About the survey

A random selection of service users were contacted who had received help or support from adult social care in the last 12 months

452
services users gave us their feedback
January to March 2017

Ages varied between

Average age was **72**

62% lived in the community, **26%** in residential homes, 12% in nursing homes

63% had physical support, 24% had learning disability support, the rest had mental health, sensory, memory or social support

Enhancing the quality of life for people with care and support needs



Service users scored their **quality of life**



19.6 out of 24

But only **49%** said they have as much social contact as they want with people they like

Ensuring that people have a positive experience of care services and support



7 out of 10 users

said they were satisfied with the social care and support they received

71% said it was very or fairly easy to find information and advice about support, services or benefits

But only **67%** said they have enough **choice** over care and support services

Ensuring that people who are vulnerable feel safe and protected from harm



74% said they **feel safe** (this includes feeling safe from fear of abuse, falling or other physical harm both inside and outside the home)



9 out of 10 said the services they receive help them to feel safe and secure
