NOTES

The permission of the landowner(s) must be obtained for all works carried out in respect of trees. This notice does not in any way imply that this Council has sought such permission or will condone the use of this notice to force any landowner to grant such permission.

Anyone responsible for work to trees must comply with relevant laws and regulations relating to the protection of wildlife; for example birds and their nests, bats and their roosts or other protected species that may use the tree(s) or site in question.

In making this decision the Council would draw your attention to the case officers report, which forms the basis for the decision notice. The Officers report is not included with this notice, but it can be viewed via the Councils online planning register 'Public Access' <https://pa.shropshire.gov.uk/online-applications/>

Disposal of Arisings from Work to Trees

Following the pruning or felling of trees the arisings should not be burnt on site where there is a potential to cause nuisance to neighbours. Prunings can be disposed of by chipping/shredding on-site or by disposal to a green waste site.

Where arisings are shred on site the work should be carried out at reasonable times so as not to cause undue noise disturbance to neighbours. It is suggested any neighbours should be advised of what you are doing so they are aware that any disturbance may only be temporary. Chipping/shredding of tree waste on site offers the opportunity for home mulching/composting and recycling nutrients to the soil. Suitable wood should be seasoned before using as a fuel.

Where householders engage a contractor to prune or fell trees the householder should enquire of contractors of where they intend to dispose of the waste if they do not intend to chip/shred on-site. This is to ensure the arisings are disposed of responsibly and not dumped illegally.
