

Dear Madam,

Thank you for your letter received 1-6-22 informing my wife and myself of your appointment as Programme Officer for this area.

We are, by choice, computer illiterate so I'm afraid any correspondence with ourselves must be conducted by Royal Mail. I gather from the content of your letter that you wish to address any queries/concerns we have regarding Salop County Council's plans for Longden village.

I'm sure that you have been made aware that since Salop County

Councils decision to make hongden
village into a hub as opposed to a
cluster the village has lost its Post
Office. We also feel that the visit
of a mobile library once a fortnight
for the benefit of one resident hardly
constitutes sufficient evidence to
conclude that the village has a library.

A further "hot chestnut" for
ourselves would be the current
situation at the primary and preschool
areas which have been previously
reported to Salop County Council so far
without the benefit of a reply. The
parking and discharge areas for the
school and preschool are non-existent
resulting in one half of the road
being "blocked" around 8.45am and
2.45pm each school day. The
inconvenience this causes myself and
my wife by people choosing to turn

a round in our drive is nothing compared to the dangers posed to the children by the frequency of heavy agricultural vehicles speeding through the restricted roadway especially at harvest times.

Both these issues have been previously raised with Salop County Council as being "an accident waiting to happen" again without benefit of a reply.

Any increase in the number of children attending these facilities, which are over subscribed at present, can only exacerbate the dangers already outlined.
