a separate polling district, unless special circumstances apply
- The council must designate a polling place for each polling district, unless the size or other circumstances of a polling district are such that the situation of the polling station does not materially affect the convenience of the electors
- The polling place must be in an area in the district, unless special circumstances make it
 desirable to designate an area wholly or partly outside the district (for example, if no
 accessible polling place can be identified in the district
- The polling place must be small enough to indicate to electors in different parts of the district how they will be able to reach the polling station.

Accessibility requirements of a polling place:

Shrewsbury, Shropshire, SY2 6ND.

- Seek to ensure that all electors in a constituency in the local authority area have such reasonable facilities for voting as are practicable in the circumstances
- Seek to ensure that so far as is reasonable and practicable every polling place for which it is responsible is accessible to electors who are disabled.

Use of schools:

• It should be noted that for the purpose of taking the poll in England and Wales, the Returning office is entitled to use, free of change, schools maintained or assisted by a local authority as well as those schools that receive grants made out of moneys provided by Parliament. This includes academies and free schools.

When considering alternative venues:

- Location: is it reasonably accessible within the polling district.
- Size: can it accommodate more than one polling station if required.
- Availability: Is the building readily available in the event of an unscheduled election.
- Accessibility: Is the building accessible to all electors entitled to attend a polling place.
